School-wide expectations

- Classroom
- Hallway
- Cafeteria

Classroom

- Respect your classroom community
- Respect your teacher
- Respect your peers
- Respect yourselves
- Focus on the positive, stay clear of the negative dialogue and undesired behaviors

Hallway

- Voices are off (LEVEL 0)
- Must carry a HALL PASS!
- Respect student work on the wall
- Give personal space in the line
- Walk at <u>ALL</u> times
- Stay on the **<u>RIGHT</u>** side
- Keep hands and feet to yourself

Cafeteria

- × Clean up after yourselves
- **×** Use an inside voice (LEVEL 1)
- × Raise your hand if you need anything
- × Make sure you have all items before you sit down
- × Stay in your seat until dismissed
- × Keep hands and feet to yourself
- ✗ GO TO THE RESTROOM BEFORE YOU ENTER THE CAFETERIA!

RestRoom

- Only one student is to be in a stall at a time.
- Students will use quiet voices ("inside voices").
- Students will wash and dry hands appropriately after using the restroom.
- Use water appropriately
- Students will refrain from playing or climbing, and will respect the privacy of others
- at all times.
- Students will report problems to the closest adult. (When in doubt, don't flush.)

Playground

- Stay in your designated area
- Follow the directions of the supervising staff member
- Use appropriate language
- Follow game rules
- Include all others and take turns
- Maintain your personal space
- Use the equipment as intended

Bus

- Remain in assigned seat, seated with seat belts fastened at all times
- Refrain from loud or disruptive behavior that may distract the bus driver
- Keep all body parts and personal objects inside the bus
- Be respectful to all passengers and staff members
- Refrain from eating or drinking on the bus
- Refrain from using any electronic device
- Get on and off the bus only at assigned stop
