

Ralph J. Bunche Middle School History

RALPH JOHNSON BUNCHE was born on August 7, 1904, in Detroit, Michigan. He attended UCLA, Harvard, Northwestern, and the London School of Economics. He was a political scientist and diplomat who received the 1950 Nobel Peace Prize for his 1940s mediation in Palestine; and was the first man of color awarded this honor. In 1963, Bunche was involved in the formation and administration of the United Nations, and he received the Medal of Freedom from President John F. Kennedy.

Attendance Expectations

Regular school attendance is essential for a quality education. Time missed from class

results in loss of valuable educational experiences. **Therefore, each student's attendance goal should be 100%.** We want students at school every day.

Bunche Chargers' Instructional School Day is from 9:15 am - 4:15 pm Learners may enter the building at 8:50 am

 Parents should not drop students off before 8:50 am due to lack of adult supervision.

Learners are marked TARDY at 9:16 am

• Students should arrive to class on time

In case of a necessary absence from school, a student must bring a written excuse from a parent or guardian stating the reason for the absence. Notes should be submitted to the attendance clerk. A student must be present at least half of the school day to participate in extracurricular/after school activities. In order for a student to be marked present, he/she must be in class by 12:30 pm. A student's absence may be considered unexcused if a parent's note is not received within 3 days of returning to school.

Tardies to class:

Students should arrive at all classes in a timely manner. Tardies will count towards student consequences on the Bunche Charger B.O.S.S. behavior matrix. Excessive class tardies will result in administrative intervention/consequence.

Chronic absences, truancy, and routine tardiness create a barrier to students' ability to reach their full academic potential. Regular school attendance also establishes a pattern of positive habits that can be carried over throughout your scholars' life. Students are required to attend 95% of the year. This means no student's absence should exceed 8 days.

Consequences for Class Tardies/Skipping:


1st Offense: Call home from the teacher. Document tardy/skipping and Tier 1 intervention.

2nd Offense: Call home from the teacher. Lunch/Afterschool detention. Restorative Practices lesson/agreement.

3rd and All Subsequent Offenses: Students will receive administrative intervention/consequences.

Uniform Policy

In support of student success, Ralph J. Bunche Middle School sets expectations for student dress to avoid disruption of the instructional process.



Dress Code for Spirit Days:

Learners may participate in school planned spirit days and are expected to adhere to the dress code.

Bunche Middle School is a **NO CELL PHONE ZONE**. Students are instructed to turn their phones off and place them in their lockers until dismissal. Earbuds/headphones are not allowed to be worn in the hallway. Smart watches and tablets (iPads, etc.) are also not to be used during the school day. **Any cell phone/personal electronic device(s), AI glasses, that students will bring to school must be registered by the parent/legal guardian completing the consent form found in the student handbook using the QR code.**

All staff members have the right to confiscate cell phones/electronic devices when used in violation of policy JCDAF and its implementing regulation. If a student refuses to relinquish a phone or other device to a school staff member, the staff member may refer the student with the device to the grade level assistant principal or counselor. Confiscated cell phones must be picked up by a parent from the main office. Atlanta Public Schools and Bunche Middle School assume no liability for the theft, loss, or damage of mobile telephones and other PED (personal electronic devices).

Some parents communicate with students by texting and calling them during the school day. This is against school district policy. Cell phone use of any kind is a distraction from the learning environment. Parents are asked to send all emergency communication through the main office or grade level administrators during the instructional day.

Consequences for violating the cell phone/earbud/headphones policy:

1st Offense: Verbal warning to turn off device and place it in the locker.

2nd Offense: The device will be confiscated, and the cell phone or device will be returned only to the parent/legal guardian who must schedule a conference at the school to retrieve the item. Restorative Lesson/Agreement.

3rd and All Subsequent Offenses: The device will be confiscated and will result in the student's loss of the privilege of possessing a cell phone on school property for one semester. Written notice will be mailed to the parent/guardian, and the telephone or device will be returned only to the parent/legal guardian who must schedule a conference at the school to retrieve the item. Possible further administrative consequences.

4th Offense and ALL further offenses: The phone will be confiscated, and the student will lose the privilege of possessing a cell phone on school property for one calendar year. Written notice will be mailed to the parent/guardian, and the telephone or device will be returned only

to the parent/legal guardian who must schedule a conference at the school to retrieve the item. Possible further administrative consequences.

Bus Expectations and Policy

The safety of your child is our number one concern. The bus expectations and policies promote personal accountability as it relates to bus safety because unsafe choices endanger the safety of all passengers.

The use of Atlanta Public Schools transportation is a privilege not a right. Learners are expected to adhere to the expectations and directions given by the bus driver at all times. Refusal to do so can and will result in loss of privilege.

Unsafe Behavior on the Ride Home

If unsafe behavior occurs before the bus leaves the school, the student will be provided with two options: (1) correct the behavior and continue home (behavior documented) or (2) be removed from the bus by school personnel or administration until a parent or guardian can pick up the student (behavior documented).

If unsafe behavior occurs after the bus leaves the school the driver will contact their Dispatch or Regional Supervisor for next steps, which may include the student(s) being returned to the school for pick up by a parent or guardian.


Staff will assess the situation via video and driver statement. If either of the above instances occurs, the progressive discipline plan will be in effect.

Lunch/Outside Foods/Celebration Policy

Ralph J. Bunche is a school community that promotes healthy eating which aligns with our vision for learners to live healthy lifestyles. Students are not allowed to bring in food items that do not support the practice of developing healthy eating habits. Students are welcome to bring in a complete lunch that would mimic the nutritional value of the lunches offered in the school cafeteria. All drinks should be sealed upon entrance to school and no larger than 16 oz in size. Students are not permitted to have outside food delivered via Uber Eats, DoorDash, etc. during lunch or after school. Parents should also refrain from bringing students outside food.

<u>The following are allowable items</u>: Water, personal sized snacks, fruit, unopened juices and Gatorade.

<u>The following are items students are NOT allowed to bring to school</u>: Large bags of chips (.99 or higher in cost or Hot Chips), excessive amounts of candy or drink mix packets, soda, glass bottles, pre-mixed drinks, sunflower seeds.

Celebrations

We understand that some learners love celebrating their birthday or other holidays with friends but due to food allergies, we DO NOT allow students to bring in sweet treats. This includes birthday cakes, cupcakes, cookies, ice cream, candy, or any other food items.

Lunch with Parent/Guardian

Parent(s)/Guardian(s) may eat lunch with their student but must notify the grade-level counselor and administrator to schedule the visit. There will be a reserved section for the parent(s)/guardian(s) to have lunch with their student.

Homework Expectations

At Bunche Middle School, we strive to increase our learners' opportunity to succeed. Homework is a way to help scholars develop work and study habits that will assist them throughout their years spent in grade school and college. Homework also serves as the link between school and home; allowing parents/guardians the opportunity to stay informed with the materials their scholar is learning. It allows them to help reinforce and extend concepts learned in class, assist their scholars with time management, and show interest with questions about their scholars' schoolwork.

Students Expectations Regarding Homework

Students are expected to...

- Allocate 60 90 minutes a day away from school to study, complete assignments and/or projects.
- Practice and reinforce reading and math skills
- Submit all homework assignments on time

Parents/Guardians Visits and Conferences

If a parent/guardian would like to meet with their learner's teacher(s), counselor or administrator they are asked to call or email requesting an appointment. Appointments can be held virtually or in person.

Also, the 2nd Tuesday of each month is set aside for parent-teacher conferences schoolwide

General Reminders

- The use of Rideshares (Uber, Lyft, etc.) are not permitted
- Parents must complete a medication form with the school nurse for students who need to keep medication on file

- Students will be assigned a district-issued device and will be responsible for the cost of repair or replacement if the device is damaged. Parents are strongly encouraged to purchase the device insurance plan.
- Only clear or mesh bookbags are permitted
- Students must carry a hall pass (signed by a staff member) if they leave the classroom
- Early dismissal ends at 3:15 pm daily

The Bunche Charger Way (B.O.S.S.)

Be Responsible. Take Ownership. Show Respect. Be Safe. Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS)

Positive Behavior Intervention and Support is a program used at BMS to teach behavior and model our Charger **B.O.S.S.** expectations.

PBIS is an evidence-based, data-driven framework proven to reduce disciplinary incidents, increase a school's sense of safety and support improved academic outcomes. More than 16,000 U.S. schools are implementing PBIS. The premise of PBIS is that continual teaching, combined with acknowledgement or feedback of positive student behavior will reduce unnecessary discipline and promote a climate of greater productivity, safety, and learning.

Following a behavioral incident, the student will move through the flowchart below before receiving an office referral.

- 1. Verbal Warning/ Student Conference/Tier1 Intervention
- 2. Parent Call/ Conference/Tier 1 Intervention
- 3. Silent Lunch/Restorative Agreement/Tier 1 Intervention
- 4. Office Referral

This year, BMS will be utilizing PBIS Rewards to monitor behavior and provide recognition, acknowledgement, and incentives for demonstrating Charger B.O.S.S expectations.

WHAT IS PBIS REWARDS?

PBIS Rewards is an app that helps your child's school create a positive learning environment. Teachers can reward points for following the Bunche Way and hard work, as well as document negative behavior and corresponding comments. By working hard on a regular basis, your child will be able to earn rewards and participate in fun events and earn incentives.

WHAT IS THE GOAL OF THE PROGRAM?

When students meet positive behavior expectations, they will be recognized through incentive programs and events celebrating their efforts and success. Parents of award recipients may be invited and encouraged to attend.

School Procedures and Expectations for Students

ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL



- Doors open to all students at 8:50 am (Voice Level 0 1)
 Bus Riders All bus riders will enter through the gym lobby doors
 - o 6th grade students will take stairwell #5 to the 6th grade hallway
 - o 7th grade students will use the double doors to the right of the gym lobby to enter the 7th grade hallway
 - \circ 8th grade students will travel the chorus hallway to the 8th grade hallway

Car Riders arrive on the upper level, but all students will walk down the stairs and enter the building through the gym lobby doors

Breakfast: A grab-and-go breakfast is available for all students in the gym lobby. Students will eat breakfast in their homerooms

Late Arrivals

- Any student who arrives after 9:15am will report the front of the building and enter through the side door off from the main entrance
- A staff member will complete a security check and give students a pass to class
- Students who want breakfast may report to the cafeteria until 9:30am

- Do not horseplay when walking into the building
- If you see something, say something
- Stay safe!



CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS



- All students are expected to enter the classroom quietly and must
 - o Arrive to class on time
 - o Follow the classroom rules set by the teacher
 - o Respect others and their property
 - o Remain seated in the classroom unless you have permission from the teacher
 - o Respect the space of others and keep your hands to yourself
 - Have all materials needed for class including a charged device, writing utensil and composition book
 - o Be prepared to learn

- Do not horseplay in the classroom
- Help keep the classroom clean
- The classroom is a learning environment and everyone must pay attention
- Ask for help when needed
- See something, say something



RESTROOM BREAKS



- Restroom breaks will occur throughout the day (Voice Level 0-1)
 - Morning Arrival Breaks
 - Students have from 8:50 9:10am to enter the restroom each morning (only 1 student is allowed in the restroom at a time)
 - Classroom Breaks
 - Teachers/staff will take students to the restroom at various times during the day
 - Cafeteria Breaks
 - There is a restroom break during each lunch period
 - Emergency Breaks
 - Let your teacher know if you have an emergency and need to use the restroom and you will be given a hall pass

- Do not horseplay in the restroom
- Help keep the restroom clean
- Only one student at time is allowed in the restroom



LUNCH



- Teachers will escort students to the cafeteria for lunch and seat everyone before leaving and students will do the following
 - o Walk on the right side of the hallway
 - \circ Walk quickly and quietly in the hallway (Voice Level 0 1)
 - o Sit at your assigned table and remain at your table during lunch
 - Use voice level 0 2 during the entire lunch period
 - Remove your tray and any trash from the table and under the table before leaving the cafeteria
 - o Line up with your teacher when it is time to exit

- Do not horseplay in the cafeteria line
- Speak respectfully to the cafeteria staff
- Do not leave your area before you clean your table space
- Report any water or food spills



CONNECTIONS



- When it is time to attend connections classes students must
 - Always walk with the teacher
 - o Enter the classroom when directed by the teacher and remain in classroom unless you have a hall pass
 - o Walk to the right side of the hallway quickly and quietly
- When it is time to return from connections students must
 - Always walk with the teacher
 - o Return to the grade-level hallway and go directly to your next class
 - Continue walking and do not stop for the restroom or water fountain unless you have a hall pass

- Always report on time to your connections class
- Do your best in your connections class
- You are not allowed to miss your connections class to stay back with another teacher



DISMISSAL



- Students must do the following to prepare for dismissal each day
 - o Organize your workspace at the end of the day
 - o Listen to all announcements when they begin (Voice Level 0)
 - o Remain in your classroom until given permission to leave
 - Use the following routes to exit the building
 Note: All car riders will exit out through the gym lobby. Only care riders are allowed to exit the building through the gym lobby

- It is a safety hazard to
 - o be in a dismissal area that you are not assigned
 - o report to your dismissal area early
 - o horseplay in the dismissal area
- If you see something, say something
- Be safe!



CELL PHONE RULES



- Bunche Middle School is a no cell phone zone
- Cell phones must be powered down when you enter the building
- Cell phones must be placed in your locker at the start of the day and removed at the end of the day
- Students who violate the cellphone policy will receive a consequence

- Using a cell phone or any device to record misbehavior is a violation of the Atlanta Public Schools code of conduct
- Students may not use cell phones for any reason during the school day. If a student must place a call during the day, they may ask permission to use an office phone on the grade-level or if ill, a call will be placed for you



Most Common Disciplinary Offenses

In this community, we believe that students should always demonstrate Charger B.O.S.S. behavior by doing things the Bunche Way. We encourage a partnership between home and school as we work to help scholars become their best selves. The purpose of this section of the student handbook is to communicate to students and parents the expectations for the Bunche Way. Students who receive behavior infractions will be expected to adhere to the disciplinary actions.

Disciplinary actions can include the following:

- **Community Service:** Supervised campus beautification task in the cafeteria or around the school grounds.
- **360 Behavior Intervention Lesson:** Individualized online lesson activity; designed to help students reflect on their actions and set goals for improvement.
- **Lunch Detention:** Students eat lunch in an isolated location to refrain from socializing with peers.
- **After School Detention:** Students are required to stay after school to complete a behavior reflection or community service.
- *In School Suspension:* Students spend a structured day of learning in isolation to complete classwork and SEL tasks.
- **Mandatory Parent Conference:** Parents are required to return students to school for a conference after each Out-of-School suspension or if the student receives an infraction as a repeat offender.
- **Restitution:** Parents or guardians will be required to pay when students cause damage or destruction to school facilities or property ex. restrooms, textbooks, computers, wall mounts. (this list is not all inclusive)

Progressive discipline is used to determine consequences. Repeat offenders will face more severe consequences.

Fighting: Two individuals mutually participating in a physical altercation

In this community, we believe that when students are taught the proper way to talk out their problems, violence is deterred. In this community students are expected to utilize the personnel or staff to help resolve conflicts. At NO time will physical altercations be tolerated without consequence. Fights that result in injury will have more severe consequences.

Offensive Language: No student shall use any type of profane, vulgar, obscene or ethnically and culturally offensive language (written or oral) and actions.

In this community, we believe that students deserve to be respected and that they should show respect to all staff members, peers, adults, and visitors in the community at all times. Students who use offensive language towards an adult will be given consequences. The use of profanity or inappropriate comments regarding race, gender, or anatomy are all considered to be offensive language.

<u>Insubordination: All students shall comply with reasonable directions or commands of all authorized APS personnel or designees.</u>

In this community, we believe that teachers reserve the right to control all elements of their classroom to ensure that the learning environment is safe and orderly. Students are expected to follow the directions of staff members when given the first time. When students refuse to follow directions a great deal of instructional time can be lost if teachers are constantly redirecting and addressing students who refuse to follow directions. Acts of insubordination can result in the

student's removal from the classroom environment. Depending upon the number of occurrences, the student may be given time out of school.

School-wide Disruption: No student shall, in any manner, by the use of violence, force, noise, coercion, threat, intimidation, fear, passive resistance, or any other conduct, intentionally cause the disruption of any lawful mission, process or function of the school, or engage in any such conduct for the purpose of causing the disruption or obstruction of any such lawful mission, process or function.

In this community, we believe that students and staff should always demonstrate behaviors appropriate for the school environment. Any action that interferes with the regular flow of operations within the school day will be considered as schoolwide disruption. This includes the following: fighting, rough housing, or the drawing of any crowds due to peer conflict or unruly behavior.

Battery: Intentionally making physical contact of an insulting or provoking nature with another person.
