

- Students participated in a field trip to the Atlanta History Center where they explored life on the Smith's Farm in 1860
- Our ELA classes have been engaged in reading an award winning play, A Raisin in the Sun to develop understanding of citing text evidence and point of view
- Students have taken a deep dive into the memoir, "Born a Crime" in order to learn more about South African culture as well as address social and emotional standards.
 7th graders will transition to learning about Southwest Asia in November!

- Our mathematicians are working on combing like terms and solving equations through real world tasks!
