We have kicked off our implementation for the 2016-17 school year. We are addressing challenges, as they arise to limit potential risks.

Initiative	Status	Update	
Vacation Academy		Planned for April 2017. School sites are being identified and a planning committee is being established.	
Assessment System		Benchmarks assessments have been vetted by the curriculum team and implemented.	
High Impact Tutoring		Tutors are supporting their caseload of students. School schedule changes and technical requirements initially caused an implementation delay; however, a plan of action was developed to quickly get back on track.	
Summer Leader Academy		A plan of support is being contemplated to provide ongoing support to selected principals who attended the Harvard School Turnaround Institute in Summer 2016.	
Leader Recruitment		A recruitment strategy for the 2017-18 school year has been developed. Fresh collateral and messaging will be created to support recruitment of strong talent.	
High Quality PLCs		Boyd Elementary School will begin implementation in November 2016 as a pilot school for job-embedded learning focused on Mathematics and PLCs.	
Instructional Coaches		Instructional Coach trainings have begun and will continue throughout the school year.	
Reading & Math Specialists		Trainings for Reading and Math Specialists have begun and will continue throughout the year.	
Summer Teacher Academy		Launch planned for Summer 2017.	
Targeted PD		Professional Learning focused on Mathematics has begun for $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ grade teachers at the targeted schools.	
Teacher Recruitment		Planning for 2017-18 school year is underway. A Teacher Interview Day is scheduled for March 2017.	
Non-Academic Support		Communities in Schools is providing services to over 400 student and has made 16 emergency referrals. Care Team meetings, designed to facilitate intervention supports for students, are taking place.	
Social-Emotional Learning		The SEL team continues to work with campus principals and associate superintendents on implementation specifics. Though there are some challenges to scheduling SEL time in classrooms and other basic programming details, we are working through those challenges with individual schools who need extra support as we build capacity around this initiative.	
Partnerships		Planning team meetings have begun to support the transition of Gideons ES, Slater ES, and Price MS. GO Team elections have ended.	
Family/Alumni Engagement		Over 2,600 stakeholders engaged to provide feedback on family and alumni engagement. Recommendations are being vetted with community; final strategy to be presented at December board meeting.	

Our Instructional Coaches, Specialists, and Teachers are receiving targeted professional development.

Purpose Built Schools

Thomasville Heights ES

- Serving 429 students, Pre-K 5th
- Added 32 additional full-time teachers, reducing student-teacher ratio to 6:1
- Increased weekly enrichment time from 90 minutes to 450 minutes
- Created 2 Literacy and 2 Math Centers to offer individualized instruction to 198 students in Literacy and 174 students in Math
- Created comprehensive
 Community Support plan by adding
 6 full-time wrap-around staff
 members and establishing several
 community agency partnerships

Slater ES & Price MS

 Principal positions for SY 17-18 posted for December hire

Rensselaerville Institute

- 1st phase of implementation completed increased amount/frequency of time principals spent in classrooms to improve learning & supported principals' use of assessment data; work in classrooms carried into teachers' PLCs teachers asked to look more at student evidence, identify challenges and consistently ask "How do we know students are learning?"
- Completed 2 walk-throughs with Assoc. Supts. to ensure alignment/coherence to district's instructional focus areas
- GO Team meetings at most schools will be completed by end of 1st semester
- Miles, Adamsville & Peyton Forest identified as likely sites for Community Sparkplugs

Kindezi

Gideons ES

- GO Team elections completed at Gideons ES
- Transition team is meeting regularly with Gideons' administration; conducting school visits/observations in coordination with the cluster's Associate Superintendent
- Teacher information sessions for current Gideons teachers are planned for November 2016 and January 2017
- Transition team is planning Meet and Greet sessions and tours for current Gideons teachers at both Kindezi campuses; timing to be determined.
- Kindezi plans to hire up to 60 teachers for Gideons; vacant positions will be posted prior to Winter Holidays.
