Specifically, this year, we were able to add additional teachers on several grade levels and lower class sizes.

Financial Overview

In the 2022 / 2023 school year, the Sarah Smith Education Foundation (SSEF) invested more than \$88,000 in curriculum related items, such as technology, classroom equipment and professional development opportunities for our teachers.

With the generous support of many parents, grandparents, faculty, staff and community partners, we raised \$179,734 in the 2022/2023 school year. The SSEF is committed to its mission – supporting the quality of education at Sarah Smith through strategic investments in curriculum and instructional programs that directly enhance the school's mission of academic excellence for all Sarah Smith students.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 provided just over \$200 million to APS over three years to help address the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on APS students. Sarah Smith received a portion of these ARPA funds to address the following:

- Provide for a safe return to in-person instruction consistent with CDC guidance on reopening schools.
- Address learning loss through evidence-based interventions.
- Maintain continuity of services for students and staff, including socialemotional learning, mental health, student health, and food services.

Funds were utilized to address several critical areas, including intervention, social-emotional learning, and student and staff health and well-being.

Curriculum and Classroom Funding Expenses
The SSEF funded more than \$88,000 in educational
enrichment programs, materials and training. The
following is a comprehensive list of investment areas

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

The largest percentage of SSEF funding was Academic Programming. These dollars supported curriculum initiatives that further all Sarah Smith Elementary student's mastery of Math, Science, English and the Arts.



Classroom Libraries......\$424

In addition to the school's media center, classroom libraries and the bookroom provide close proximity to literary resources. In-class libraries help enhance literacy, increase time spent reading and help improve fluency, phonics, phonemic awareness, and reading comprehension. Funds pay for books for each class, leveled readers, and novels to support both the Georgia Standards of Excellence and the IB Inquiry-based Units. **Grades: All**

Specialist Programs - Art, Language, Music & PE......\$5,769

Provides funds for programenhancing materials and equipment to supplement what APS provides.

READING AND ENGLISH & LANGUAGE ARTS:

Learning-to-Read Resources.....\$526

Lexia Core 5 is a comprehensive technology-based literacy program that aims to build foundational reading skills for students of all abilities through personalized learning. The program focuses on six aspects of reading instruction: phonological awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, comprehension and structural analysis. **Grade: All**

SCIENCE & SOCIAL STUDIES:

High Touch High Tech.....\$13,263

Local scientists set up and oversee 'in-house' field trips in order to provide students with hands-on learning directly tied to each grade level's Science curriculum and the Georgia Standards of Excellence

MATH:

Eureka Workbooks.....\$2,779

Math manipulatives, consumables, workbooks and "hands-on" tools to support the Common Core Curriculum, Math Exemplars, the APS math program.

The SSEF is committed to supporting faculty development opportunities that encourage teaching innovation and excellence. Investments in this area include a focus on improving teacher efficacy in International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program.

With the goal of enhancing the teaching environment at SRS, the SSEF provides a \$300 check to every full-time teacher to purchase individualized classroom supplies in support of the curriculum.

The SSEF strives to foster and support a positive, informed and engaged school culture and community.

IT Week: The International Travelers Program is a week-long classroom immersion in the culture, history, and language of a foreign country. The program, which is unique to Sarah Smith, is a collaboration among dedicated parent volunteers, teachers and administrators and "transports" the school to a new country every year. **Grades: All**

The SSEF invests to build systems and resources to support IB, Language implementation and ESOL community support.



Dual Immersion\$385

Funds provide classroom materials and supplies in English and Spanish to support the fidelity of program implementation for the dual immersion Kindergarten through Fifth Grade. Additionally, funds support professional learning for the teachers. Grades: All

International Baccalaureate Inquiry Materials, Resources, Dues & **Programming Fees......\$9,318**

SRS was first awarded IB status in 2006. The IB program encourages students to be active learners, well-rounded individuals, and engaged world citizens. This program impacts the whole curriculum at SRS as this instructional philosophy permeates all facets of our instructional programming. IB teaches each student essential skills for learning and becoming a productive global citizen. SSEF funds pay for inquiry materials for each grade, and for required development and training of teachers and for programming fees and dues.
