### HOOPLA

Hoopla. is a database of books covering any topic that you can think of or imagine!! Students and teachers can also watch movies!! Users have the option to read or listen to materials simultaneously in Hoopla. All you have to do is sign up for a free account using your email address. When you are prompted to select your participating library, select the Fulton Public Library. Staff, your library card is your Lawson number. The **student's library** card is their Network ID (pdiddy1234).




### RACE2READ


RACE2 READ is the reading initiative and Beanstack is the computer program for logging in the minutes read. Atlanta Public Schools is raising the bar for reading via APS Race2Read: The 2 Million Minutes Challenge. This district-wide campaign encourages students, teachers, staff, parents and the entire Atlanta community to collectively read 2 million minutes. Beanstack is a web-based, mobile-friendly tool that we are using to track our independent reading during our 2 million minutes challenge. Reading may be logged at any time – in school or on the go.

Simply record what you're reading and the time spent reading. Logging reading minutes via Beanstack is a crucial stride on our track to victory. That's right, victory. Each reader is eligible to earn badges of recognition while building excitement and enthusiasm around free-choice reading across the district.

APS is passing the baton, challenging you and your child to read every day. Each APS school has its own Beanstack site, where you can view individual school progress on achieving its schoolwide goal.
