

Cohort 2021 | 4-year Graduation Rate


Growth Percentile | Math

The Midtown Cluster has a long history of high performance as an education destination in Atlanta, and is home to some of the highest performing schools in the district.


The cluster has high levels of parent and community engagement across all schools, including collaboration amongst parent groups in the elementary schools to promote equitable engagement across campuses.


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MAP Growth Percentile | Math






