Our mission is to provide every child—regardless of background, need, or identity—a holistic genius-awakening education, built on family-sized classrooms, conscious diversity, and scholarly excellence.

2021-2022 School Highlights

- Gideons currently has 30+ community partnerships to support the school vision; Hosted Annual Partners Appreciation Luncheon in March.
- Our Pre-K geniuses became published authors. "How we go and How we come!"
- Out-Teach partnership is scheduled to complete our first outdoor classroom in May 2022.
- Gideons has seen highest enrollment since establishing the partnership with Kindezi during the 2017 school year.
- SY21-22 focused on staff and genius well being with conquering coping skills and trauma informed trainings.
- This year with the help of partnerships, Kindezi was able to provide approximately 250 free laptop devices for families. These devices were earned through attending SEL and FE workshops.

Slater Elementary School





- Project-Based Learning methods promote deep learning and bolster our scholars' 21st Century skillsets.
- Environmental Science and Robotics class offerings are innovative, student-focused and real-world relevant.
- First **all-girls robotics team** has been hard at work building a chassis for their ROBOT!
- Trauma-Informed Care training for ALL staff so we are intentionally responsive to students' SEL needs.
- Deep focus on the **development and well-being of staff** to address burnout caused by pandemic.
 - Launched an Urban Garden Club and the "What's Cookin' Cafe".
- Partnered with KidsDoc on Wheels to provide free pediatric services and host series of vaccine and testing events for entire Slater and neighborhood communities.
 - Partnered with **Boys & Girls Club** to provide free after-school care and enrichment.

Thomasville Heights Elementary

- THES Urban Farm continues to produce hundreds of lbs of produce and farm shares that help feed scholars' families and community.
- 176 students received 3000+ hours of hands-in agriculture based instruction this school year alone.
- Through partnership with CARE, facilitated distribution of \$500 cash cards to help ease the financial burden of relocation for Forest Cove families.
- For College & Career week, 5th graders researched college and careers of their choice and presented findings to lower grade peers.
- SensationalSIX Robotics Team competed in the Super Regionals earlier this year.
- **\$15K Grant** from the UPS Foundation to support literacy initiatives

Price Middle School



- **Great strides in Literacy** thanks to Reading Plus, Lexia, and our Schenck School partnership; **63% of students met their MAP Growth goal in Reading.**
- Introduced new Urban Farming Program where students cultivate, grow, harvest, and use crops to feed themselves and their community.
- **100Cameras x Framebridge partnership** allowed for students to learn about digital storytelling, cameras, and revealing emotions through photography.
- **Passport to Change** program provided students with the opportunity to explore careers in the aeronautics industry.
- **Price Chess Team** continues to excel, again qualifying in the State championship and will compete in the National Competition in TX later this month.
- Partnership with the **Trust for Public Land's Schoolyard Development Project**, students were able to provide designs and ideas for the schoolyard through PBL.



Carver Early College

- 103 scholars participating in the Early College Model for the Fall of 2022 (45% increase in participation from 2021) This includes enrollment at the 4 partner schools (Georgia State University, Atlanta Technical College, Atlanta Metropolitan College and Georgia Military College)
- Graduation Rate of 90.1% for the 2021 school year
- Class of 2022 seniors have already been awarded nearly 7.5 million dollars in scholarships to colleges!
- Class of 2022 had 12 Gifted Interns who presented Capstone Projects at the district on April 21st
- Robotics Team received the Industrial Design Award at the at the Peachtree District State Qualifier in Albany on March 31
- Recipient of the ALPLA Grant in the amount of \$5000 for the Robotics Team



Carver STEAM



- Only Atlanta school offering P-TECH, a free multi-year program from IBM that equips students with an associate degree from Atlanta Technical College and jobs and internships with big local companies, like IBM.
- Increased graduation rate by 10.6 percentage points in the three years since APS partnered with Purpose Built Schools Atlanta to run Carver STEAM in 2018.
 This is also the largest improvement in graduation rate of any other high school in the district over this three-year period.
- Class of 2022 seniors have already been awarded nearly \$4M in scholarships to colleges!
- **Carver SGA** recently hosted a breakfast with the Board, where they reintroduced their goals for the year and beyond!
