Beecher Hills is identified as a Title I school as part of Georgia's **Every Student Succeeds Act of 2017 (ESSA)**. ESSA replaces the former Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Beecher Hills has a school-wide improvement or success plan under this program.

- ◆ Title I is a federally funded program that provides funding to our school to help ensure that every student meets the state's high academic standards.
- ◆ Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parent and family engagement.

As a Title I school we must jointly develop with parents and families a written parent and family engagement plan.



2023-2024 GOALS

District Goal for Academic Program

Our students will be well-rounded individuals who possess the necessary academic skills and knowledge and are excited about learning.

Beecher Hills Goals

The school's administrators and teachers have studied our student performance data to decide on the most important areas of improvement for our school. This data is also shared with parents and students. The following goals are outlined in the school's improvement plan for the is year:

- ◆ By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, increase the percentage of students of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient or above on GMAS from 44% to 47% (52 students) in English/Language Arts.
- ◆ By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, increase the percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient or above on GMAS from 46% to 49% (54 students) in Mathematics.
- ◆ By the end of the 2023-2024 academic year positive responses for the Peer Social Support on the school climate survey will increase from 75% to 78%.

Our Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This plan describes how Beecher Hills Elementary School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning on our journey to excellence. We value the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Beecher Hills will support parent engagement and how family members can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it developed and revised?

We invite all families to participate in the review and revision of our required Title I documents. These include the School-wide Improvement Plan, the Budget, the family engagement plan, the school-parent compact, and the budget for parental involvement. Review and revision occurs formally in the spring preceding the following school year. Parent input and comments are welcome throughout the school year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parental involvement. Parents can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

This plan applies to all families of every K-5 student. All are encouraged and invited to participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Beecher Hills will make provisions so that parents with limited English, disabilities, and those of migratory children can fully participate in family engagement opportunities.

Where is it available?

The plan is posted to the school website, emailed to all parents with email addresses on file, sent home with every student via homework folders, and distributed at the Annual Title I meeting. Parents can also view a copy in the school Media Center Title I notebook or retrieve a copy in the Parent Center located in room 283, located on the main floor.

How Beecher Hills Helps Students on the Journey to Excellence

Beecher Hills Elementary takes the following measures to promote and support parents as important participants in helping students achieve academically and reaching our school performance goals.

We will ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in English and other translations per our ESOL enrollment, posted on the school calendar, and included in the communication resources used for all parents.

We will solicit verbal and/or written feedback from parents at all events.

We will facilitate parent access to the Parent Portal as a means to monitor their child’s progress weekly and work with educators.

We will partner with our in-house Pre-K Program and their support staff and agencies by conducting joint staff meetings and sending out school information about parent engagement activities to help prepare parents and their child for kindergarten and improve school transition.

We will provide regular trainings for staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.

We will use our Partners in Education and Family Engagement Committee to improve awareness of the activities and events listed in the school parental involvement plan.

We will provide interpreters for non-English speaking parents during meetings and conferences.

We will communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school-wide events and activities, through phone messages, Class Dojo, social media, school marquee, email and flyers.

We will provide necessary materials and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child’s achievement during APTT meetings and individual conferences.

We will share information on the state, district, grade level, class and individual student performance on academic standards and assessments during APTT meetings and individual conferences.

Title I Parent Resource Center

It is open Monday through Friday 8:00 am – 4:00 pm and during most school events occurring outside the normal school day.
