Letter from the Principal

As the weather turns warm, the Grady calendar gets very busy. For students taking *Milestones* courses, there are approximately four weeks until the testing window. Please encourage your children to utilize test preparation tools daily so they will perform their best on test days. The *Milestones* exam score will count as 20 percent of the 2nd semester final grade in applicable courses. It is critical that students prepare for this assessment as this twenty percent weight is not negotiable. Please check the Grady website for important school updates, and subscribe to the *GradyGram* weekly electronic newsletter. The *GradyGram* includes weekly announcements on all aspects of the school. By now, you have received your child's score reports for any *Milestones* assessments that he or she took last year. Please be aware that scores for the new assessment system cannot be compared to the former End of Course Test (EOCT). The new assessment has four performance levels, which are aligned to college readiness standards versus the former minimum competency standards. Additionally, students are expected to write constructed responses and extended responses. As part of our instructional plan, students are required to write more frequently and complete rigorous performance tasks. Please encourage your child if he or she did not perform up to your expectations. The 2014-2015 scores are a foundation for continued improvement. We will work collectively as a school team to support all children in academic growth.

Atlanta Public Schools has been approved by the state as a Charter System. As part of this transition, every school will have a Local School Governance Team (LSGT) known as a Go Team. The LSGT is a way to get the community, parents and teachers involved in decision making to improve educational opportunities for students. Unlike a Local School Council (LSC) which is an advisory group, the Go Team has some governance responsibilities in the areas of curriculum, school operations, personnel, financial decisions and resource allocations. There will be three parent representatives, and Go Team elections will take place in March. You received voter information in February with student progress reports. If you did not, please contact Ms. Holland in Grady's Registrar's office to get your personalized voter information.

Finally, please note that graduation will take place on Thursday, May 26th. This is a change from the original projected date that was communicated to parents in January. If you have a concern or a suggestion for school improvement, please feel free to contact your child's grade level counselor or administrator.

Counselor's Corner

Grady's Counseling Department Earns Move on When Ready Transportation Grant

The school counseling department has earned a \$20,902 Move on When Ready (MOWR) Transportation Grant through Georgia Student Finance Authority to offset the cost of transporting MOWR students to and from post-secondary institutions. Grady High School's goals are to increase the number of high school graduates who are college and career ready, and increase the number of students enrolled in dual credit programs. MOWR transportation is an integral component of meeting these goals. The grant will assist in removing transportation barriers for students. The grant will cover the cost of round trip transportation via Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (MARTA) for fall 2016 and spring 2017. Priority will be granted to economically disadvantaged students for transportation cost. Students interested in MOWR for 2016-2017 school year should meet with their counselor.

Atlanta Virtual Academy

Are you looking for opportunities for advancement or to recover courses this summer? If so, Atlanta Virtual Academy (AVA) may be for you. AVA is a free district-sponsored online program serving students currently attending Atlanta Public Schools in grades 7th-12th. AVA offers online courses aligned to state standards and taught by highly qualified teachers. AVA provides a virtual classroom environment, and offers courses in core content, world languages, electives, SAT/ACT prep and advanced placement. Please read these important words from Ms. Matthews in Grady's attendance office: I would like all parents to sign up for Parent Portal to monitor morning tardies, especially in first period. Students are missing a lot of instructional time. Please check the portal daily before 11:00 a.m. to make sure your child arrived at class on time. You can sign up at the Atlanta Public School website, www.atlanta.k12.ga.us/Domain/ 7741. The activation application requires your child's Social Security number and student ID number, found on report cards and transcripts.

Students must be at school for at least three hours excluding lunch to be counted as present for the day. After an absence, within three days of returning to school the student must bring a note, signed by a parent or legal guardian, stating the reason for the absence. Please send the note on a full sheet of paper for filing purposes, and do not send emails. Allow the student to drop off the parent excuse note at the attendance office or main office.

Grady Swimmers Make a Splash!

The Grady swim team finished the swim season with a splash. Led by senior co-captains **Justin Cucchi** and **Sloan Hodges** and junior co-captains **Melissa Brown** and **Chase Kleber**, the team defended its City Championship title, beating rival North Atlanta to claim the trophy. The girls' team dominated the meet and placed first for a third year in a row, while the boys' team came in a close second to North Atlanta.

Grady also made an impact at the High School State Swim Championship in February. All six relay teams and four individual swimmers qualified for the meet, including Cucchi, junior **Max**

Nevins, Brown and Hodges. Both Brown and Cucchi qualified for the finals, with Brown claiming 3rd place in the 50 meter freestyle event and 16th in the 100 meter freestyle, and Cucchi placing 15th in the 200 meter individual medley and 12th in the 100 meter backstroke – both the highest placements in Grady's history.



Since its start in 2007, the team has grown under a solid coaching team and with strong parental support. Grady teacher John Rives took the helm in 2012 as head coach. He was joined two years ago by community coach Brad Hodges, a former collegiate swimmer at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Under their leadership, the team has



nearly tripled in size and now includes over 40 swimmers representing all levels and abilities, from year-round and summer swim league swimmers to athletes new to the sport. As the team's size has grown, so has its success. For the last five years its girls have qualified for the state championship meet, and its boys for the last two. Current Grady swimmers hold 18 all-time team event records. Ten seniors will graduate this year, but the team looks forward to continued success as new swimmers join the team and continue its winning traditions.
