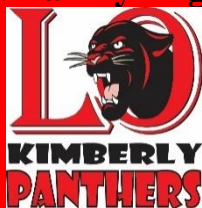

Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and including strategies to support parent and family engagement. School Plan for Shared Student Academic Achievement



What is it?

This plan describes how Kimberly Elementary will provide opportunities to engage our families and enhance support for all students. Kimberly Elementary values the contributions and involvement of all parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. The plan describes the different ways that Kimberly Elementary will support parent engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How can families provide feedback?

Throughout the year parents and families are encouraged to provide input and feedback on the Parent / Family Engagement Plan, School Compacts, and other Title I funded programs. Parents will be provided with input forms when attending parent workshops and events. Parents are also encouraged to connect with the school's parent liaison to share any feedback and input they may have.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A, Program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Kimberly Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

District Goal

Our students will be well-rounded individuals who possess the necessary academic skills and knowledge and are excited about learning.

School Goals

Kimberly Elementary administrators and leadership team have studied our performance data and decided that increasing Reading/ELA scores on Georgia Milestones and improving school culture as the most important areas of improvement for our school.

During the 2024 - 2025 School Year...

- the percentage of students performing at Beginning Level on the RDG MAP Growth assessment will decrease by 3% from Fall to Spring administration (Goal = 46% to 43%);
- the percentage of students performing at Proficient Level or Above on the RDG MAP Growth assessment will increase by 5% from Fall to Spring administration (Goal = 23% to 28%).
- the percentage of Grades 3-5 students achieving a Raw Score of 3 or higher on the Write Score Reading Narrative will increase by 5% (7% to 12%)
- the percentage of students performing at Beginning Level on the MTH MAP Growth assessment will decrease by 3% from Fall to Spring administration (Goal = 39% to 36%).
- the percentage of students performing at Proficient Level or Above on the MTH MAP Growth assessment will increase by 5% from Fall to Spring administration (Goal = 12% to 17%).
- the percentage of students performing at the Proficient or Above Level on SCI GMAS will increase by 5% (16% - 21%).
- During the 2024 – 2025 school year, the percentage of students with 10% or more of their enrolled days absent will decrease from 39% to 34%.

Literacy Focus

1. Phonics – letter and sound recognition
2. Read for fluency and comprehensions

Culture Focus

1. Implement and monitor SEL (Social Emotional Learning)
2. Teacher positive behaviors through use of Success Center.

- ✓ Ensure that all parents are invited to the Annual Title I Meeting at a convenient time for them at the school to explain the program and activities provided through Title I and Federal guidelines.
- ✓ Offer flexible meetings for parents, Monday-Friday, as early as 7:30 a.m. and as late as 4:00 p.m. These meeting will be promoted through personal letters, telephone calls, website, social media, fliers, etc.
- ✓ Share information in parent friendly language to assist parents/families in understanding the school and state academic standards and assessments. Information will be translated as necessary for parents who speak another language.
- ✓ Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
- ✓ Partner with early learning programs by conducting joint meetings for parents and sending school information about parent engagement activities to help prepare parents for kindergarten and improve school transition.
- ✓ Provide parents with timely information, as well as allowing time for school staff to respond to parent's recommendations.
- ✓ Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parent engagement.
