HOTS CPS  Performance Task: Goal-Submit a nomination letter to the Civil Rights Hall of Fame selection committee explaining the reasons that your candidate should be included in the Civil Rights Hall of Recognition. Role-Nomination committee member Audience-Civil Rights Hall of Fame selection committee Situation- The United States has announced the establishment of a Civil Rights Hall of Recognition to honor the contributions of leaders from the civil rights movement. Because you are learning about famous civil rights activists from the Civil Rights Era, you have been asked to nominate a candidate you believe would be worthy of admission to the Hall. In order to research thoroughly, you have traveled back in time to the days of Civil Rights Movement. You have been given the opportunity to interview one of the influential people you have studied in this unit.	Unit Title: Forensic Science Theme: Science Duration: 10 wks.
