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

The Written Curriculum

The PYP curriculum is organized around six transdisciplinary themes of global significance.

- Who We Are
- Where We Are in Place and Time
- How We Express Ourselves
- How the World Works
- How We Organize Ourselves
- Sharing the Planet

The PYP emphasizes **inquiry** as the leading pedagogical approach. Students are encouraged to ask questions, investigate, and develop their understanding through exploration and research.

The curriculum focuses on **key concepts** that have relevance across subject areas, helping students to build a deeper and more enduring understanding.

Students are encouraged to take <u>action</u> based on their learning. This can involve applying what they have learned to realworld situations, initiating projects, or contributing to their communities.
