Greetings Parents and Community Members,

Our portables are gone and we have settled in for the new school year. We are excited about a new year of teaching and learning with your students. We have gotten off to a great start this year. However, morning arrival needs a few changes. All parents who are dropping students off before 7:45 AM should drop them off on School Drive, at the crossing guard. No cars should drop off in the bus loop before 7:45 AM. Also, when students are dropped in the front, they should be let out at the sidewalk. No student should be dropped off on the left side and have to walk in front of cars.

Communication with parents is important at our school. The newsletter will continue to be sent home at the beginning of each month. You should also look forward to receiving the blue communication folder every Thursday. Please check book bags every Thursday evening for important announcements. This week the Parent Compact letter will be sent home. Please sign and return the letter. During the school year, check our website frequently for updates. We want to stay connected to parents. We will also speak about Title I and our school's state status. This year, our status remains as a Focus school. In a few days, we will send home a Title I Designation Parent Notification letter very soon. We will also send the Title I required Parent Right to Know letter too. First Grade News

Welcome to First Grade! We are excited about the 2016 - 2017 school year. We have a lot of fun team building activities that will accompany our daily learning. We want to form strong relationships between our students, parents, and teachers. It is important for us to work together to grow our students. We would like to thank you for sending you child to school in their uniforms everyday (Monday through Friday). We have started working on Reading and Writing across the curriculum, focusing on sight word fluency and developing meaningful sentences. In mathematics, we are working on counting and writing numbers from 1 to 120. We are studying American folk heroes like John Henry, Johnny Appleseed, Annie Oakley and Paul Bunyan.

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Grade Two News

Welcome to the 2016-2017 school year. The year has started out wonderfully. The students and teachers are so excited about all the upcoming activities at the school this year. Second grade started immediately with instruction, assessing our children, and assigning homework. We are very busy in the classrooms. The students are studying place value in math. stars in science, the importance of rules in social studies and comprehension and fluency in reading. MOID K-2

My name is Mrs. Angela Andrews and I am the new MOID K-2 Teacher/Case Manager at Humphries Elementary School. I have the pleasure of working with Mrs. Phinazee and Mrs. Lindley and we make a great team.

Our students were Super Cool Kids while experimenting this month with Thermometers. In our experiment our Materials consisted of 5 thermometers for each student, 10 Styrofoam cups : 2 for each student (one filled with ice and the other with warm water), 5 pencils, 5 crayons, and 5 data recording sheets. The students understood that the thermometer was a delicate instrument that had to be handled carefully so that it wouldn't break. We conducted the experiment by placing thermometers in cold, ice water first. We then recorded the temperatures and drew pictures of the thermometer ratings. Then we placed the thermometers in warm water. We then recorded those temperatures on our data recording sheet. We also drew pictures of the thermometers to show those ratings. The students learned that the hotter the temperature: the higher the rating on the thermometer and the lower the temperature the lower the rating. This helped our students to better understand the standard on weather patterns and how those patterns change from one season to the next.



Grade Three News

Welcome Back!! We are off to a great start! It has taken some time to get use to changing classes this year, but now we are on a roll!

We are working on the following skills:

- Math: Rounding & Multiplication Facts (Continue to study facts 0-5 for mastery)
- Reading: Text dependent questions
- Science: Rocks, Minerals, & Soil
- Social Studies: Paul Revere

Our daily homework is used to reinforce skills we learn or will earn in class each day. It is very important to turn in homework DAILY! Our students should be reading daily. Please check with your child's teacher to get your students lexile level range, so that they are reading the appropriate level text.

We are in need of pencils and disinfectant wipes for our classes! Please let us know if you have any questions or concerns or if there is any way we can help assist your child!

Grade Five News

We are off and running. Our students are setting goals and tracking their progress in data notebooks. All 5th grade students are responsible for completing at least two Accelerated Reader books per week in order to meet a monthly goal of 100,000 words read with 80% accuracy on the comprehension test. Please keep in mind that students are graded based on MASTERY of state standards in all content areas and not merely on effort. To that end, much more studying is required. Also, students have completed the STAR Math and Reading screeners. Please schedule a conference with your child's teacher to discuss the results. By working together, we can help your child reach their full potential!



Humphries' Enrichment Team, which consists of Spanish, Art, Music, and Physical Education classes is off to a roaring start! Enrichment teachers meet with all grade levels, Pre-Kindergarten to 5th grade on a weekly basis. Our classes began with establishing classroom expectations, consequences, and rewards. During the month of September, classes are focusing on the following learning task : in Spanish, students are sequencing information such as the alphabets, numbers, etc. utilizing the target language; in Art, students are analyzing relationships between ideas and objects; in Physical Education classes, students are defining character traits; and in Music, students are singing accompanied and unaccompanied songs as they are experiencing speech patterns.
