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
2020 Background Information

In March of 2020, the global COVID-19 pandemic altered life for everyone. As the 2020 cohort graduated during the pandemic, it is important to note that the pandemic may have influenced their postsecondary decisions. It is also important to note that the pandemic may have affected members of earlier cohorts in terms of their ability to complete a postsecondary credential or stay enrolled in a postsecondary institution. This report cannot account for the potential impact of the pandemic on enrollment trends.

Introduction

This report examines college enrollment and persistence of Atlanta Public School (APS) graduates since 2012. It focuses on "seamless enrollment" of each graduating cohort as defined by the Center for Education Policy Research at Harvard University. Seamless enrollment means a student enrolled in a postsecondary institution by October 1st following their high school graduation. Information about National Student Clearinghouse (NSC), the source of the post-secondary enrollment data, can be found at the end of this report.

59% of cohort 2020 **on-time graduates** were enrolled in 2- or 4-year institutions as of October 1, 2020. This is compared to a national 2020 enrollment rate of 56.5% (Source: <u>NSC</u>).




APS Seamless Enrollment by Cohort

2020 postsecondary enrollment rates varied by high school


In 2020, there were substantial differences across high schools in seamless college enrollment rates. Classical had the highest enrollment rate (93%), followed by Grady (78%), Drew Secondary (78%), North Atlanta (73%), and KIPP Collegiate (72%). Douglass (34%), Carver STEAM (30%), and Crim (26%) had the lowest enrollment rates.



Cohort 2020 Seamless Postsecondary Enrollment by High School

The majority of 2020 seamless college enrollees went to four-year colleges

Districtwide, about 9% of cohort 2020 graduates enrolled at institutions that predominantly grant 2-year degrees, compared to 50% enrolling at institutions that predominantly grant 4-year degrees. The proportion of graduates enrolling in 2-year institutions varies widely by high school. Classical, Drew Secondary, Grady, North Atlanta, and KIPP Collegiate had the highest proportion of cohort 2020 graduates enrolled at 4-year institutions. Crim and CSK had the highest proportion of graduates enrolled at 2-year institutions.



Notes: College classification uses U.S. Department of Education College Scorecard data (predominant degree type). The "2-year" classification includes any institutions that predominantly grant certificates or associate degrees.

The majority of APS college enrollees attend public institutions within Georgia

Since 2014, more than half of all seamless college enrollees from APS enrolled at in-state public institutions. The percentage of students enrolling at public out-of-state institutions decreased slightly compared to last year, while the percentages of students enrolling at private in-state institutions increased slightly. More cohort 2020 students attended Georgia State University than any other institution. There were more colleges with ten or more members of cohort 2020 (30 colleges) than there were colleges with ten or more members of cohort 2019 (26 colleges).


APS Enrollment by In/Out of State and Public/Private

Postsecondary enrollment rates vary across student racial/ethnic groups

Hispanic, Asian, and White students enrolled in college at lower rates in 2020 than in 2019. The seamless enrollment rate for Black students increased slightly in relation to 2019. The seamless enrollment rate for students not identifying with the four named racial/ethnic groups (a relatively small group) increased significantly in 2020 in relation to 2019.


White and Asian students in APS continue to enroll in college at higher rates than Hispanic and Black students. In 2020, 85% of White students seamlessly enrolled, 55% of Black students seamlessly enrolled and 43% of Hispanic students seamlessly enrolled.



The percentage of APS graduates seamlessly enrolling increased compared to 2019

The percentage of APS graduates seamlessly enrolling increased slightly from 2019 to 2020. Year 2 persistence rates are higher for cohorts 2017 and 2018 than for other cohorts. Cohort 2014 is the only cohort represented in the graph in which its members have had six complete school years to graduate.

For this analysis, college persistence is defined as remaining enrolled in a post-secondary institution as of October 1 in years following initial enrollment. A student <u>need not</u> remain enrolled in the same institution to count as persisting; however, s/he must remain enrolled continuously (as of October 1 in consecutive years).




Seamless College Enrollment and Persistence of APS On-Time Graduates

63% of cohort 2014 on-time graduates who seamlessly enrolled earned some kind of degree within 6 years

National measures of persistence and college graduation rates typically consider the percentage of *enrollees* who persist and graduate. Of APS students who seamlessly enroll in college, about three out of four persist to year 2. Cohort 2014 is the only cohort represented in the graph in which its members have had six complete school years to graduate.


Nationally, in 2018, the 6-year graduation rate for students earning a degree from the same institution in which they initially enroll is 62% for 4-year colleges (the 3-year graduation rate for 2-year colleges is 33%) (Source: <u>NCES</u>).



Persistence of APS Seamless Enrollees

Approximately one-third of **all on-time APS high school graduates** will earn a postsecondary credential within six years

- Students in the 2012, 2013, and 2014 cohorts have had six complete school years to earn a postsecondary credential.
- This postsecondary credential can come in the form of a certificate, a 2-year degree, or a 4-year degree.
- Of the students who graduated from APS on time, approximately one-third earn a credential within six years (shown below on the left). These students may have not seamlessly enrolled.
- Of the students who seamlessly enroll in a postsecondary institution following an on-time high school graduation (shown below on the right), close to two-thirds will earn a postsecondary credential within six years.

This table shows institutional and APS graduation rates for schools that enrolled at least 15 APS students from cohort 2014 (i.e., students have had 6 years to graduate).

- The "Any" rate indicates students who earned a degree/certificate from any institution within 6 years.
- The "Same" rate indicates students who earned a degree/certificate from the same institution at which they started (the definition used for the institutional graduation rate).
- For both APS graduation rates, the denominator is the number of cohort 2014 seamless enrollees.

APS students who attend postsecondary institutions with low graduation rates may require additional supports to be successful.

Note: Georgia State University – Perimeter is a two-year institution that feeds directly into Georgia State University. The 1% same institution graduation rate for APS graduates is potentially a consequence of students matriculating into Georgia State University.

Notes:

- Institution graduation rates come from the Department of Education's <u>College Scorecards</u> and are the percent of students who enrolled in the fall as first-time, full-time students and completed within 150 percent of the expected time. To reduce variability from year to year, graduation rates are averaged across years.
- Students who transfer out <u>do</u> count against an institution's graduation rate.

In 2016, Perimeter College merged with GSU, forming GSU Perimeter. APS graduation rates for GSU Perimeter represent cohort 2014 students (who attended pre-merger).

Data Sources

National Student Clearinghouse

Postsecondary enrollment rates are calculated using data provided by the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC). NSC is a subscription service used by APS to match graduates with college enrollment records. NSC obtains student data directly from participating college and university registrars typically on a monthly basis. NSC provides information for 99% of all postsecondary students attending U.S. institutions. Postsecondary institutions that do not participate with NSC include four of the U.S. service academies (the United States Naval Academy has been a participant since August 2020).

The national college enrollment rate for 2020 came from NSC.

There are several limitations to matching and reporting of enrollment data which may result in underreporting of college enrollment. Limitations such as name variations, name changes, and FERPA blocks may result in lower levels of matching. According to NSC, Georgia has a <u>FERPA block rate of about 1%</u>.

National Center for Education Statistics

National college enrollment rates for 2018 come from the National Center for Education Statistics.

College Graduation Rates

Institution graduation rates come from the Department of Education's College Scorecards.










