


Paul Laurence Dunbar Elementary is a school that nurtures and develops life-long learners who are problem solvers and internationally minded citizens.

Carter G. Woodson, born in Virginia and the son of slaves, was an American historian, author, journalist, and the founder of the Association for the Study of African American Life and History. Carter G. Woodson was the second African American to receive a doctorate from Harvard University, after W.E.B. DuBois. In 1926, Carter G. Woodson developed Negro History Week. In 1976, Negro Week became Black History Month.
