





Key Senior Checkpoints

Phase 1: Due by December 17th, 2021

- Applied for three scholarships by December 17, 2021



College and Career Readiness Support

- In addition to your School Counselor, The College Advisers will support you in creating and executing their post-high school plans.
- What does that look like?
 - Meeting 1:1 with you and your student about college, military, workforce options.
 - Assistance with scholarships and college applications.
 - Discussing financial aid and scholarships (aka how to pay for college).
 - ☐ Fee waivers for college applications and admissions tests (SAT/ACT/Accuplacer).



Additional Post-Secondary Options

- Military
 - □ ASVAB school administration in October and December
 - ☐ Scores are good for 2 years
 - Students interested in the military still need to meet with the college adviser for a smooth transition.
 - Note: Promotion in the military requires college credits!
- Technical Colleges
 - "Open access" institutions
 - Earn associate's degrees, certificates, and diplomas
 - ☐ Use the HOPE Grant/ HOPE Career Grant for funding
- Workforce Programs and Internships
 - ☐ LeapYear, YearUp, Westside Works



USG Requirements

☐ University System of Georgia (USG) is **requiring the SAT and/or**ACT for college applications: Check college admissions requirements;

SAT/ACT Testing

ACT A college admissions test accepted by all colleges and universities. Not administered by the school; register via act.org Score range: 1-36 (<u>17</u> is the typical <u>minimum</u> score for college admissions) **Paper** Fee waivers available for seniors from your designated counselor SAT Prep teacher) **SAT** A college admissions test accepted by all colleges and universities. October 28th - Fall School SAT Day (no registration needed) Score range: 400-1600 (920 is the typical minimum score for college admissions) **<u>Digital</u>** fee waivers available through your student's collegeboard.org account. 2 per student

Financial Aid

☐ Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
 ☐ Application opens October 1st.
 ☐ The #1 way to ensure that your student has money to pay for college!
 ☐ You will need:
 ☐ Record of money earned in 2020
 ☐ Federal 2020 tax return (1040 form)
 ☐ W-2s
 ☐ Verification of non-filing form
 ☐ FSA ID (aka a FAFSA account) to sign
 ☐ Scholarships
 ☐ The College and Career Center will be regularly uploading scholarships to the Senior Google Classroom.

important!


Financial Aid

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) FAQs: Do parents have to put their tax information on the FAFSA? If your student qualifies as a dependent student, then **yes!** (FAFSA dependency is <u>different</u> from tax dependency!) Is there a deadline? **Yes!** FAFSA officially closes in June of the application year, but most colleges have <u>much</u> earlier financial aid deadlines for scholarship and grant consideration. Apply before Spring semester for your best chance at the most money! Will they check my credit? Nope! Isn't this just for loans? No! The HOPE/Zell Miller Scholarships, HOPE Grant, Achieve Atlanta Scholarship, and Federal Pell Grant (and more!) are all applied for using information from the FAFSA. That's money your student gets to

keep!
