


To celebrate the impact of African American people from the past and present we are representing our black historical figures in a live Wax Museum on Tuesday, February 28, 2023.

Our 3rd-5th graders just finished our Opinion writing unit. During the month of February, we will review narrative writing before taking our last Write Score assessment on March 15. To support your children, please encourage them to use dialogue throughout their writing, include a conclusion, and be sure to check for CUPS (capitalization, understanding, punctuation, and spelling). We are also learning to read and write poetry. Reading poetry provides great practice to improve fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. It allows the reader to "play" with language by using non-literal language, rhyming words, and shades of meaning.
