2021 Background Information


In March of 2020, the global COVID-19 pandemic altered life for everyone. As the 2021 cohort graduated during the pandemic, it is important to note that the pandemic may have influenced their postsecondary decisions. It is also important to note that the pandemic may have affected members of earlier cohorts in terms of their ability to complete a postsecondary credential or stay enrolled in a postsecondary institution. This report cannot account for the potential impact of the pandemic on enrollment trends.

Introduction

This report examines college enrollment and persistence of Atlanta Public School (APS) graduates since 2012. It focuses on "seamless enrollment" of each graduating cohort as defined by the Center for Education Policy Research at Harvard University. Seamless enrollment means a student enrolled in a postsecondary institution by October 1st following their high school graduation. Seamless enrollment encompasses both full-time and part-time enrollment. Information about National Student Clearinghouse (NSC), the source of the post-secondary enrollment data, can be found at the end of this report.

55% of cohort 2021 **on-time graduates** were enrolled in 2- or 4-year institutions as of October 1, 2021. This is 6.8 percentage points lower than the 2021 national enrollment rate of 61.8% (Source: BLS).






Note: On-time graduates refers to students who graduate in four years with a regular high school diploma. Enrollment rates for earlier cohorts (before 2021) were not updated.

2021 postsecondary enrollment rates varied by high school


In 2021, there were substantial differences across high schools in seamless college enrollment rates. Classical had the highest enrollment rate (92%), followed by Drew Secondary (75%), Midtown (75%), and North Atlanta (71%). Douglass (23%) and Carver STEAM (27%) had the lowest enrollment rates.





The majority of 2021 seamless college enrollees went to four-year colleges

Districtwide, about 9% of cohort 2021 graduates enrolled at institutions that predominantly grant 2-year degrees, compared to 47% enrolling at institutions that predominantly grant 4-year degrees. The proportion of graduates enrolling in 2-year institutions varies widely by high school. Classical, Drew Secondary, Midtown, and North Atlanta had the highest proportion of cohort 2021 graduates enrolled at 4-year institutions. CSK had the highest proportion of graduates enrolled at 2-year institutions.




Notes: College classification uses U.S. Department of Education College Scorecard data (predominant degree type). The "2-year" classification includes any institutions that predominantly grant certificates or associate degrees. Due to rounding, the two percentages listed for the district and each school might not sum to the percentage listed in the previous slide.

The majority of APS college enrollees attend public institutions within Georgia

Since 2015, more than half of all seamless college enrollees from APS enrolled at in-state public institutions. The percentage of students enrolling at public out-of-state institutions increased slightly compared to last year, while the percentage of students enrolling at private in-state institutions increased slightly. More cohort 2021 students attended Georgia State University than any other institution. There were fewer colleges with ten or more members from cohort 2021 (28 colleges) than there were colleges with ten or more members from cohort 2020 (30 colleges).







Postsecondary enrollment rates vary across student racial/ethnic groups

Asian and Black students enrolled in college at lower rates in 2021 than in 2020. The seamless enrollment rate for White and Hispanic students increased slightly in relation to 2020. The seamless enrollment rate for students not identifying with the four named racial/ethnic groups (a relatively small group) decreased in 2021 in relation to 2020.


White and Asian students in APS continue to enroll in college at higher rates than Hispanic and Black students. In 2021, 87% of White students, 48% of Black students and 51% of Hispanic students seamlessly enrolled.




Postsecondary enrollment rates vary by gender and by gender within racial/ethnic groups

The two graphs show that a higher percentage of Cohort 2021 female students seamlessly enrolled in postsecondary institutions in relation to male students, with 61% of on-time female graduates seamlessly enrolling compared to 49% of on-time male graduates. The gender difference is more pronounced among Black on-time graduates and less pronounced among White on-time graduates.





Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity and Gender, Cohort 2021




The percentage of APS graduates seamlessly enrolling decreased compared to 2020

The percentage of APS graduates seamlessly enrolling decreased slightly from 2020 to 2021. Year 2 persistence rates are higher for cohorts 2017 and 2018 than for other cohorts. Cohort 2015 is the only cohort represented in the graph in which its members have had six complete school years to graduate. In this graph, the percentage of students who persisted in each year and graduated only includes students who seamlessly enrolled. Students may count in both persistence and graduate figures.

For this analysis, college persistence is defined as remaining enrolled in a post-secondary institution as of October 1 in years following initial enrollment. A student need not remain enrolled in the same institution to count as persisting; however, s/he must

remain enrolled continuously (as of October 1 in consecutive years).





48% of cohort 2015 on-time graduates who seamlessly enrolled earned some kind of degree within 6 years

National measures of persistence and college graduation rates typically consider the percentage of *enrollees* who persist and graduate. Of APS students who seamlessly enroll in college, about three out of four persist to year 2. Cohort 2015 is the only cohort represented in the graph in which its members have had six complete school years since high school graduation to earn a postsecondary credential. In this graph, the percentage of students who persisted in each year and graduate only includes students who seamlessly enrolled. Students may count in both persistence and graduate figures.

Nationally, the 6-year graduation rate for students who entered college in the fall of 2015 was 62.2% (Source: Completing College).

This table shows institutional and APS graduation rates for schools that enrolled at least 15 APS ontime graduates from cohort 2015 (i.e., students have had 6 years to graduate).

- The "Any" rate indicates students who earned a degree/certificate from any institution within 6 years.
- The "Same" rate indicates students who earned a degree/certificate from the same institution at which they started (the definition used for the institutional graduation rate).
- For both APS graduation rates, the denominator is the number of cohort 2015 seamless enrollees who were full-time students during their first semester.
- APS students at 2-year colleges were given six years to graduate. For this reason, a direct comparison between APS Grad Rate (Same) and Institution Grad Rate (three years to graduate for 2-year institutions) is ill-advised for 2-year institutions.

APS students who attend postsecondary institutions with low graduation rates may require additional supports to be successful.

Note: Georgia State University – Perimeter is a two-year institution that feeds directly into Georgia State University. The 10% same institution graduation rate for APS graduates is potentially a consequence of students matriculating into Georgia State University.

Note: Atlanta Metropolitan State College offers 4-year degrees.

- Institution graduation rates come from the Department of Education's College Scorecards and are the percent of students who enrolled in the fall as first-time, full-time students and completed within 150 percent of the expected time. To reduce variability from year to year, graduation rates are averaged across years.
- Students who transfer out do count against an institution's graduation rate.
- * In 2016, Perimeter College merged with GSU, forming GSU Perimeter. APS graduation rates for GSU Perimeter represent cohort 2015 students (who attended pre-merger).

Data Sources

National Student Clearinghouse

Postsecondary enrollment rates are calculated using data provided by the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC). NSC is a subscription service used by APS to match graduates with college enrollment records. NSC obtains student data directly from participating college and university registrars typically on a monthly basis. NSC provides information for 99% of all postsecondary students attending U.S. institutions. Postsecondary institutions that do not participate with NSC include four of the U.S. service academies (the United States Naval Academy has been a participant since August 2020).

There are several limitations to matching and reporting of enrollment data which may result in underreporting of college enrollment. Limitations such as name variations, name changes, and FERPA blocks may result in lower levels of matching. According to NSC, Georgia has a <u>FERPA block rate</u> of approximately 1%.

U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics

The national college enrollment rate for Fall 2021 come from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

College Graduation Rates

Institution graduation rates come from the Department of Education's <u>College Scorecards</u>. National college graduation rates come from the NSC's <u>Completing College National and State Reports</u>.

Postsecondary Graduates Update

During the 2021 postsecondary analysis, a variable that specifically identified college graduates who were also seamless enrollees was added. This variable distinguished this group of college graduates from the group that includes both seamless enrollees and non-seamless enrollees. The inclusion of this variable enabled the Research and Evaluation Team to focus its analysis on the intended target population: on-time high school graduates who seamlessly enroll in postsecondary institutions.

Previous postsecondary analyses did not make the seamless enrollment distinction among college graduates. This has the following implications for the pre-2021 College Enrollment Trends briefs:

- The *graduate column* in the **Seamless College Enrollment and Persistence of APS On-Time Graduates** graph includes both seamless enrollees and non-seamless enrollees.
- The *graduate column* in the **Persistence of APS Seamless Enrollees** graph includes both seamless enrollees and non-seamless enrollees.
- The **College Graduation Rates for APS Seamless Enrollees** graph in the 2020 brief includes seamless and non-seamless enrollees.
- The table matching the **Graduation Rate by First Institution** table on slide 11 in this brief includes both seamless and non-seamless APS enrollees in both the denominator and the numerator.
- The graduate column in the **School Summaries** graphs includes both seamless and non-seamless enrollees.

Previous postsecondary analyses did not make a full-time enrollment status distinction among postsecondary enrollees. This has the following implications for the pre-2021 College Enrollment Trends briefs:

The APS Cohort 2015 Students, APS Grad Rate (Any) and APS Grad Rate (Same) columns within the table matching the **Graduation Rate by First Institution** table on slide 11 in this brief do not exclude APS students who were not enrolled as full-time students in their first semester.




