Greeting parents, I am Mrs. Tyson-Johnson (Mrs. TJ) the Math and Science Instructional Coach. My role at Jones is to provide teachers with instructional support in areas of Math and Science. I am also instrumental in supporting our S.T.E.A.M integration focus as a school. In addition to teachers and scholars, I am here for you! Do you need help understanding how we do things mathematically and scientifically to ensure you feel confident in supporting your child's learning continuum. I look forward to working with you, our scholars, and teachers as we push F.U.L.L STEAM ahead and strive for Greatness!

At M. A. Jones, we use Eureka Math for our daily math instruction. We chose this program because it helps teachers provide instruction on a level that gives scholars a deep conceptual understanding of math and how numbers work. It pushes our students to think critically and look for more than one way to solve a problem. If you are wanting to help at home here is a link to online resources and videos that will help you navigate how math is taught (https://embarc.online/). Just select your child's grade and the module they are currently studying. There you will find an outline of the learning goals, videos, and samples of homework support to assist you.



Greetings MAJ Family,

A new school year has launched and at M. Agnes Jones we are moving FULL (Focused and United to Launch Learning) STEAM AHEAD! My name is Ms. Glenneisha Jones, I am the English Language Arts & Social Studies Instructional Coach at M. Agnes Jones. My role is to give recommendations about potential next steps to address areas of need and support teachers in planning and instruction to guide your scholars in becoming distinguished readers and writers.

This school year grades K-2 will continue using the Success for All (SFA) Reading Program, a comprehensive program designed to help scholars read, learn, and succeed using a cooperative learning approach. Grades K-3 will also be using a program called Fundations. Fundations provides a systematic and explicit approach to reading and spelling with phonics.

This year in grades 3-5, we will be using a reading curriculum called ReadyGen, which provides an integrated and well-balanced approach to reading and writing instruction.This curriculum includes authentic literary and informational texts with modeling and teacher-directed activities to drive learning and motivate readers. Scholars write in response to sources such as writing prompts and/or passages, cite evidence and are developing CLOSE reading habits. They write in different modes or genres, including narrative, informative, and opinion writing. Scholars can access learning resources via MyBackpack https://launchpad.classlink.com/atlanta and click on the Savvas Easybridge icon.

What have your scholars been learning?

In Grade 3, scholars have been developing their understanding of the actions and motivations of characters in stories and how characters' actions affect the sequence of events in a story. The goal by the end of this module is for learners to understand that close observations helps them identify problems and find solutions. In writing, scholars are developing their skills in composing a narrative that includes developed characters, a clear sequence of events, and a conclusion using the correct conventions (capitalization and punctuation).

In Grade 4, scholars are developing their understanding that themes in a literary text can be interpreted from dialogue and descriptions and how dialogue and description reveal character traits and story themes. The goal by the end of this module is for learners to understand that cultures interact with and interpret nature in different ways. In writing, scholars are developing their skills to compose a narrative in which they use dialogue and description to enhance characters and develop a theme using the correct conventions (capitalization and punctuation).

In Grade 5, scholars are developing their understanding that themes in literary texts are developed through the characters, settings, and events and how to use various narrative techniques to develop stories. The goal by the end of this module is for learners to understand that people change in reaction to their surroundings. In writing, scholars are developing their skills to compose a narrative in which they use dialogue and details to develop challenging character experiences using the correct conventions (capitalization and punctuation).

COVID-19 Surveillance Testing

Atlanta Public Schools (APS) is continuing its effort to keep everyone in our schools and buildings safe by making COVID-19 Surveillance Testing available to all students and staff. COVID-19 Surveillance Testing is a non-diagnostic test that detects the presence of COVID-19 even in individuals who may be asymptomatic. The benefits of surveillance testing include allowing APS to test, receive test results (within 24 hours) and notify individuals of a clinically significant reading before coming to school or work. While participation in surveillance testing is not required for students, it will be strongly encouraged. The success of this mitigation strategy, and the District's ability to return and keep students in school, is based on high levels of staff and student participation. APS is exploring all options as it relates to the administration of surveillance testing for staff and will be providing staff training, information sessions, and other staff engagement opportunities as part of this process.
