- K-5 Assist students in reading with purpose and expression.
- 3-5 Provide students an understanding of multiplication and division strategies for multiplication and division within 100.
- 1-5 Help students use root words, prefixes and suffixes to figure out the meaning of unknown words.

- 3-5 I will help my child use root words, prefixes and suffixes to figure out the meaning of unknown words.

Fickett Elementary students joined with staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for goals in all content areas. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Practice counting objects around the house up to 20.
- Practice reading with purpose and expression.
- Practice addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts.
- Memorize multiplication and division facts by using flash cards.
- Use root words, prefixes and suffixes to figure out the meaning of unknown words at home.
