# Logistics

- ACCA is a program (not a school)
- Schools will be assigned to an AM or PM session

AM Schools	PM Schools
BEST, CSK, Douglass, Grady, Jackson and North Atlanta	Carver EC, Carver STEAM, Mays, South Atlanta, Therrell, Washington

- Each session is 120 minutes
- **Program is a Year-Long Commitment - Students are required to attend ACCA daily August – May**
- APS will provide transportation from home school to ACCA and from ACCA to home school

# Pathway completer in one year!

- Students will complete an entire pathway in one year, earn four credits, industry pathway credentials
  - Course 1 : August – October
  - Course 2 : November - February
  - Course 3 : March – May
  - Course 4: Employability Skills

***These 4 credits = 2 years of earned credit***

***Students must commit to remaining in the program from  
August 2021 – May 2022***

# Admission Requirements for all programs except Early College Essentials

- Students must be in the 10<sup>th</sup>, 11th or 12th grade during 2021-2022 school year and on track to graduate
  - Grade 10 (Cohort 2024) 6+ credits
  - Grade 11 (Cohort 2023) 12+ credit
  - Grade 12 (Cohort 2022) 18+ credits

***\*\*preference given to graduating seniors\*\****
- GPA of 2.0 or higher
- SST/504/Special Education – If yes, team must meet to confirm eligibility to participate
- Home school does not offer pathway requested

# Admission to Early College Essentials TCC Program

- Students must be in the 11th or 12th grade during 2021-2022 school year and on track to graduate
  - Grade 11 (Cohort 2023) 12+ credit
  - Grade 12 (Cohort 2022) 18+ credits
- Hope GPA of 2.6 or higher OR
- Meet the SAT/ACT/PSAT/ACCUPLACER entrance requirement of Atlanta Technical College
- **This program is a two year commitment for completion**

***The Early College Essentials TCC courses will be offered on the ACCA campus (with ATC instructors)***
