# Parental Involvement is Important!

Regardless of family income or background, students with involved parents/guardians/families are more likely to:

Earn higher grades and test scored, and enroll in higher-levels programs
Be promoted and pass their classes
Attend school regularly
Have better social skills, show improved behavior, and adapt well to school
Graduate and go on to further education

#### When do Children Learn?

Eighteen years is 157,680 hours- that's a lot of hours! From the time a child is born until he or she graduates from high school, what percentage of the child's waking, learning hours are spent at and at school.

Let's do the math!!!

Assume kids sleep about 8 hours each day; 24 hours per day - 8 hours sleeping = 16 waking hours per day

- 365 days per year x 18 years = 6,570 days
- 6,570 days x 16 waking hours per day = 105,120 waking hours by age 18
- Assume kids are in school an average of 6.5 hours each day
- 180 school days per year x 6.5 hours per school day = 1,170 hours of school each year
- 1,170 hours of school each year x 13 years (1 year in kindergarten + 12 years through high school) = 15, 210 school hours
- 15,210 school hours ÷ 105,120 waking hours = .1446 or only 14.46% of waking hours by age 18 spent in school.

That means 85.54% of children's time is spent elsewhere—mainly at home. No wonder parent involvement has such a huge impact on children's school success.

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
