Highlights included:

- Briefed on One Go, emphasizing immersion, mentorship, and ongoing support for transitioning students.

2. In-school Initiatives:

- Highlighted the In-school Reimagination Museum on the third floor.
- Discussed the In-house Barbershop and its apprentice program.

• Touched upon the 100 Black Man Leadership Exploration Initiative, involving annual conferences.

3. Mentorship and Partnerships:

- Discussed various mentorship programs, including with the Collegiate 100 and the Emerging 100 and Ron Blue.
- Mentioned the partnership with Lyons Gate Films, a new high school polo team, and an esports gaming collaboration with Morris Brown College.

4. Educational Programs:

• Shared information about the Georgia Tech Near Peer program and the Morehouse Upward Bound program's Summer Institute.

5. Future Initiatives:

- Announced upcoming partnerships with Lyons Gate Films, the initiation of a high school polo team, and collaboration with West Georgia University for film and podcasting.
- Shared plans for the Ronald Blue Investment Club despite initial setbacks.

Summary: During the meeting led by Timothy Jones, various topics were discussed, primarily focused on academic progress, attendance, and behavior at Best Academy. Dr. Jones provided updates on graduation rates, student interventions, and strategies for addressing academic challenges.
