What is it?

This plan describes how Dunbar Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement in order to support student learning. How is it revised?

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Dunbar Elementary School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the parent and family engagement plan is sent home with all students. The plan is posted on the school website and other social media sites. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

Dunbar Elementary School Goals

By the end of the 2021-2022 school year we will:

- 1. Increase the number of 3rd-5th graders scoring meeting/exceeding on the state **social studies** test from 48%to 50%.
- 2. Increase the number of 3rd-5th graders scoring meeting/exceeding on the state **Science** test from 46% to 50%.
- 3. Increase the number of students scoring meeting and exceeding on the **math** state test from 59%-65%; and
- 4. Increase the number of the 3rd-5th grade students scoring meeting and exceeding on the **reading /ELA** state test from 75%-80%.

School-Parent Compact

- Provide necessary training and workshops to prepare parents with the necessary information about assessments and testing. For example: Math & Literacy Curriculum Nights and Georgia Milestones Bootcamp.
- Train parents to enhance the engagement of the other parents and families.
- In order to maximize parent and family engagement, Dunbar arrange school meetings at a variety of times or conduct in-home conferences with teachers or other educators who work directly with the participating children and parents who are unable to attend conferences at school.
- Provide families with information in a parent friendly language and translate materials in a language that parents understand.
- Establish a school-wide to provide ad vice on all matters related to parent and family engagement in Title I, Part A programs.
- Develop appropriate roles for community-based organizations and businesses, including faith-based organizations, in parental involvement activities
- We offer a strong transitional program with Sheltering Arms to prepare our incoming kindergarten students and families on what to expect. (Kindergarten Round-Up activities Spring).
