BaMO Academy administrators and the Leadership team have studied our performance data. Highlighted below are the goals extracted from our Continuous Improvement Plan (CIP):

- By May 2025, we will increase the percentage of students scoring proficient and above, in grades 3-5, on the Georgia Milestones Literacy Assessment from 28% (2024) to 33% (2025).
- By May 2025, we will increase the percentage of students scoring proficient and above, in grades 3-5, on the Georgia Milestones Mathematics Assessment from 26% (2024) to 31% (2025)
- By May 2025, we will decrease the percentage of chronically absent scholars (scholars missing more than 90% of their enrolled days) from

- ✓ Teach students and parents how to use a variety of strategies through grade level Curriculum Nights in order to expose parents to Georgia Standards of Excellence.

In the Classroom:

Scholars will:

- Work to improve mastery of core content knowledge in literacy & mathematics.
- Have a global mindset inclusive of the IB learner profiles, learner attributes and self-inquiry

Teachers will:

- Offer targeted intervention during a personalized instruction block based on students' specific needs.
- Ensure protected quality of learning time through decreased classroom interruptions.
- Create active and authentic learning opportunities through the use of technology for students in all content areas.
- Participate in regular Professional Development to enable all students to meet state student academic achievement standards.

Families can support students' reading understanding by:

- ✓ Using academic based games at home to help your scholar in reading comprehension.
- ✓ Helping your scholar develop a love of reading by reading with them at home for at least 20 minutes each day and log those minutes in Beanstack.
- ✓ Engage with Accelerated Reader to develop independent reading skills.
- ✓ Increase fluency and competency in math by using the IXL platform.
