This year, the MJHS Counseling Team will hold **Destination: Graduation** during the week of January 22nd to begin the course selection process for the 2024-2025 school year. Starting on Monday, January 22, 10th grade students will visit the Media Center with their Social Studies class for classroom instruction from the Counselors, which will cover topics such as APS graduation requirements, college planning and match & fit, HOPE requirements, understanding your GPA, and more. This presentation will be shared with families next week.

Destination: Graduation will culminate with student Grade Level Meetings. These meetings are a critical part of the sophomore year, where students speak one-onone with their counselor to discuss their academic path, future plans, and select their classes for the following school year.

IMPORTANCE OF CREDIT RECOVERY

Credit recovery programs are designed to help students who have failed courses or fallen behind in their studies, catch up and get back on track. These programs provide an avenue for students to make up for lost credits and gain the skills necessary for success in school.

High school graduation research trends state that ontrack students are more than three and one-half times more likely to graduate from high school in four years than off-track students. The indicator is a more accurate predictor of graduation than students' previous achievement test scores or their background characteristics.

WHAT DO THEY DO?

- The Graduation Coach provides comprehensive mentoring, outreach, and supportive services to students to include implementing activities to improve the number of participating students who obtain a high school diploma, completing applications for, and enrolling in a program of postsecondary education, or secure training while in high school that will lead career readiness.
- This position is also responsible for encouraging student enrollment in rigorous and challenging curricula and coursework, to reduce the need for remedial coursework at the postsecondary level, providing information regarding financial aid for postsecondary education to participating students.



Graduation Coaches are a critical part of the Student Support Department and frequently collaborate with Professional School Counselors on academic planning for students.

What is mindfulness: Mindfulness is the basic human ability to be fully present, aware of where we are and what we are doing, and not overly reactive or overwhelmed by what is going on around us.

Mindfulness education — lessons on techniques to calm the mind and body — can reduce the negative effects of stress and increase students' ability to stay engaged, helping them stay on track academically and avoid behavior problems.
