

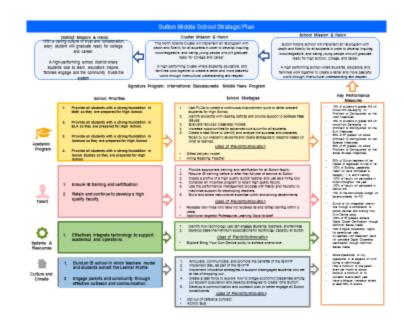

Parent and community engagement	By involving our parents and community our students will be further supported in the academic, social and emotion needs through the middle years.



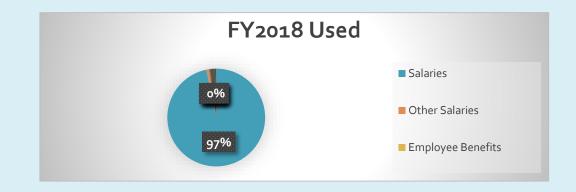
