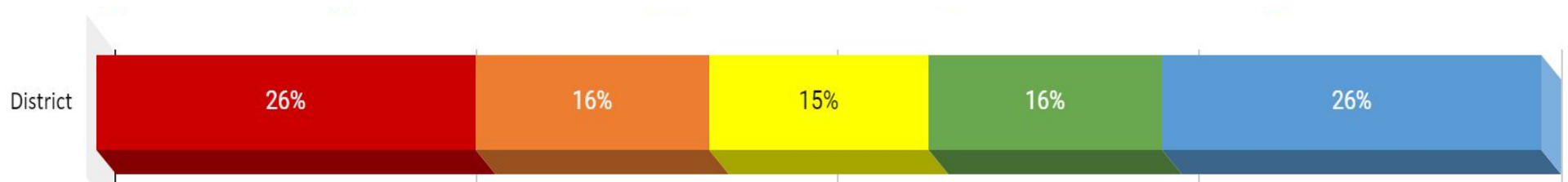

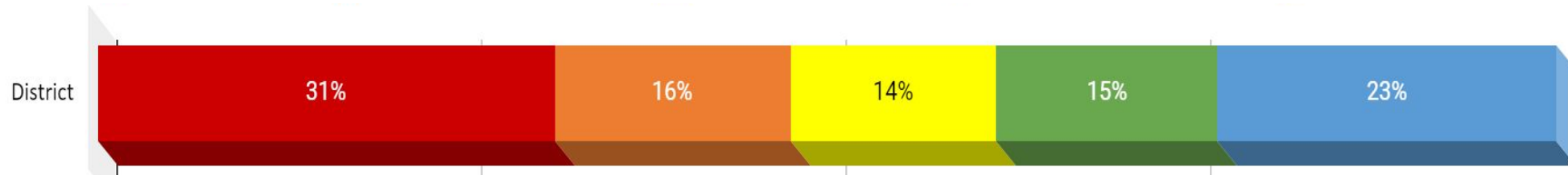
Growth Percentile | Math

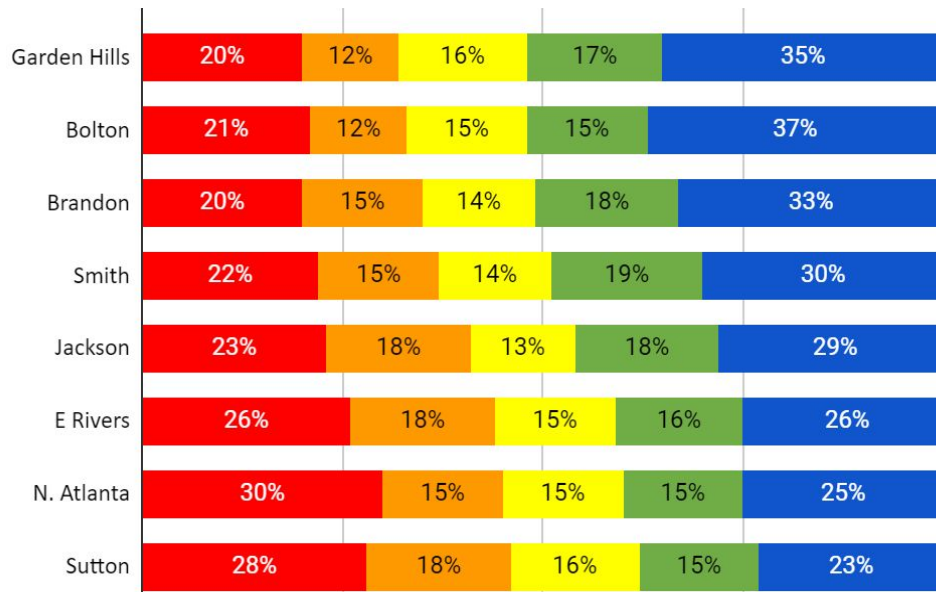

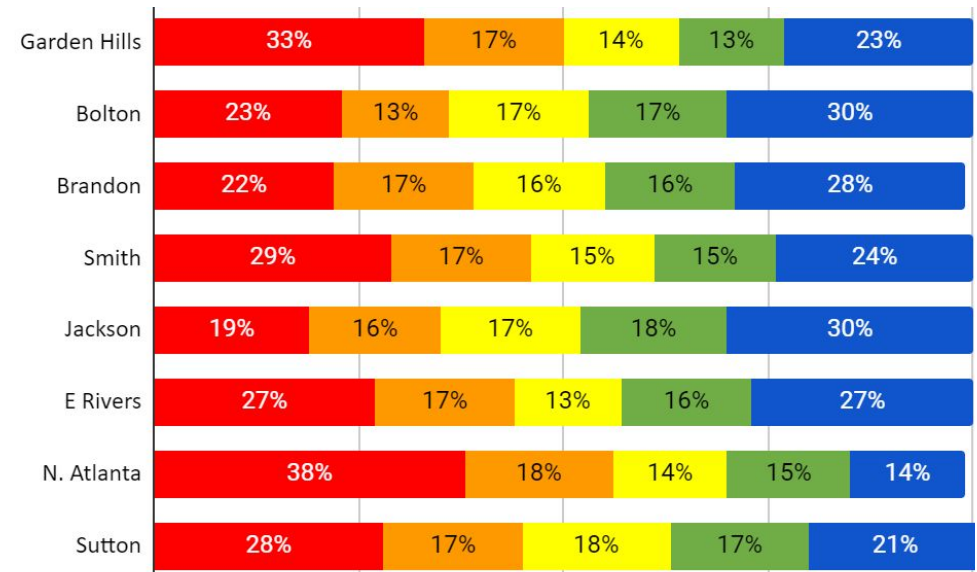

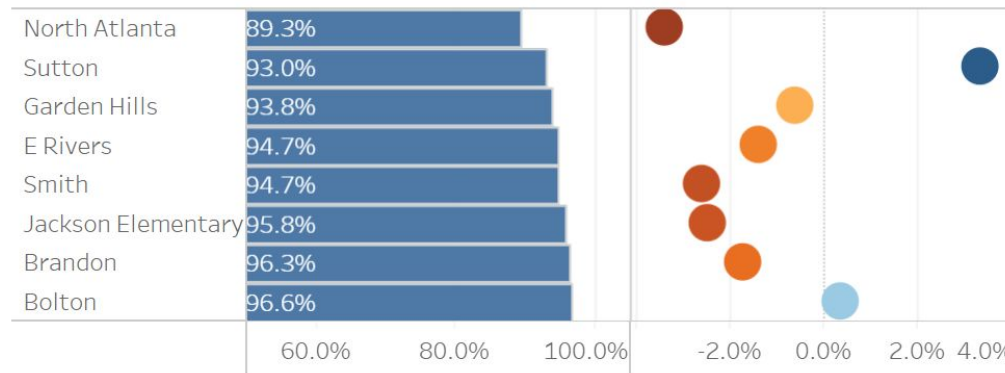
