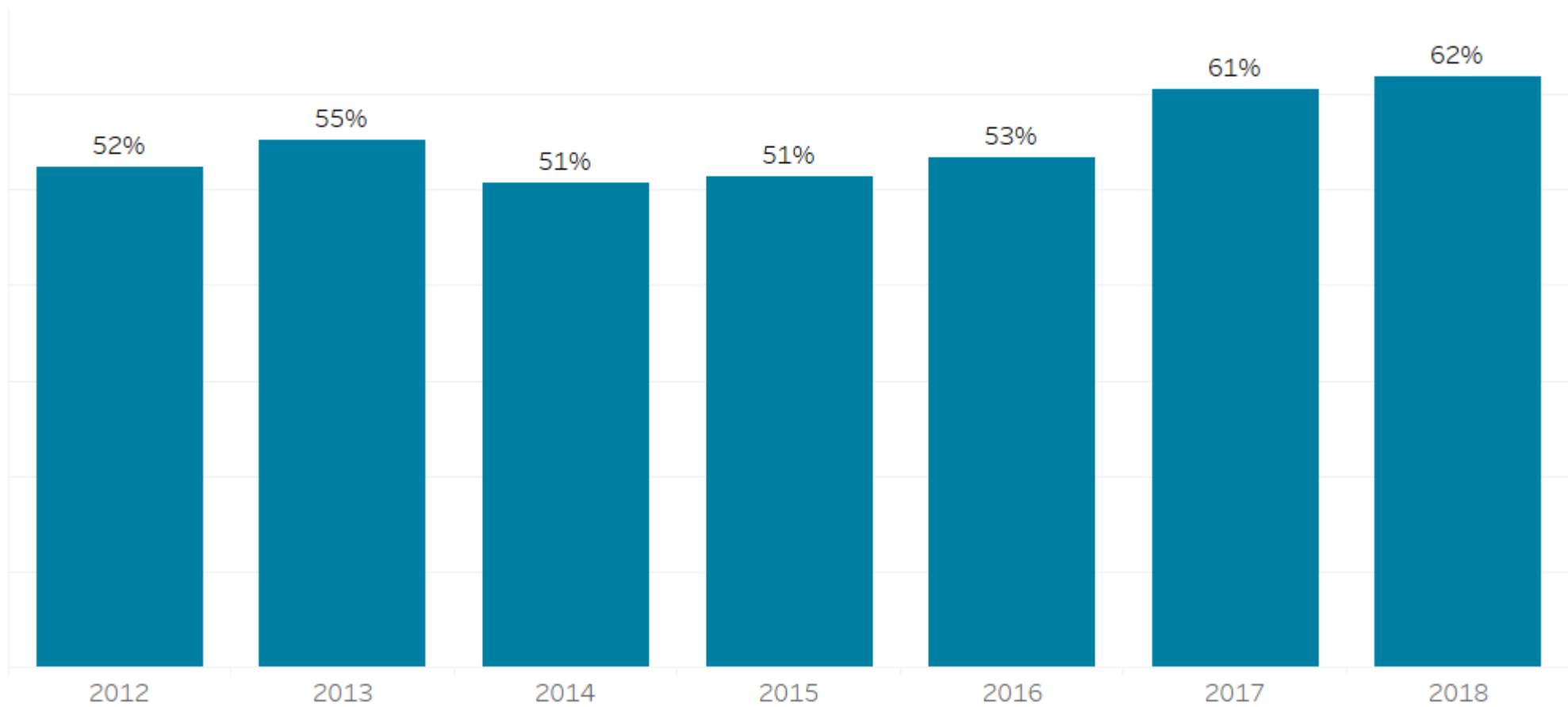

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Introduction

This report examines college enrollment and persistence of Atlanta Public School (APS) graduates since 2012. It focuses on "seamless enrollment" of each graduating cohort as defined by the Center for Education Policy Research at Harvard University. Seamless enrollment means a student enrolled in a postsecondary institution by October 1st following their high school graduation. Information about National Student Clearinghouse (NSC), the source of the post-secondary enrollment data, can be found at the end of this report.

Since 2014, the percentage of on-time APS graduates who seamlessly enrolled in college has continued to increase. 62% of cohort 2018 on-time graduates were enrolled in 2- or 4-year institutions as of October 1, 2018. This is compared to a national 2017 enrollment rate of 67%. (Source: [BLS](#))

Updates to Business Rules

During the cohort 2018 post-secondary enrollment analysis, the APS team updated several business rules in order to provide more consistency across analyses and a report more closely aligned with district needs. These changes (discussed below) were applied retroactively back to cohort 2012. Consequently, data published in the 2018 enrollment trends brief do not always match data published in previous briefs.

Post-Secondary Flagging

- Previous analyses inconsistently considered student enrollment status (e.g. full time, part-time, withdrawn) when determining seamless enrollment. Going forward, a student is considered seamlessly enrolled if s/he is enrolled in a post-secondary institution as of October 1, regardless of enrollment status.
- Beginning in 2018, the institution-type analysis (2-year / 4-year enrollment, slide 5) classifies institutions using predominant degree type from the U.S. Department of Education College Scorecard data. Previously, this analysis used NSC institution type; this classified several institutions with considerable APS enrollment as 4-year that have been re-designated as 2-year (e.g. Atlanta Metropolitan State College, Georgia State Perimeter).

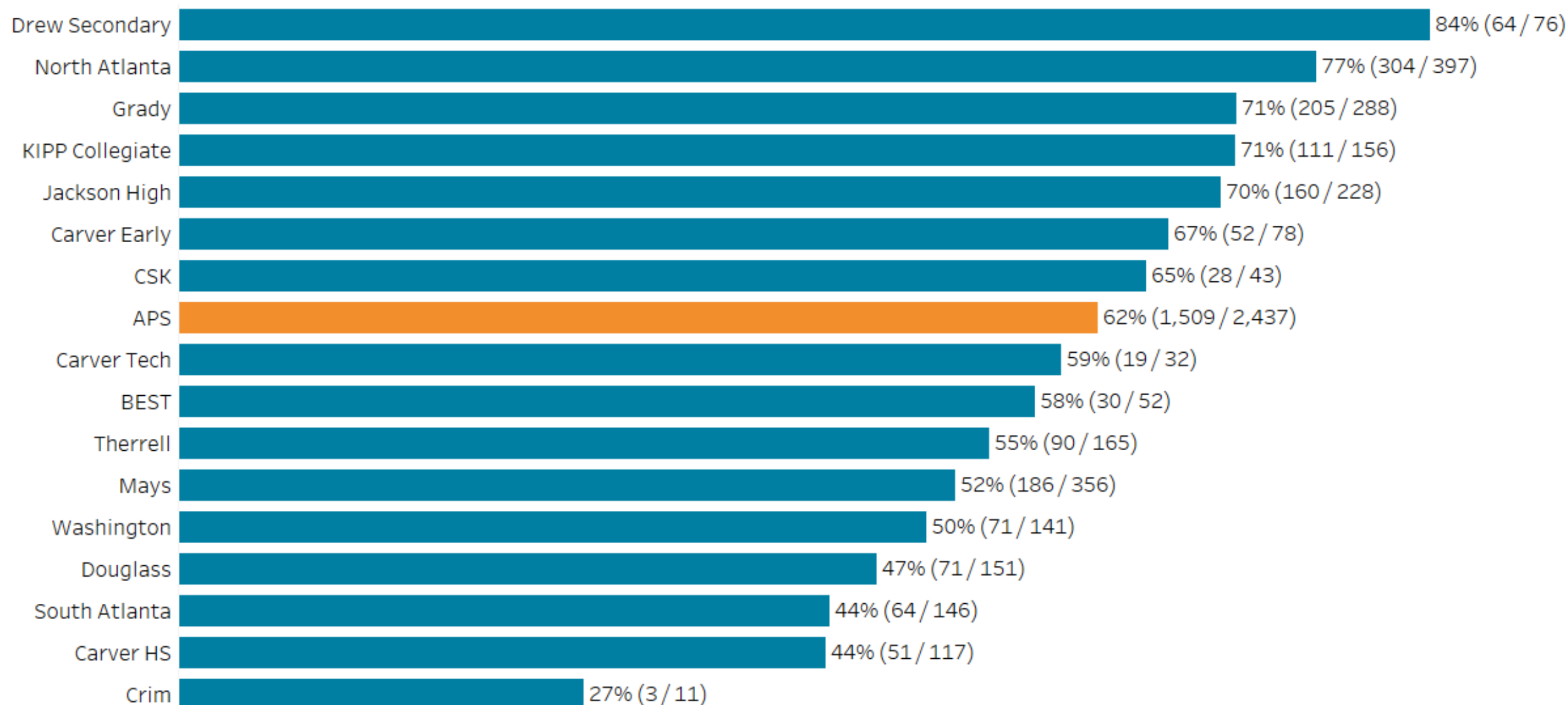
Student Universe

- Improvements in matching based on student IDs added students to the universe of on-time graduates examined in this analysis. These improvements primarily affected cohorts 2013 and 2014.

2018 postsecondary enrollment rates varied by high school

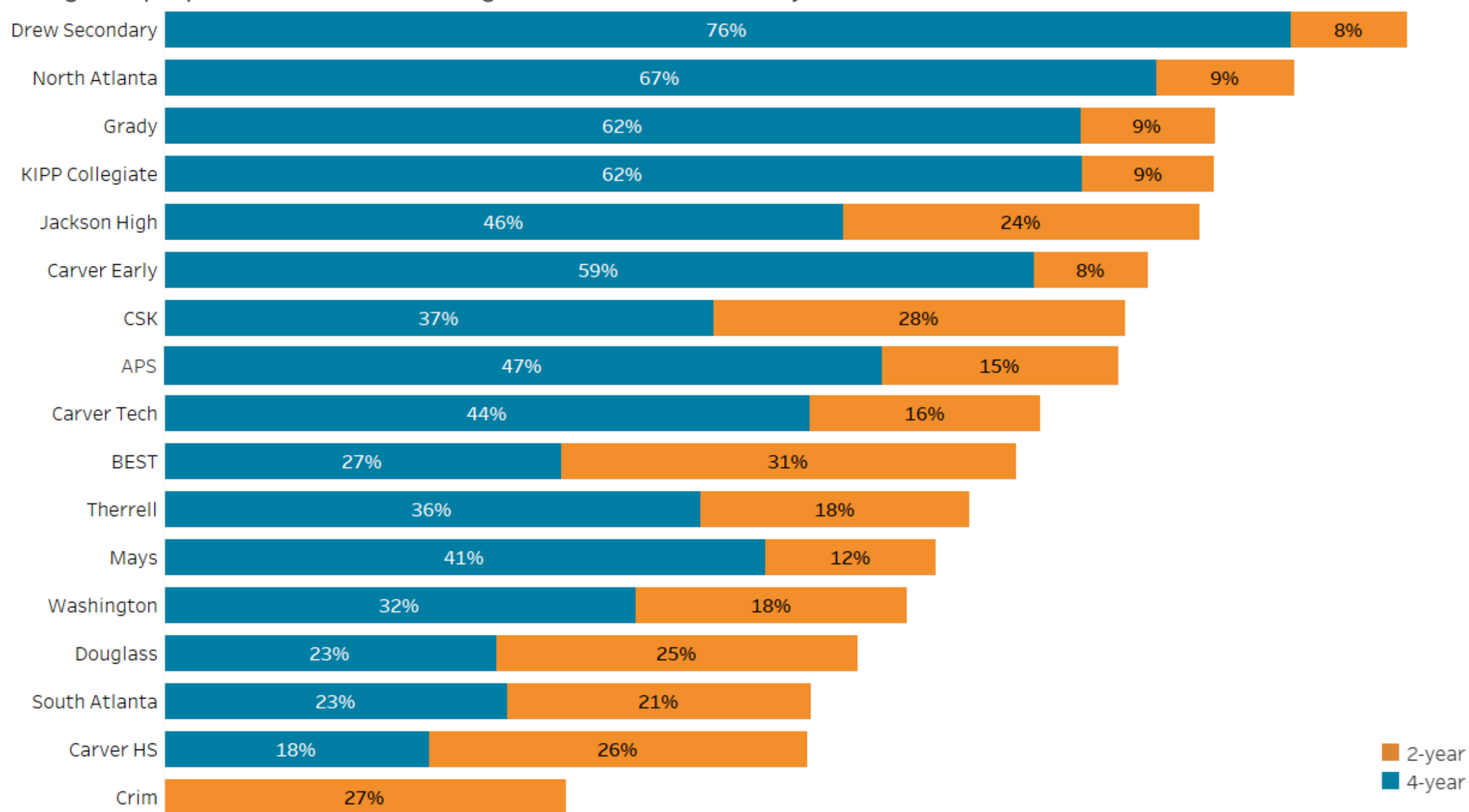
In 2018, there were substantial differences across high schools in seamless college enrollment rates. Drew Secondary had the highest enrollment rate (84%), followed by North Atlanta (77%), Grady (71%), and KIPP Collegiate (71%). South Atlanta (44%), Carver HS (44%), and Crim (27%) had the lowest rates.

The majority of 2018 seamless college enrollees went to four-year colleges

Districtwide, about 15% of cohort 2018 graduates enrolled at institutions that predominantly grant 2-year degrees, compared to 47% at institutions that predominantly grant 4-year degrees. The proportion of graduates enrolling in 2-year institutions varies widely by high school. Drew Secondary, North Atlanta, Grady, KIPP Collegiate, and Carver Early had the highest proportion of cohort 2018 graduates enrolled at 4-year institutions.

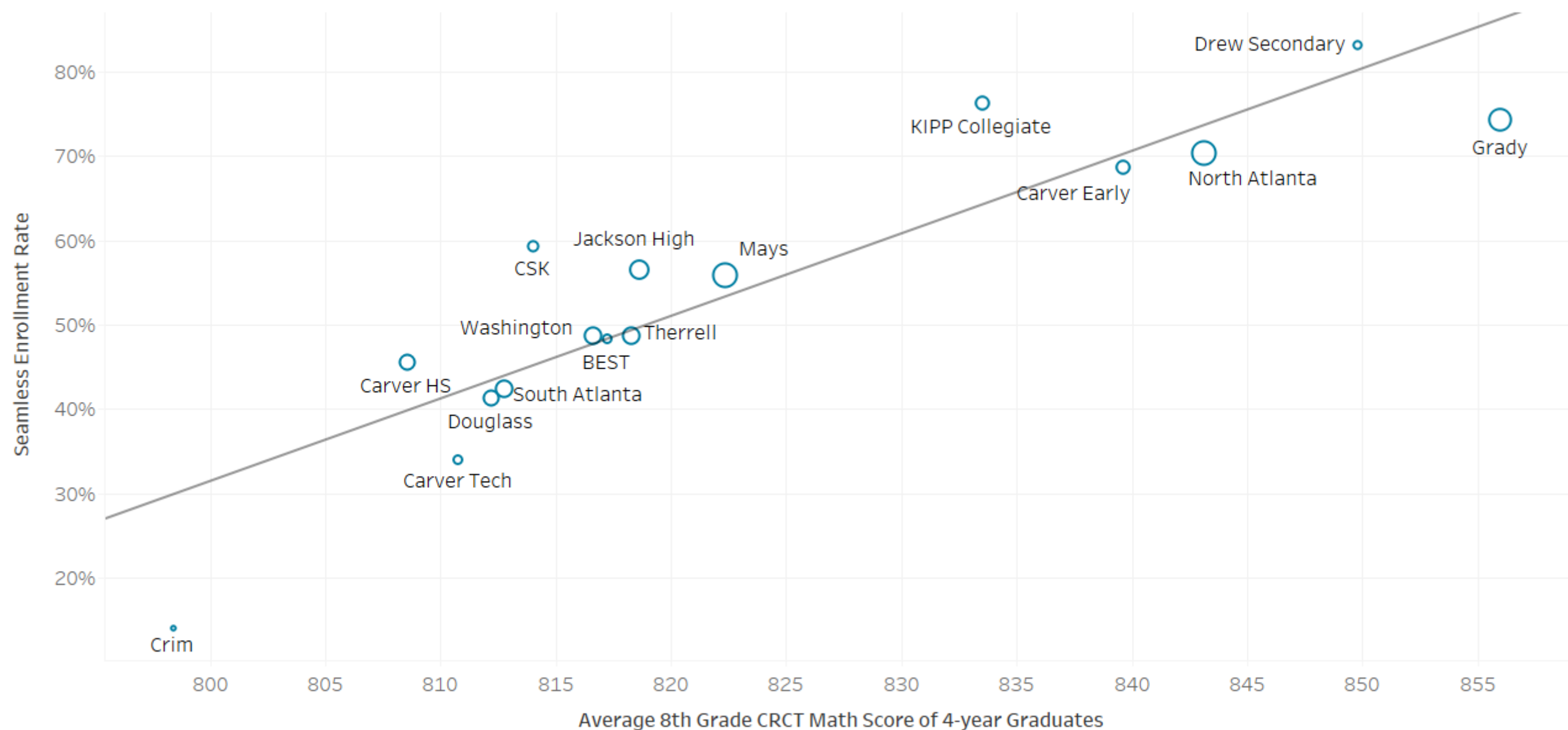


Notes: In 2018, college classification method was updated to use U.S. Department of Education College Scorecard data (predominant degree type). The “2-year” classification includes any institutions that predominantly grant certificates or associate degrees. Previous briefs have used NSC college classification.

High schools receiving students with higher academic achievement have higher seamless college enrollment rates

There is a relationship between 8th grade CRCT performance and seamless college enrollment. KIPP Collegiate, CSK, Jackson, and Carver HS enroll students in college at higher rates than expected based on their 8th grade CRCT scores. Grady, Crim, and Carver Tech enroll students at lower rates than expected.

Seamless Enrollment and 8th Grade CRCT Math Scores, Cohort 2014-2018 Graduates



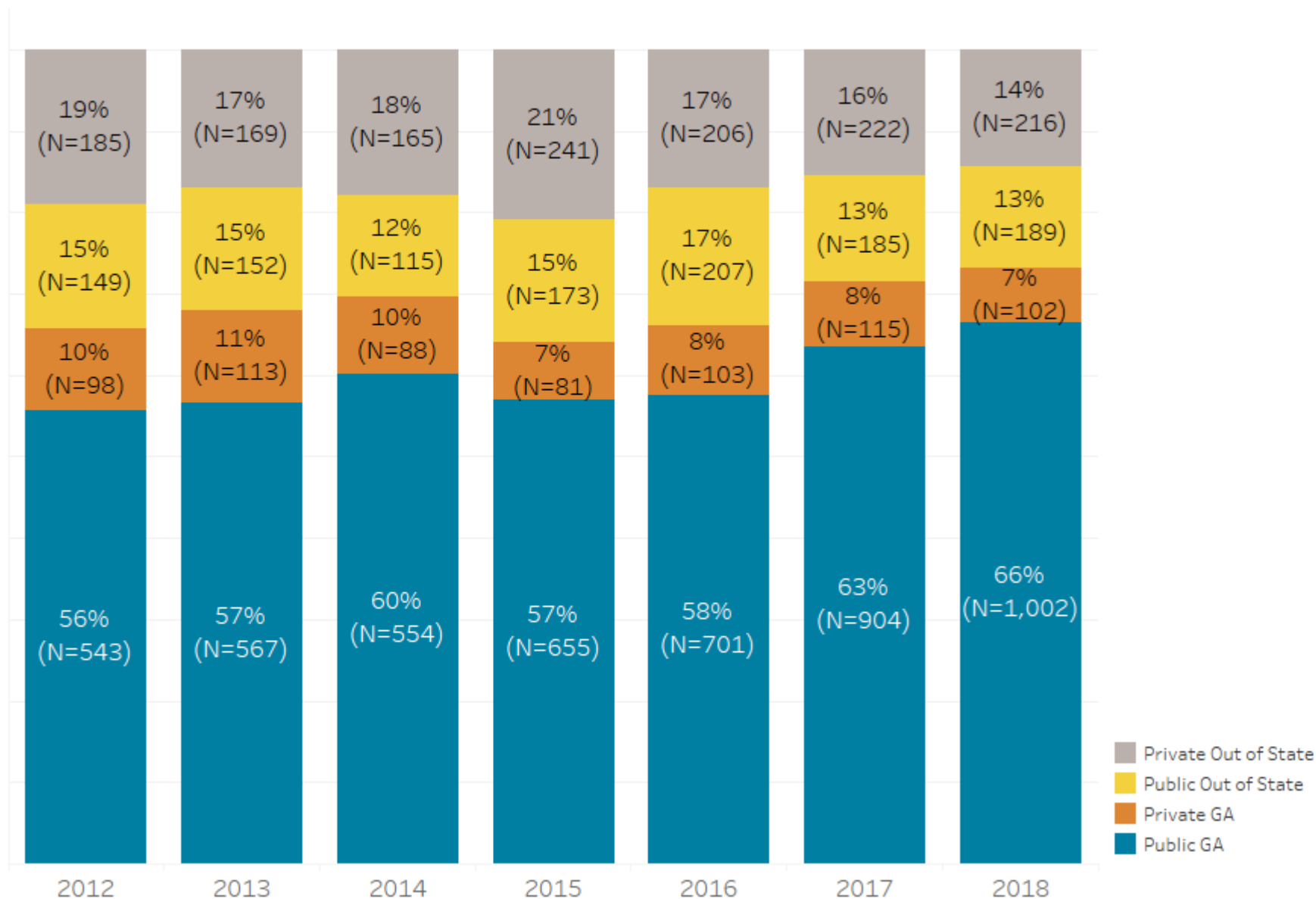

The majority of APS college enrollees attend public institutions within Georgia

Since 2012, more than half of all seamless college enrollees from APS enrolled at in-state public institutions. The percentage of students enrolling at public in-state institutions continues to increase, while the percentages of students enrolling at private institutions both in and out of Georgia decreased slightly. Compared to last year, Atlanta Metropolitan State College surpassed Georgia State as the institution with the greatest number of cohort 2018 attendees.

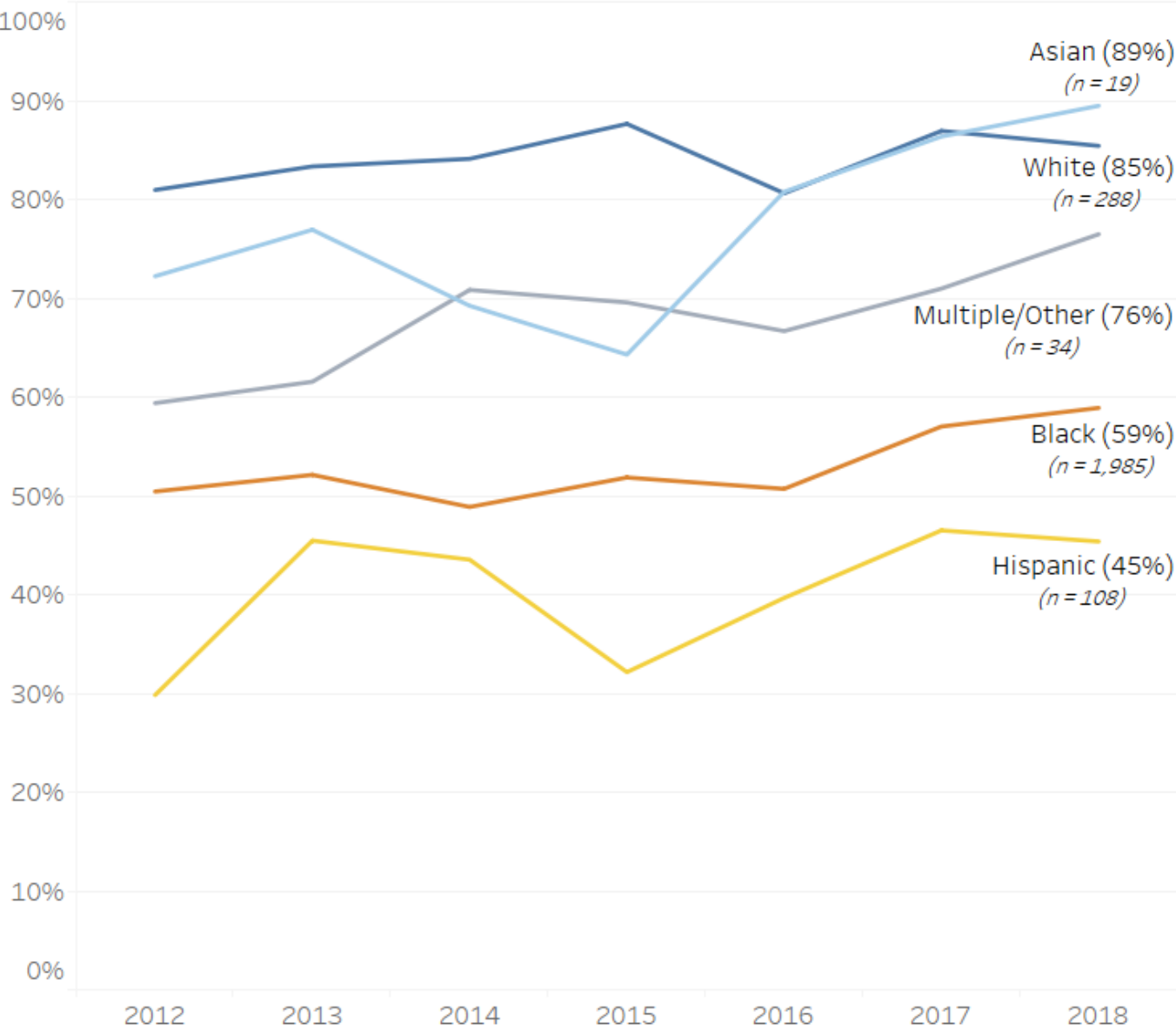

Postsecondary enrollment rates vary across student racial/ethnic groups

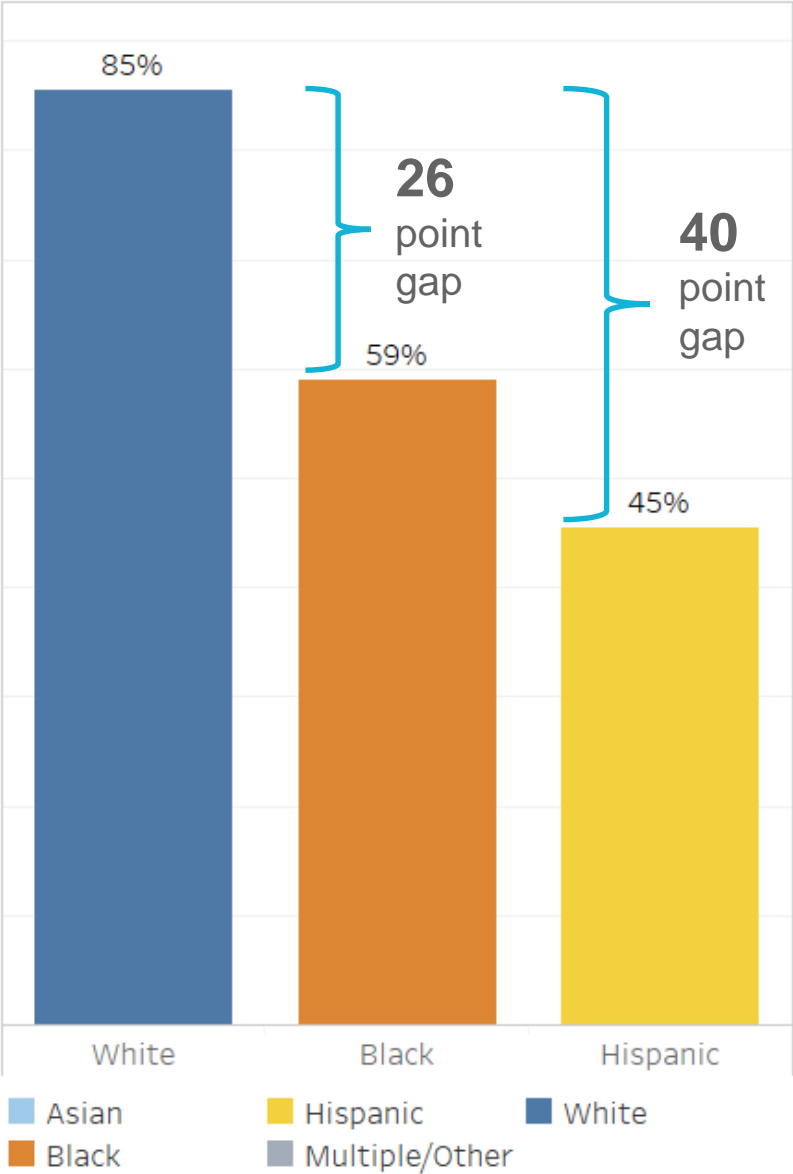
Black, multiracial, and Asian subgroups enrolled in college at higher rates in 2018 than in 2017. The seamless enrollment rate for Hispanic students decreased slightly after large increases from 2015 through 2017.

APS White and Asian students continue to enroll in college at higher rates than Hispanic and Black students. The Black-White enrollment gap decreased from 30 points in 2017 to 26 points in 2018; however, the Hispanic-White gap increased slightly, from 38 points to 40 points.

Enrollment Gap, 2018

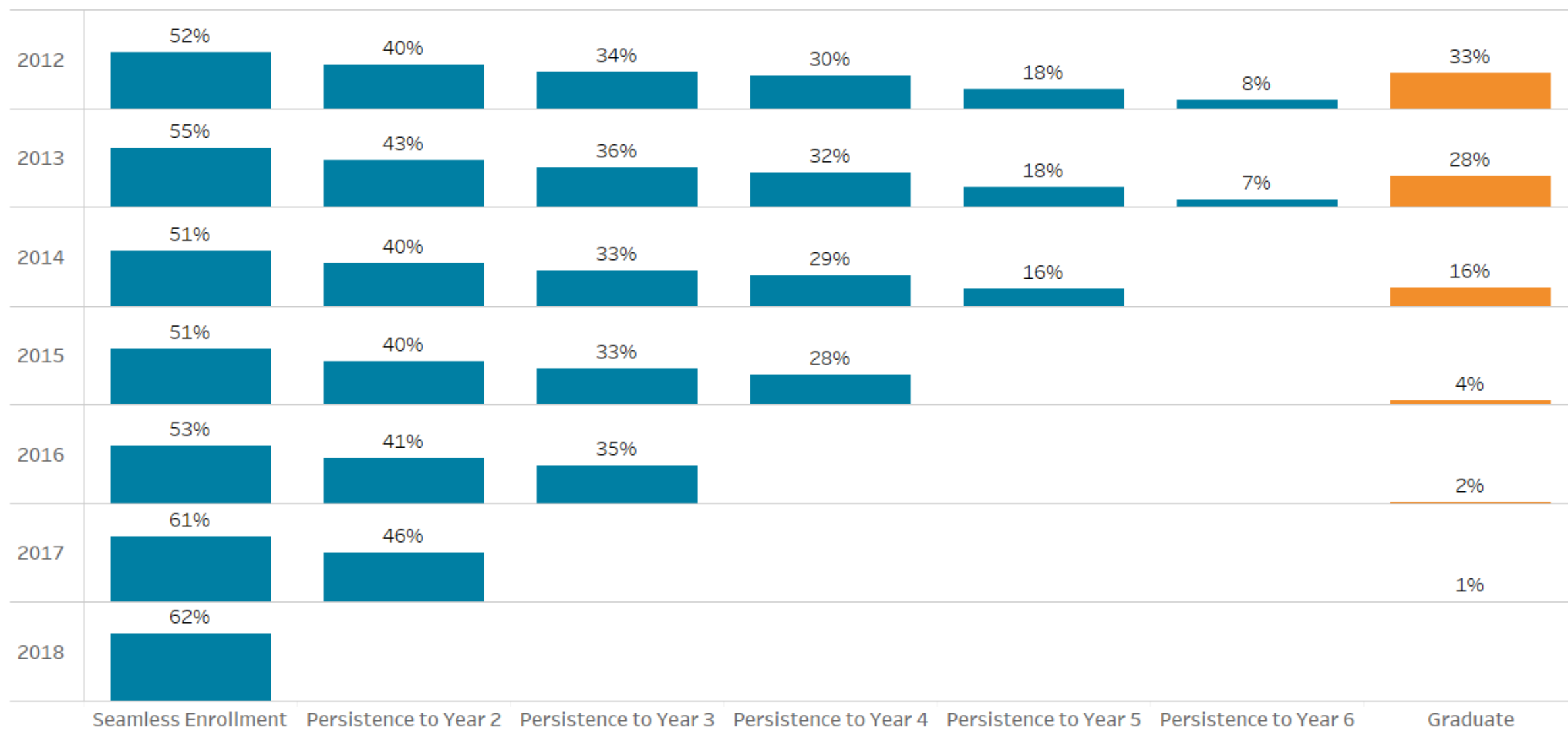


The percentage of APS graduates seamlessly enrolling has continued to increase

The percentage of APS graduates seamlessly enrolling increased slightly from 2017 to 2018. More notable is a 5 percentage point increase from cohort 2016 to cohort 2017 in students who persisted to year 2.

For this analysis, college persistence is defined as remaining enrolled in a post-secondary institution as of October 1 in years following initial enrollment. A student need not remain enrolled in the same institution to count as persisting; however, s/he must remain enrolled continuously (as of October 1 in consecutive years).

Seamless College Enrollment and Persistence of APS On-Time Graduates



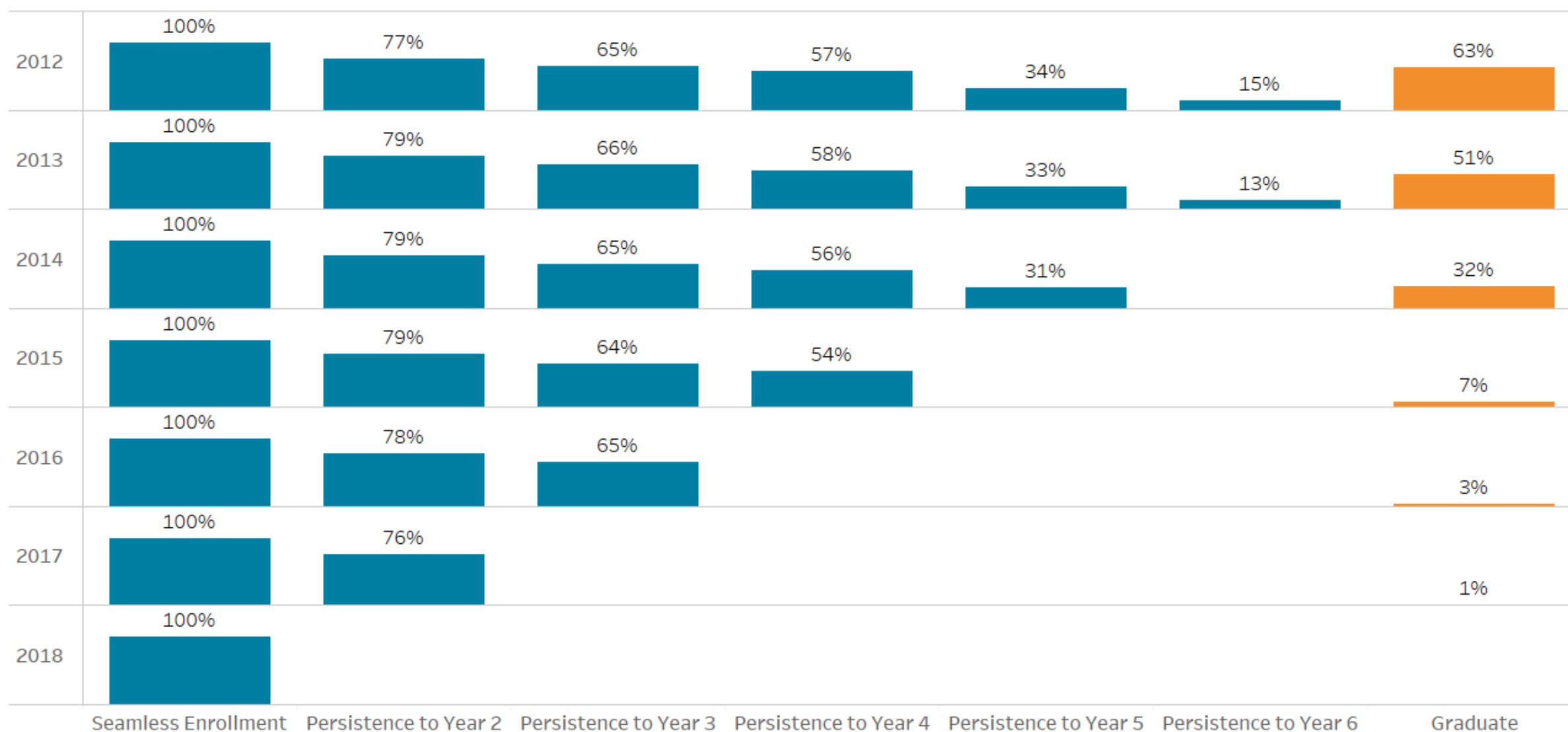

63% of cohort 2012 on-time graduates who seamlessly enrolled earned some kind of degree within 6 years

National measures of persistence and college graduation rates typically consider the percentage of *enrollees* who persist and graduate. Of APS students who seamlessly enroll in college, about three of four persist to year 2, though this percentage has decreased slightly in recent years.

Nationally, the 6-year graduation rate is 59% for 4-year colleges (the 3 year graduation rate for 2-year colleges is 30%). (Source: [NCES](#))

This table shows institutional and APS graduation rates for schools that enrolled at least 15 APS students from cohort 2012 (i.e. students have had 6 years to graduate).

The “Any” rate indicates students who earned a degree / certificate from any institution within 6 years, while the “Same” rate indicates students who earned a degree / certificate from the same institution at which they started (the definition used for the institutional graduation rate). For both APS grad rates, the denominator is number of cohort 2012 seamless enrollees.

APS students who attend postsecondary institutions with low graduation rates may require additional supports to be successful.

Notes:

- Graduation rates come from the Department of Education’s [College Scorecards](#) and are the percent of students who enrolled in the fall as first-time, full-time students and completed within 150 percent of the expected time. To reduce variability from year to year, graduation rates are averaged across years.
- Students who transfer out do count against an institution’s graduation rate.
- * In 2016, Perimeter College merged with GSU, forming GSU Perimeter. APS grad rates for GSU Perimeter represent cohort 2012 students (who attended pre-merger).

Data Sources

National Student Clearinghouse

Postsecondary enrollment rates are calculated using data provided by the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC). NSC is a subscription service used by APS to match graduates with college enrollment records. NSC obtains student data directly from participating college and university registrars typically on a monthly basis. NSC claims that more than 96 percent of all students enrolled in degree granting institutions in the U.S. are attending schools that regularly send their data to NSC. Known postsecondary institutions enrolling APS students that do not participate with NSC include Keiser University-Ft Lauderdale (FL), Toccoa Falls College (GA), and University of Notre Dame (IN). Additionally, the U.S. service academies (Military Academy, Naval Academy, etc.) do not submit data to the NSC.

There are several limitations to matching and reporting of enrollment data which may result in underreporting of college enrollment. Limitations such as name variations, name changes, and FERPA blocks may result in lower levels of matching. According to NSC, Georgia has a [FERPA block rate](#) of about 1.3%.

SAT

APS SAT scores came from district-level score reports received from College Board. Scores are matched back to APS students using name, date of birth, and Social Security number.

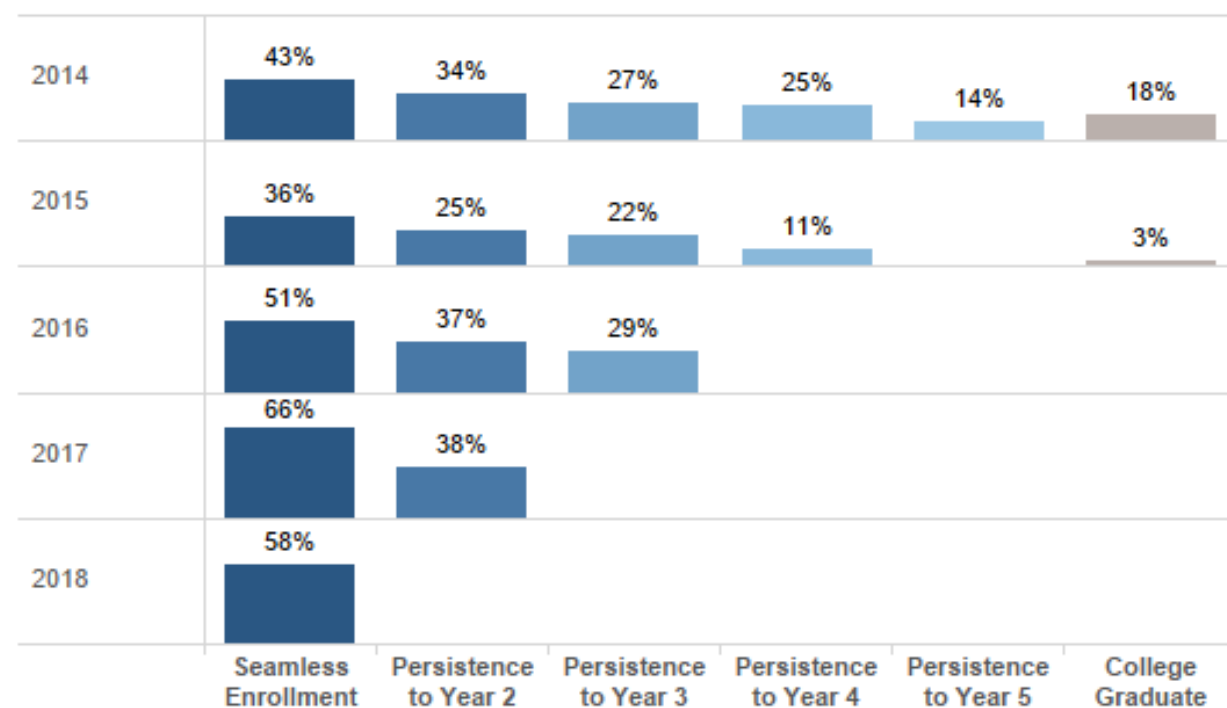

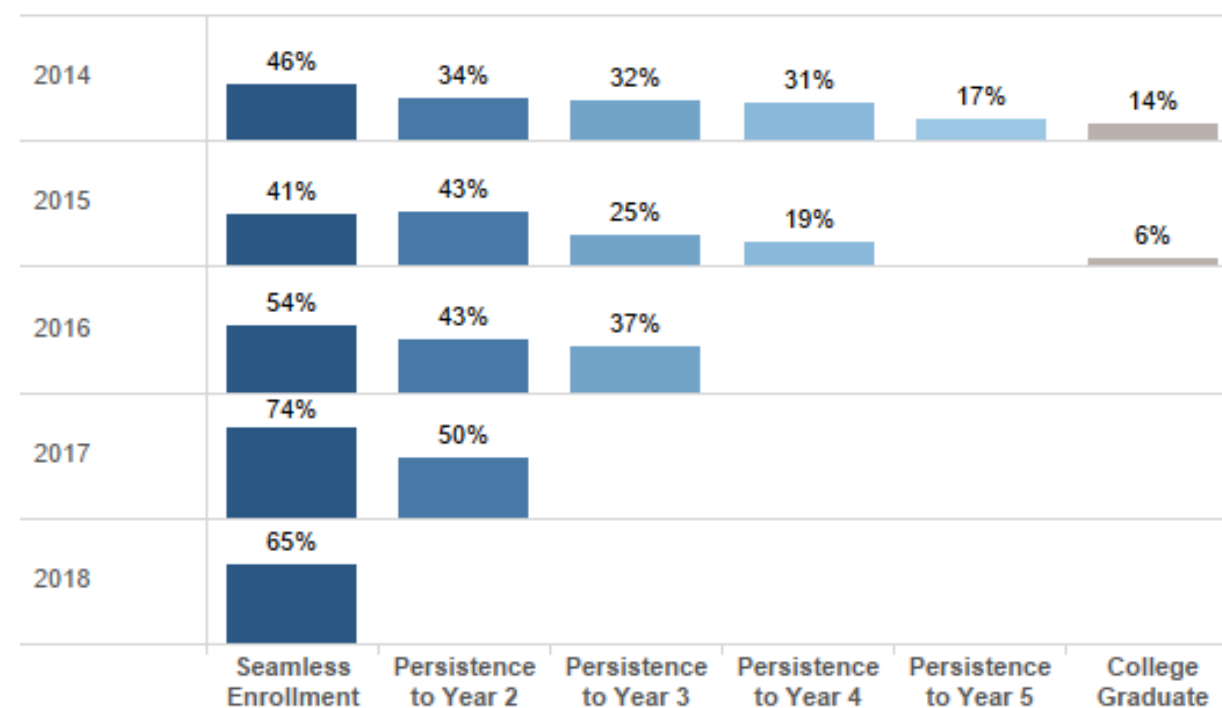

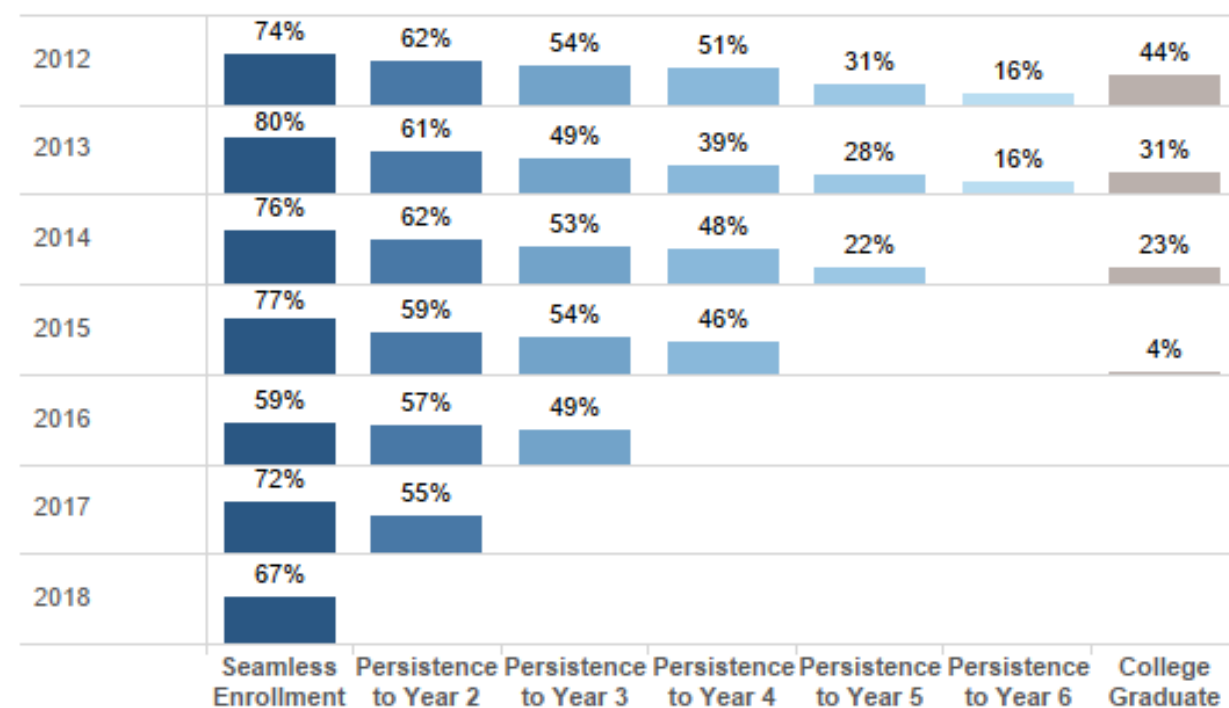

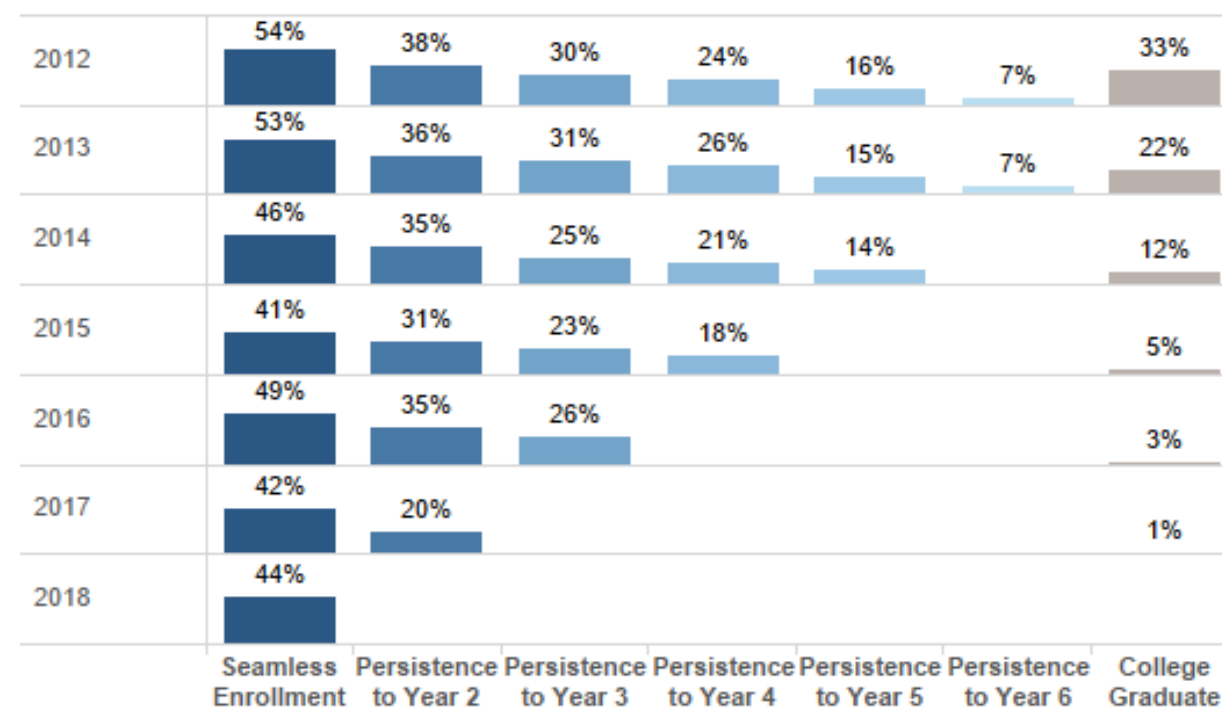

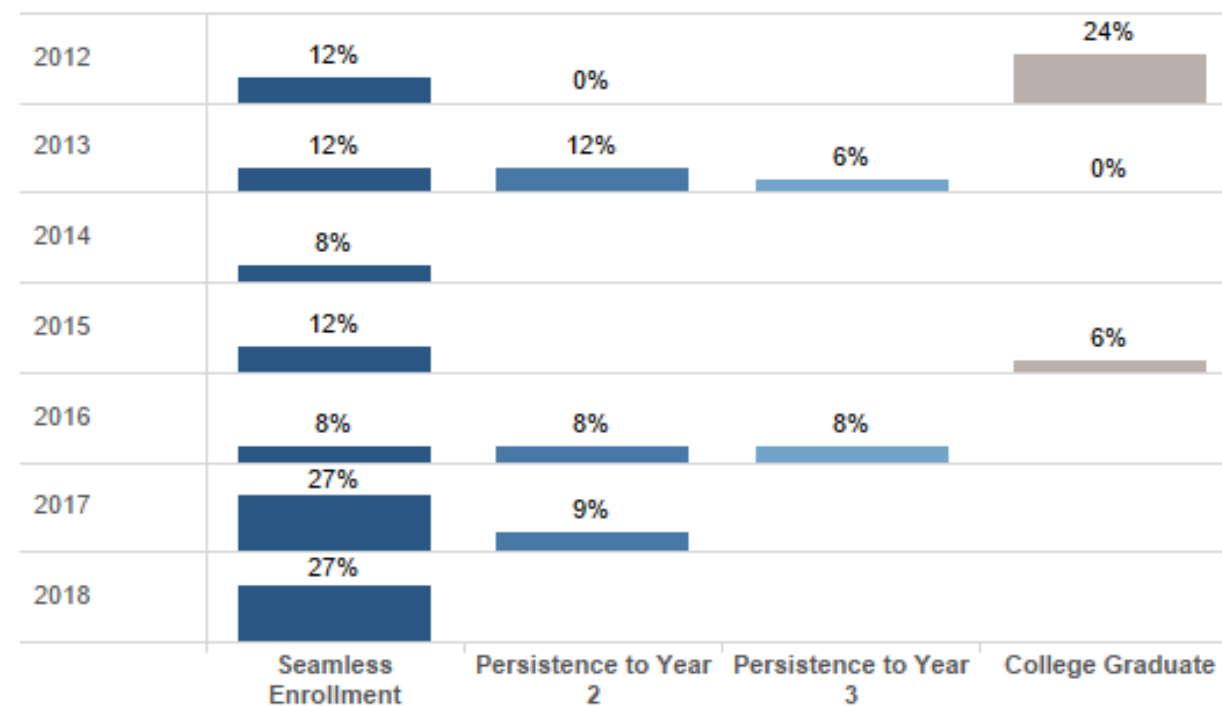

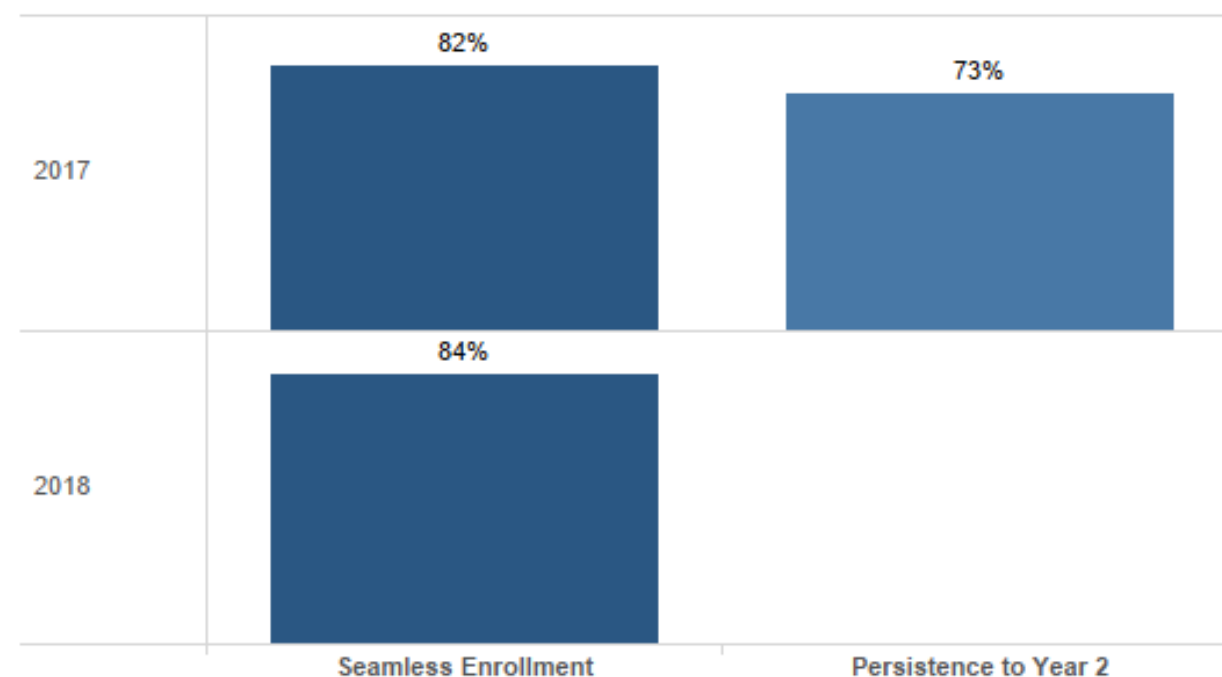

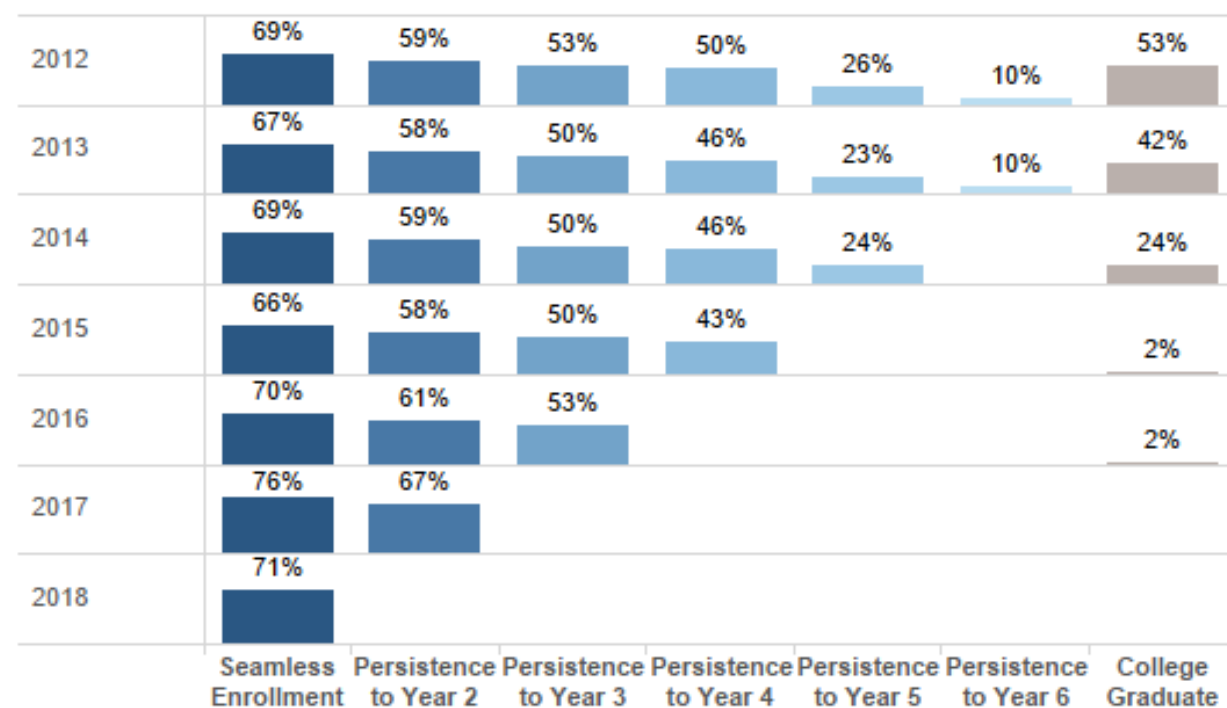

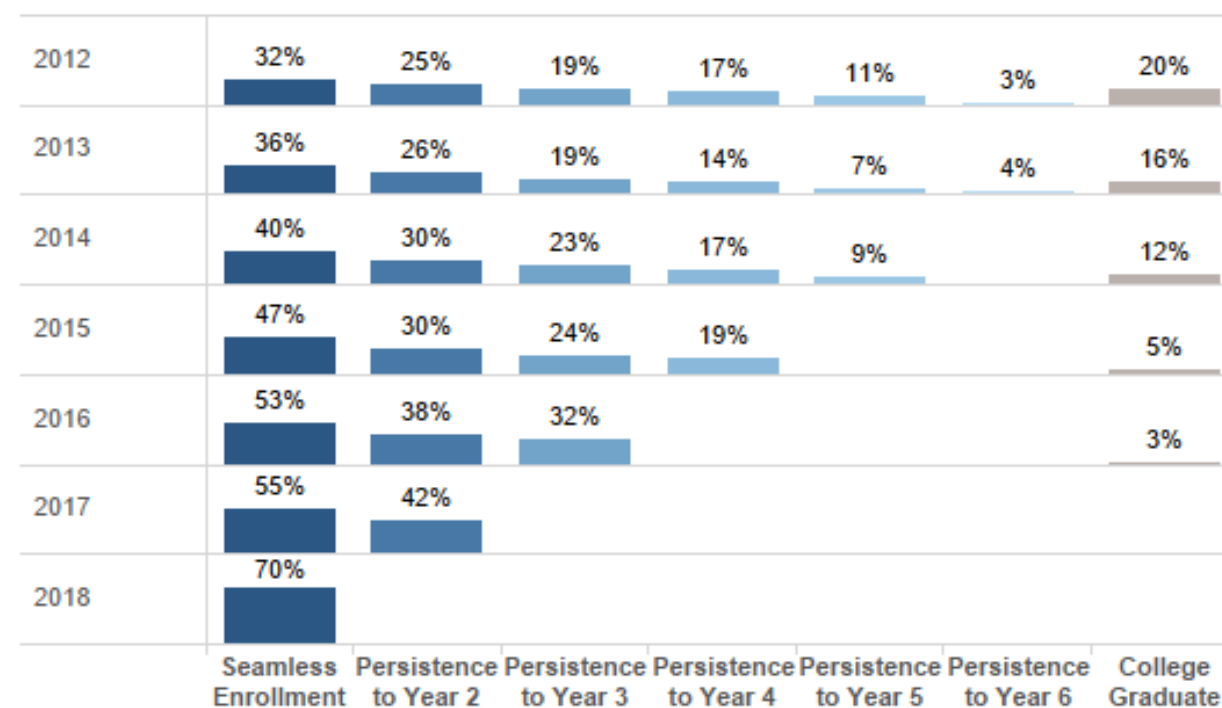

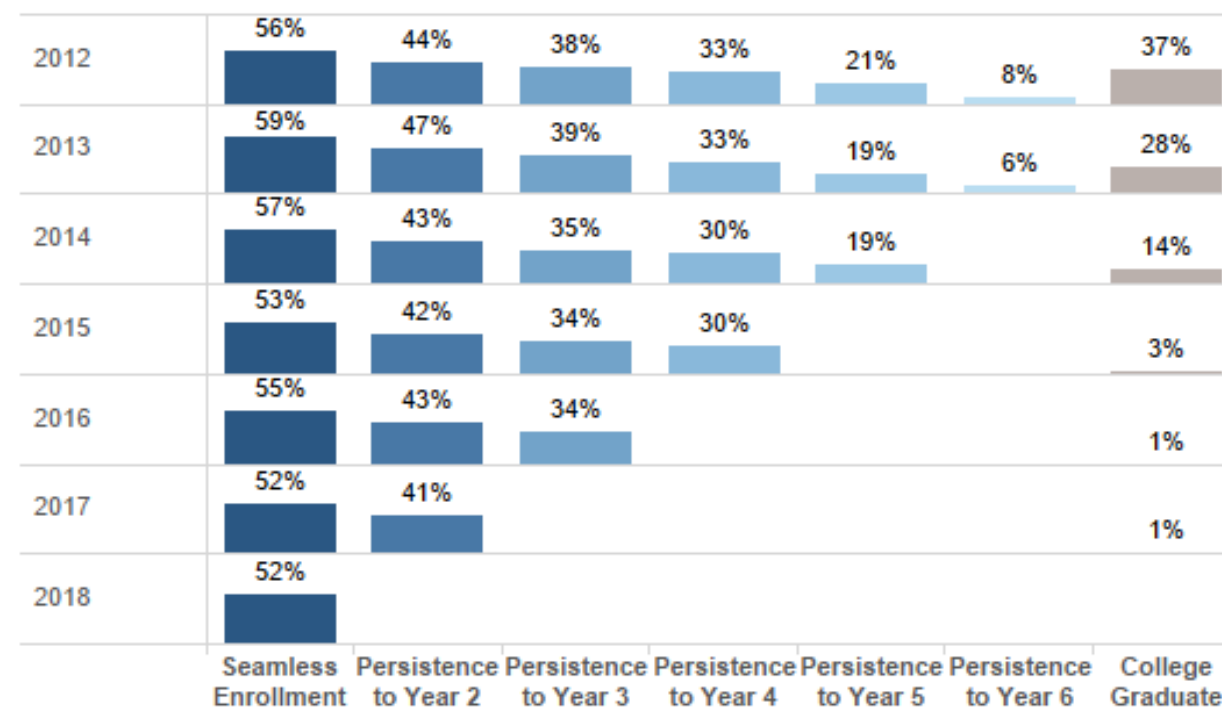

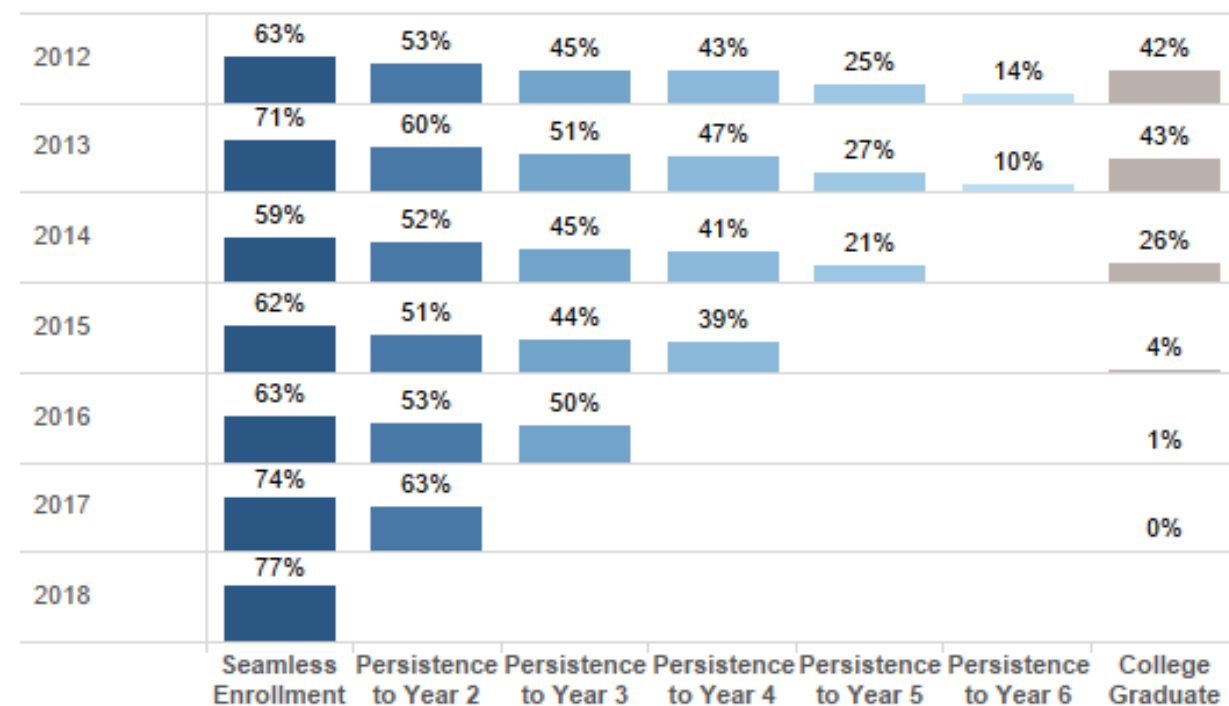

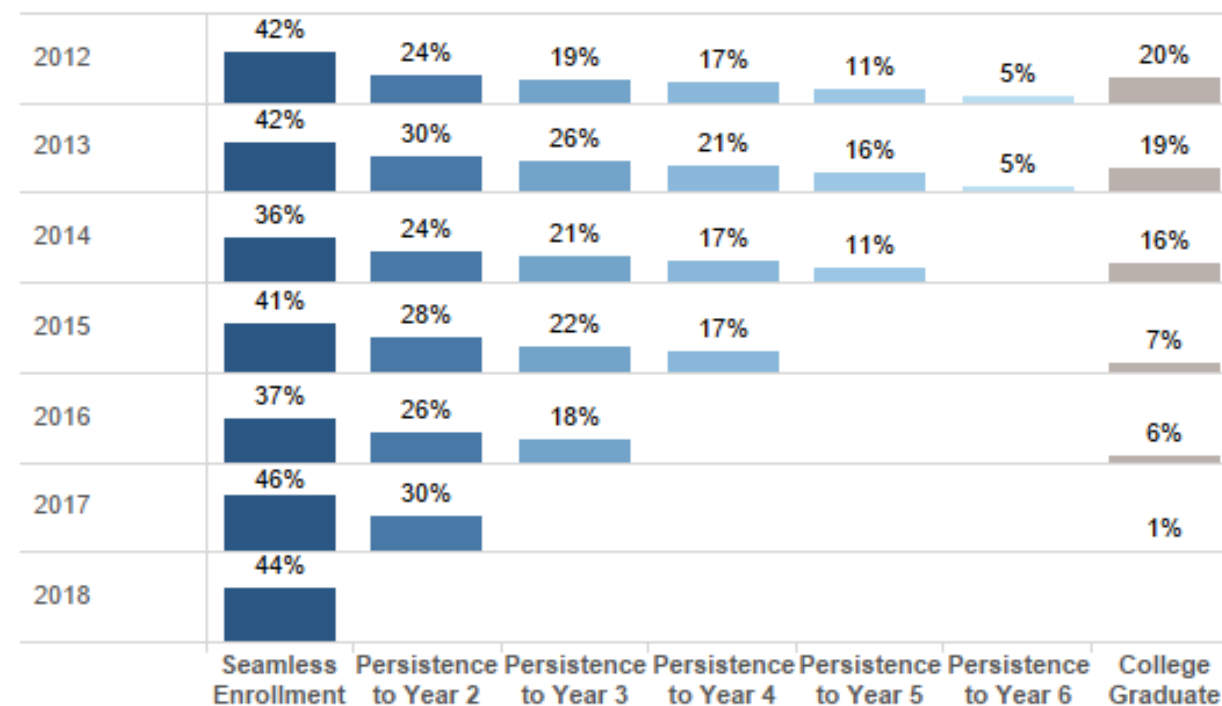

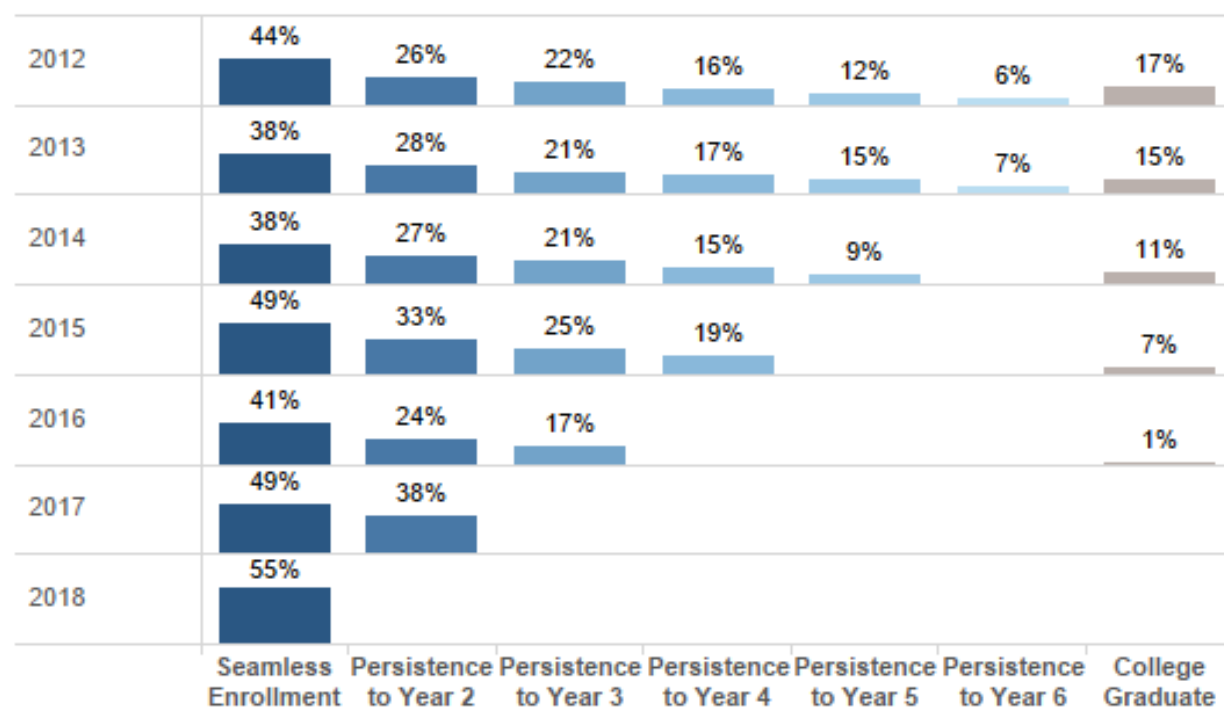

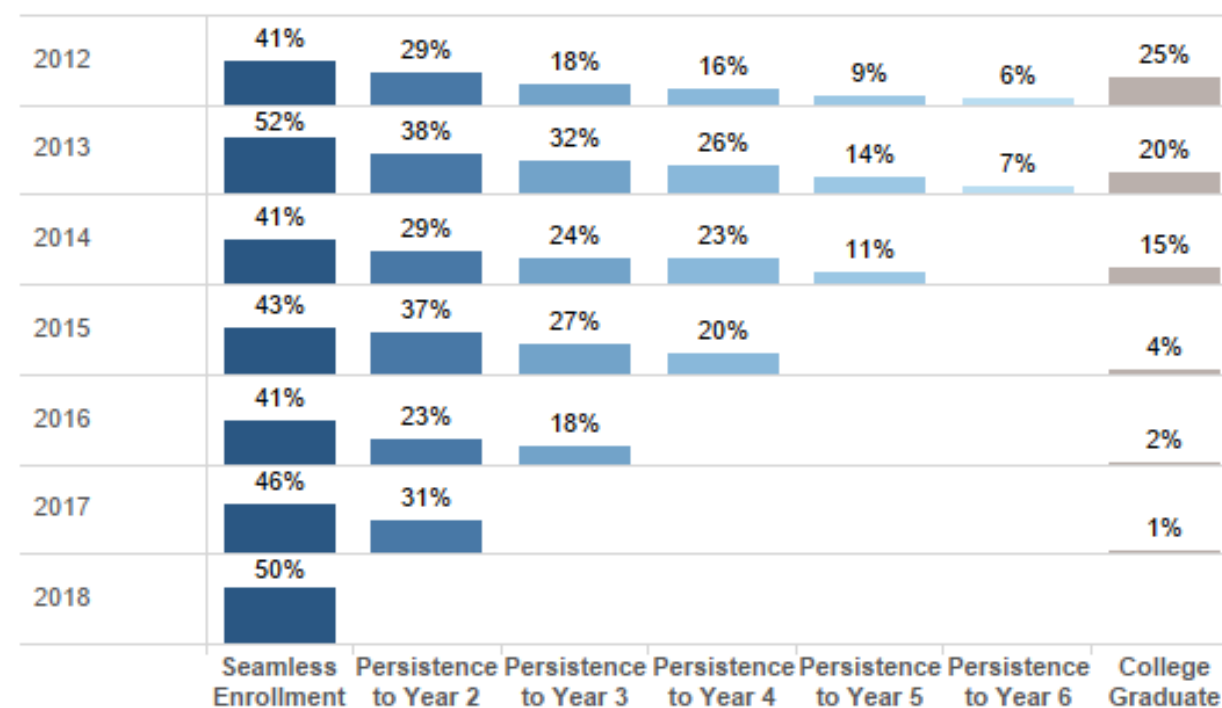
