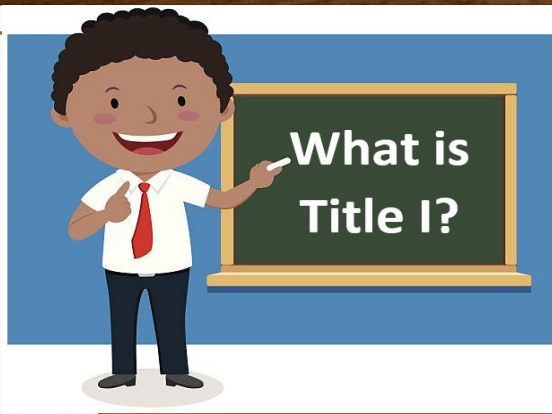

What is Title I?



Title I is:

- It's the largest federal aid program for public schools in the United States.
- Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improving teaching and learning for students.
- Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parent and family engagement.

Purpose



All Title I schools are required to hold an Annual Title I meeting at the beginning of each school year to....

- Inform parents/guardians about Title I programming, and
- Share how parents/guardians can become involved and participate in the Title I program. Our school offers workshops, trainings, and parent/teacher conferences at flexible meeting times that will be available to parents via the school calendar.

Goals of Title I



Our goals are...

- to increase academic achievement.
- to provide direct instructional support to students.
- to provide professional development for teachers.
- to promote parent education and involvement
- Provide parents and family members with timely information about Title I programs; Parents will be informed through flyers, Parent Liaison Newsletter, school calendar, Robo-calls messages and the school's website.

Parent's Right to Know

Parents have the right to know about the teaching qualifications of your child's classroom teacher in a school receiving Title I funds

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO KNOW

- Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived;
- Whether the teacher is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher; and
- Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

ESSA Section 1112 (e) (1) (A)

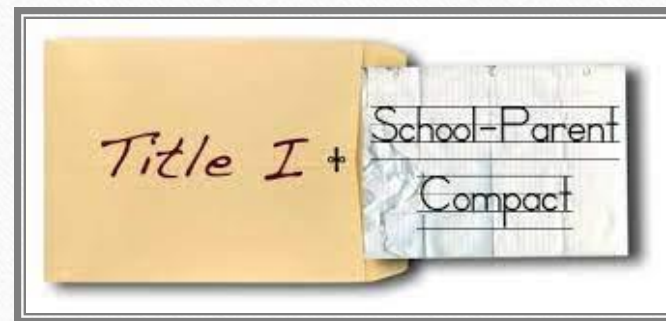

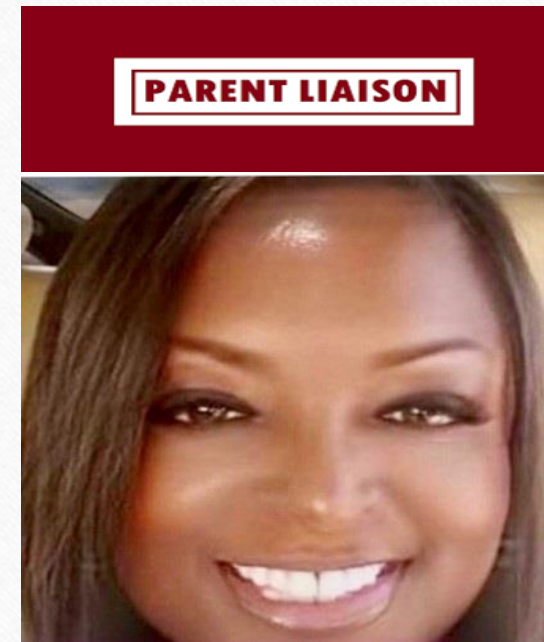
