TEACHERS & STAFF

R.N. Fickett Elementary classroom Teachers and Staff will:

- Grades K-5 Reading: The overall goal will be to increase reading comprehension by helping students develop the knowledge, skills and strategies they must possess to become proficient and independent readers who read with meaning
- Grades K-5 Mathematics: The overall goal will be to increase mathematical proficiency scores by helping students develop foundational skills in the numbers and operations domains
- Grades K-5 Social Emotional Learning (SEL): The overall goal is to provide students, teachers, and staff with the skills needed to succeed in school, work, and life by building and maintaining strong relationships, supporting positive school culture and promoting student engagement
- Grades K-5 Technology: The overall goal is provide students with access to 21st Century Classrooms to include a variety of technology that prepares them for college, career, and beyond.

SCHOLARS

R.N. Fickett Elementary Students will:

- Review academic progress bi-weekly
- Read with parents and peers 20 minutes every day
- Practice counting objects around the house up to the number 20
- Practice reading with purpose and expression
- Practice addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts
- Memorize multiplication and division facts by using flash cards
- Use root words, prefixes and suffixes to figure out the meaning of unknown words at home

FAMILIES

R.N. Fickett Elementary Parents and Families will:

- Develop a relationship with my child's teachers at the beginning of the school year to bridge learning from school to home
- Register and utilize Infinite Campus Parent Portal to monitor my child's progress weekly
- Ensure my child reads at home daily for (20) minutes with a family member or guardian
- Volunteer at school at least twice per month
- Join the Parent-Teacher Association (PTA)
- Join the PAC (Parent Advisory Committee) and attend at least 2 meetings per quarter
- Grades K-1 - I will help my child practice counting objects around the house up to 20; practice addition subtraction, multiplication and division facts; read with purpose and expression
- Grades 3-5 - I will help my child practice multiplication and division facts by using flash cards; I will support my child by reading literary and informational text together
