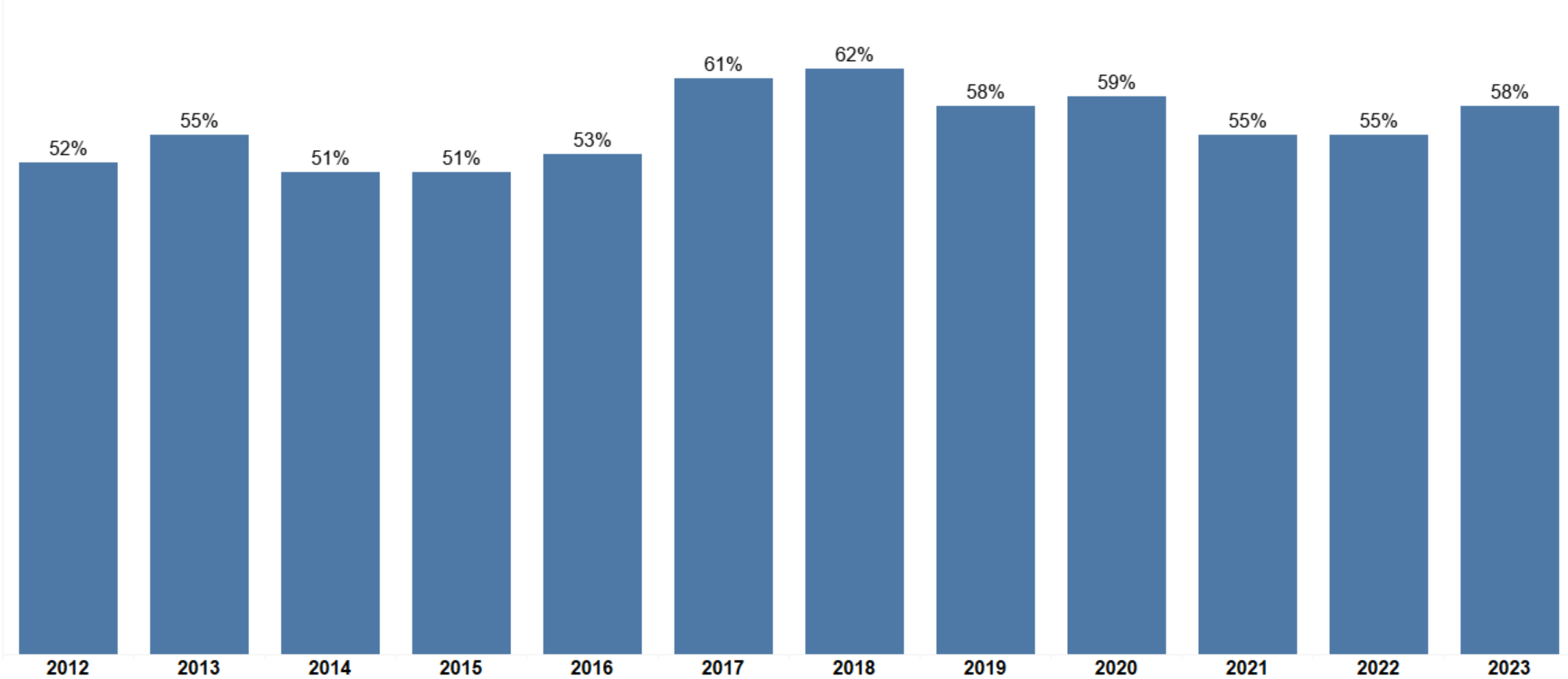

Introduction

This report examines college enrollment and persistence of Atlanta Public School (APS) graduates since 2012. It focuses on "seamless enrollment" of each graduating cohort as defined by the Center for Education Policy Research at Harvard University. Seamless enrollment means a student enrolled in a postsecondary institution by October 1st following their high school graduation. Enrolled students who disenroll before October 1st are not counted as seamless enrollees. Seamless enrollment encompasses both full-time and part-time enrollment. Information about National Student Clearinghouse (NSC), the source of the postsecondary enrollment data, can be found at the end of this report. Fifty-eight percent of cohort 2023 on-time graduates were enrolled in 2- or 4-year institutions as of October 1, 2023.

Atlanta Public Schools Seamless Enrollment among On-Time High School Graduates by Cohort

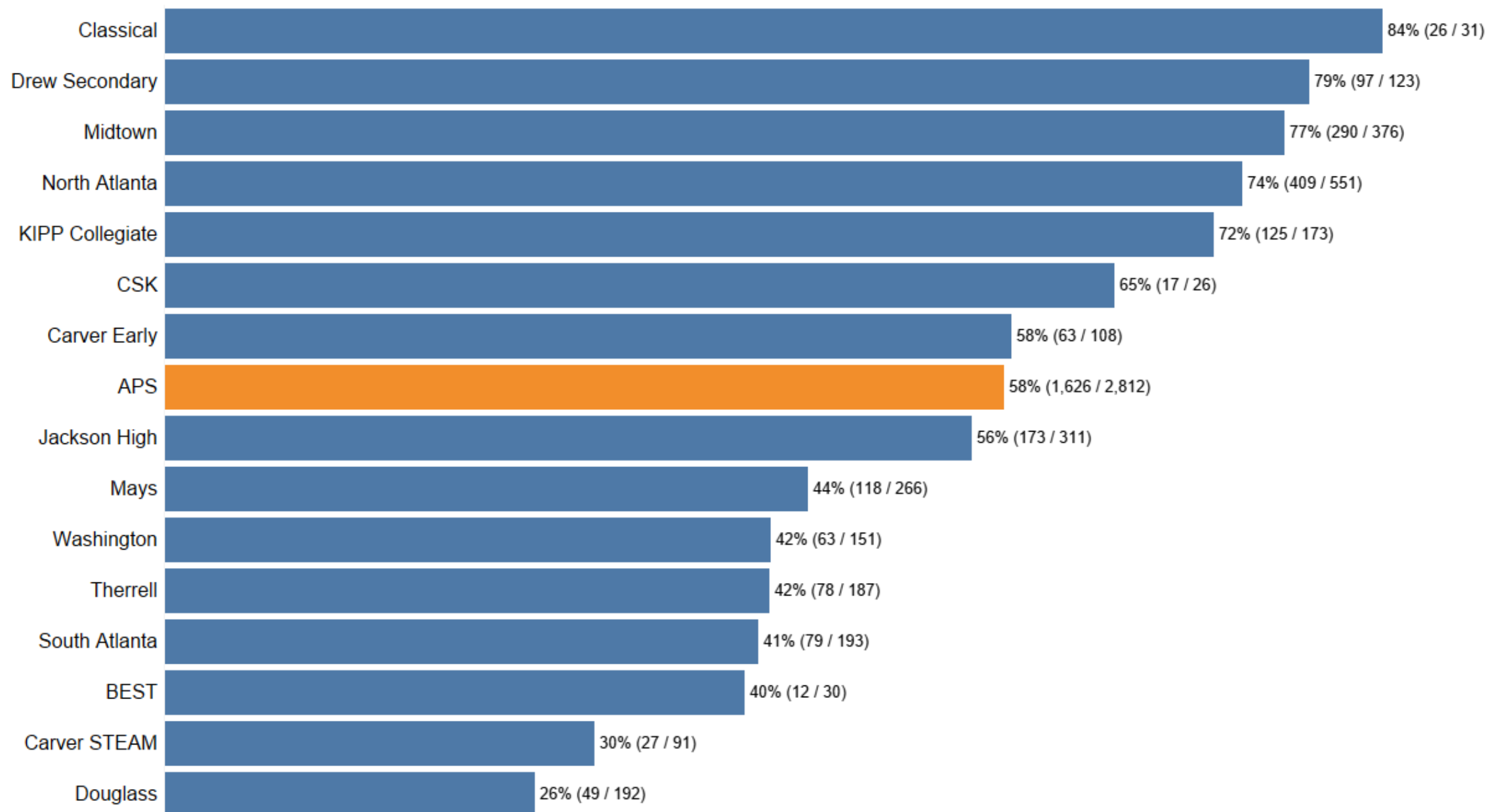


Note. On-time graduates refers to students who graduate in four years with a regular high school diploma as reported by the Georgia Department of Education. Seamless enrollment rates for cohorts prior to 2023 were not updated in this graph and use the rate from the initial calculation; for example, the seamless enrollment rate for cohort 2022 was 55% when initially calculated in 2023.. All subsequent analyses were conducted using the cohort 2023 data file. Percentages were rounded to the nearest whole number.

2023 postsecondary enrollment rates varied by high school

In 2023, there were substantial differences across high schools in seamless postsecondary enrollment rates. Classical had the highest seamless enrollment rate (86%), followed by Drew Secondary (79%), and Midtown (77%). Douglass (26%), Carver STEAM (30%), and BEST (40%) had the lowest seamless enrollment rates.

Seamless Enrollment by High School, Cohort 2023

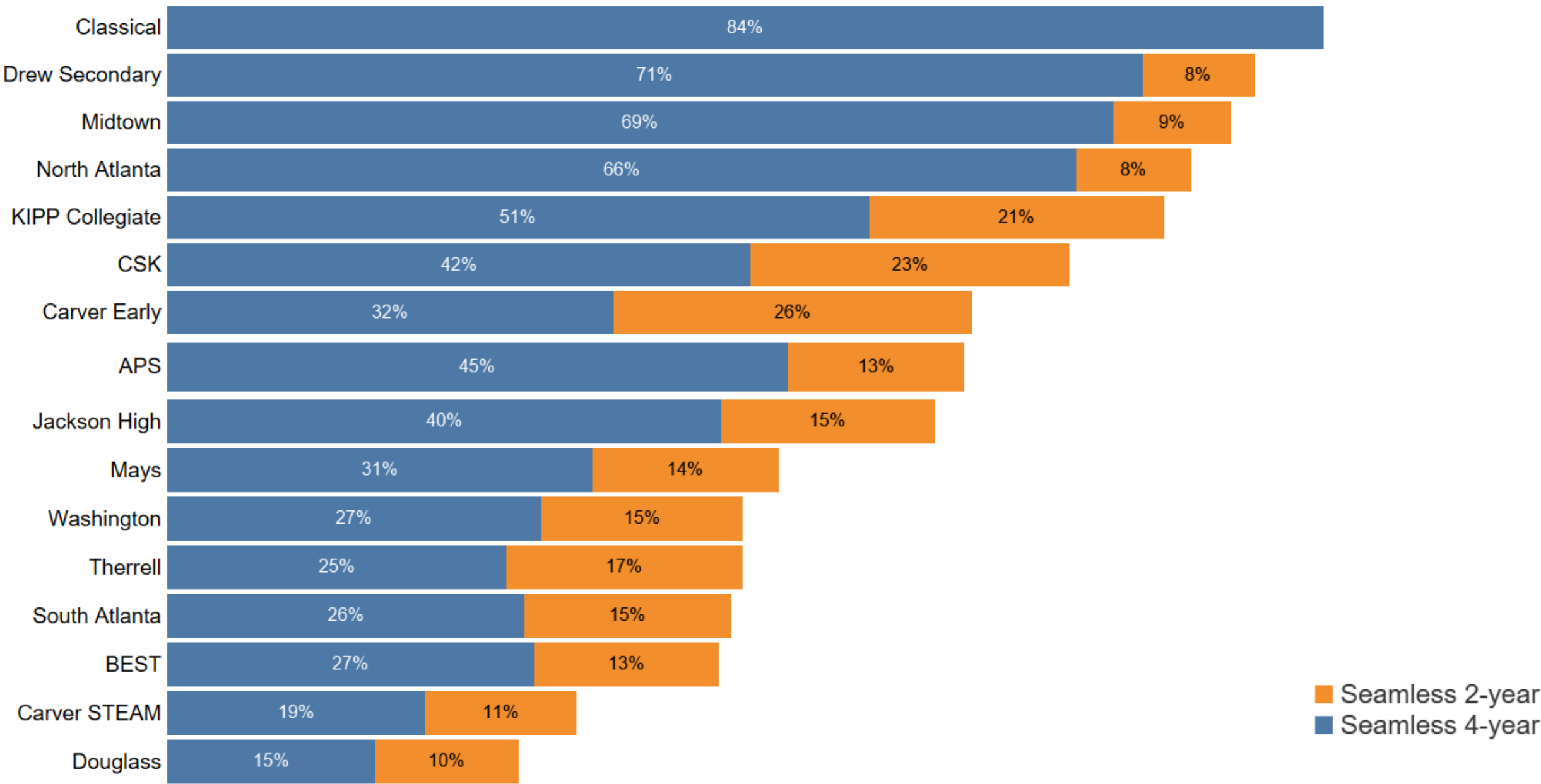

The majority of 2023 seamless college enrollees went to four-year colleges

Districtwide, about 13% of cohort 2023 graduates enrolled at institutions that predominantly grant 2-year degrees, compared to 45% enrolling at institutions that predominantly grant 4-year degrees. The proportion of graduates enrolling in 2-year institutions varies widely by high school. Classical had the highest proportion of its cohort 2023 on-time graduates that seamlessly enrolled in 4-year institutions. Carver Early College had the highest proportion of its on-time graduates that seamlessly enrolled in 2-year institutions.

Seamless Enrollment by High School and Institution Type, Cohort 2023

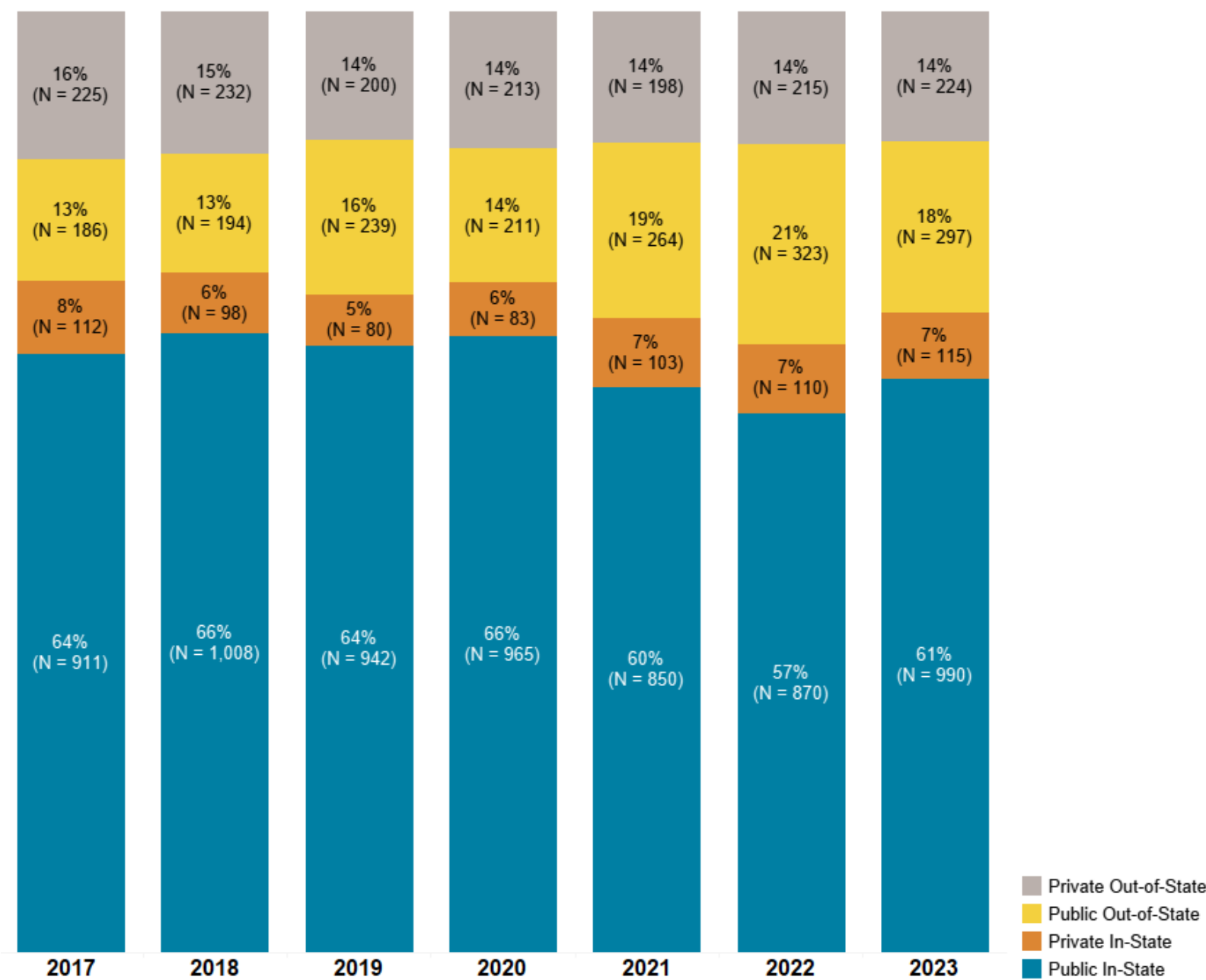

The majority of APS seamless college enrollees attend public institutions within Georgia

Since 2017, more than half of all seamless college enrollees from APS enrolled within in-state public institutions. The percentage of students enrolling at public out-of-state institutions decreased slightly compared to last year, while the percentage of students enrolling at public in-state institutions increased. More cohort 2023 students attended Georgia State University than any other institution.

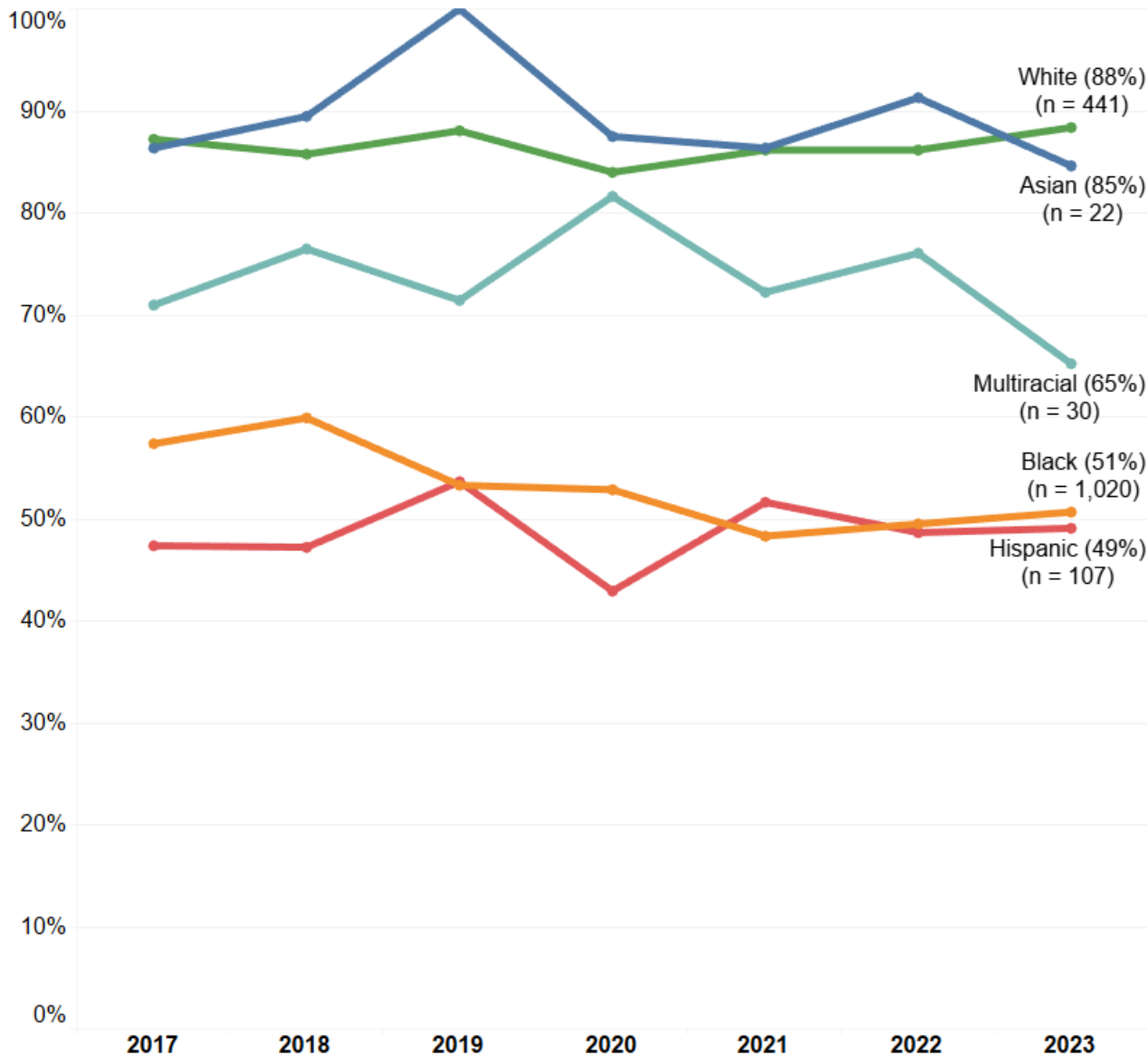

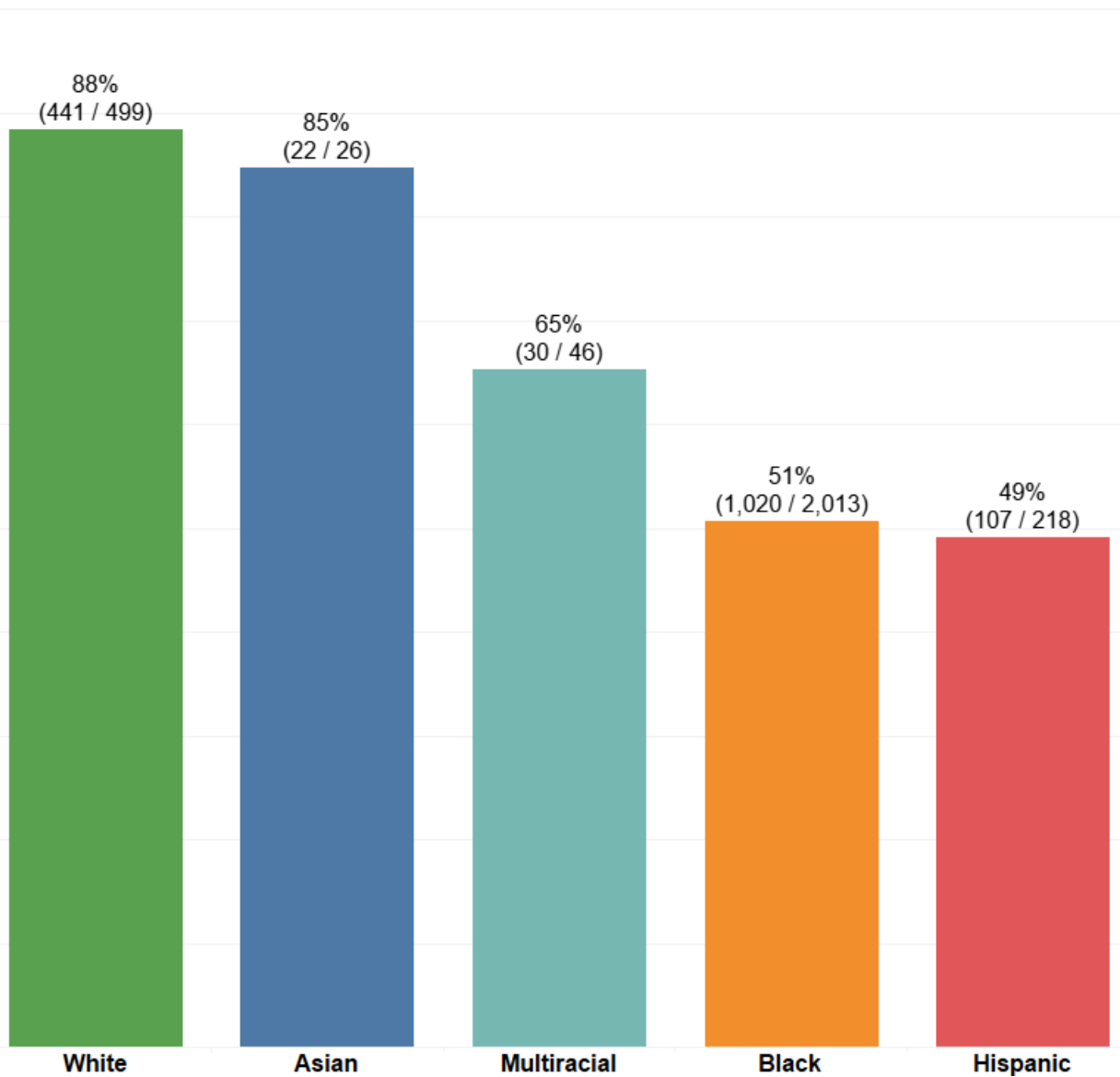
Postsecondary enrollment rates vary across student racial/ethnic groups

From SY2017 to SY2023, Black, White, Asian, Hispanic, and Multiple/Other on-time graduates seamlessly enrolled in postsecondary institutions at different rates. Asian and Multiple/Other students seamlessly enrolled at lower rates in 2023 than in 2022. The seamless enrollment rate for White and Black students increased slightly in relation to 2022. The seamless enrollment rate for Hispanic students remained essentially constant from 2022 to 2023.

Seamless Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

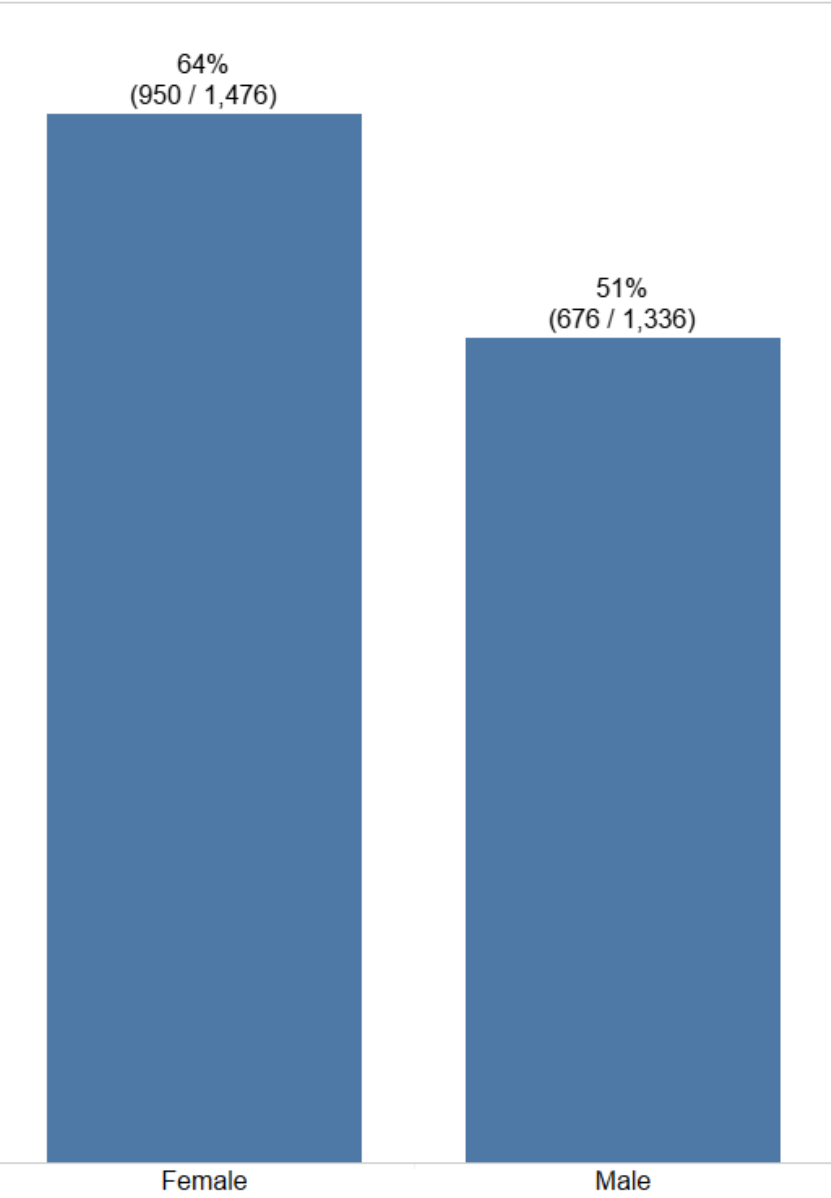

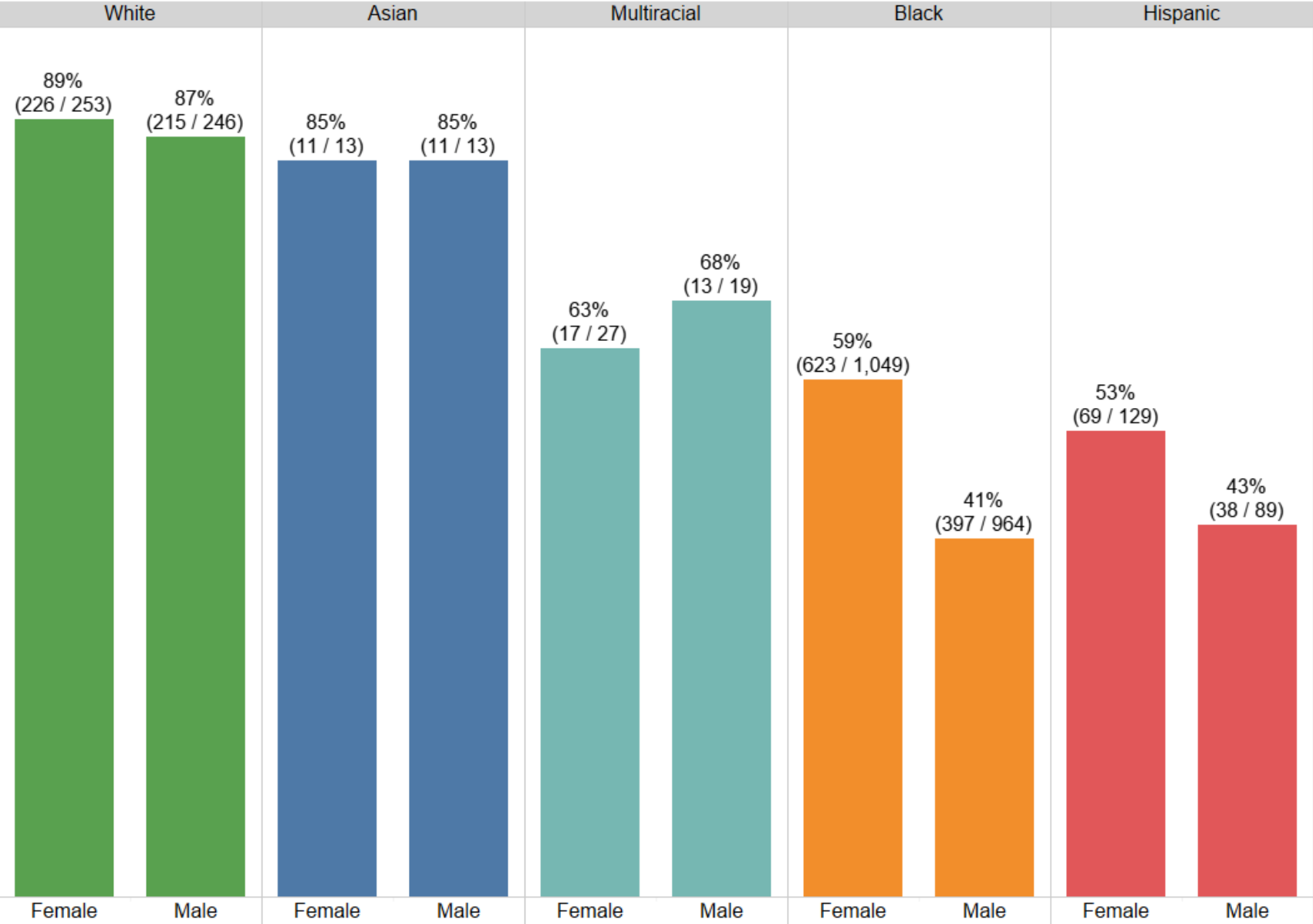
Postsecondary enrollment rates vary by gender overall and within racial/ethnic groups

The left graph shows that a higher percentage of female Cohort 2023 students seamlessly enrolled in postsecondary institutions than male students, with 64% of on-time female graduates seamlessly enrolling compared to 51% of on-time male graduates. This gender difference is greater among Black and Hispanic on-time graduates, and equal among Asian and Multiple/Other on-time graduates. A slightly higher percentage of White female on-time graduates seamlessly enrolled compared to White male on-time graduates.

Seamless Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity and Gender, Cohort 2023

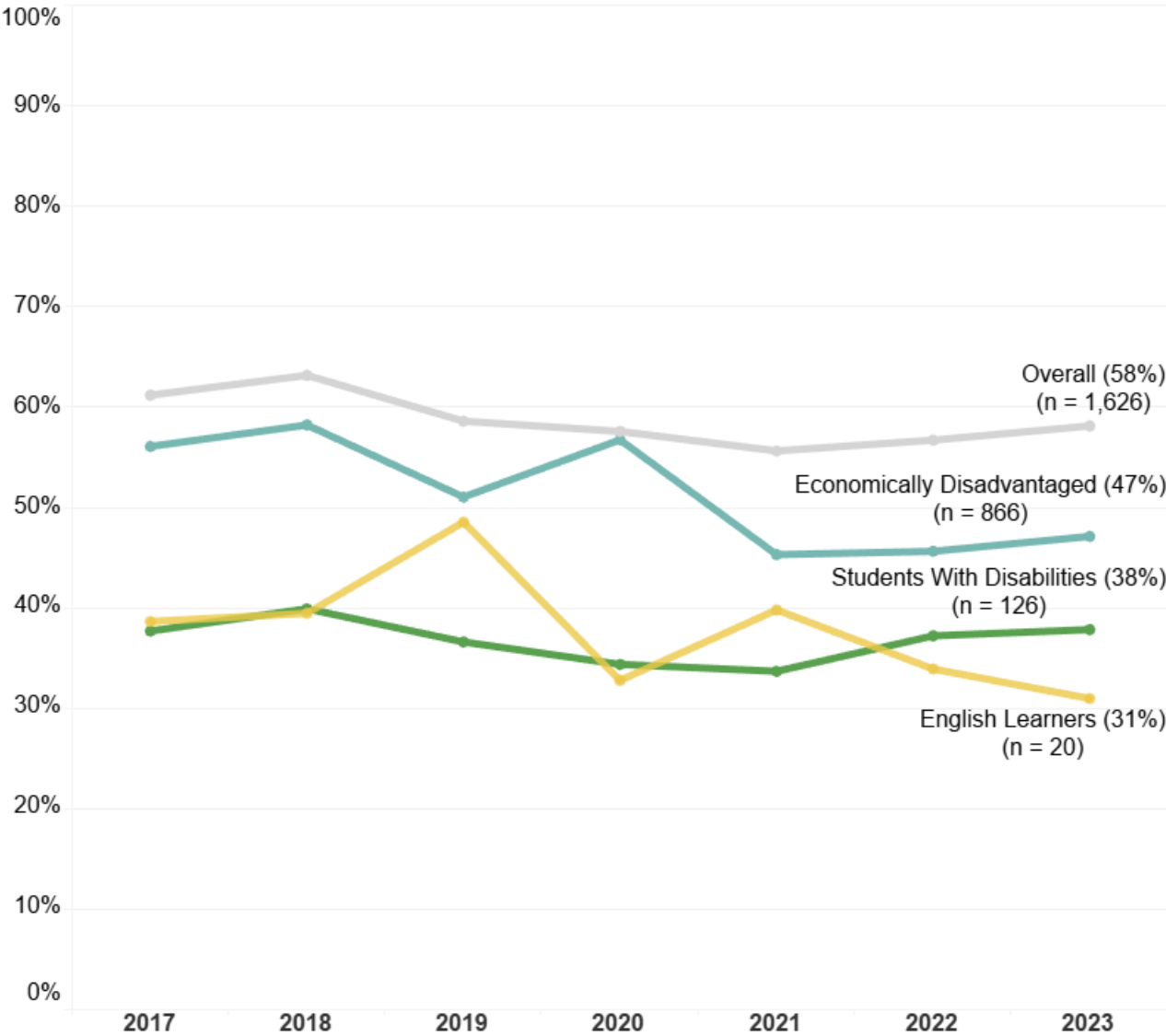

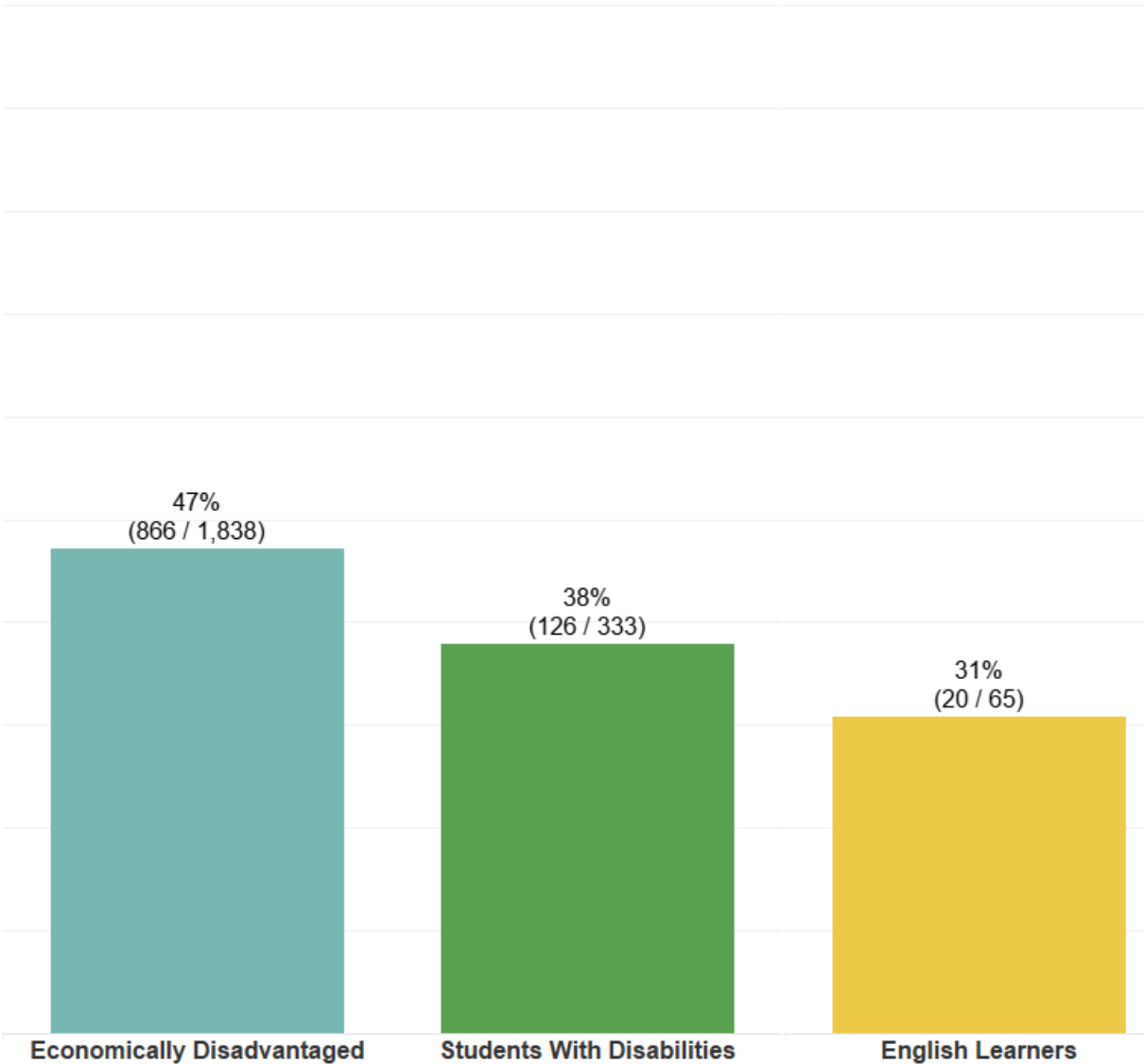
Postsecondary enrollment rates are lower among students with disabilities, English learners, and economically disadvantaged students

From SY2017 to SY2023, economically disadvantaged students, students with disabilities, and English learners who graduated on time seamlessly enrolled in postsecondary institutions at lower rates than the general population of on-time graduates. Enrollment among economically disadvantaged students have gradually increased to 47% and among students with disabilities to 38% since a 6-year low in 2021. English learners have seen a year over year decline since 2021, with a seamless enrollment rate of 31% in 2023.

Seamless Enrollment by Subgroup, Cohort 2023

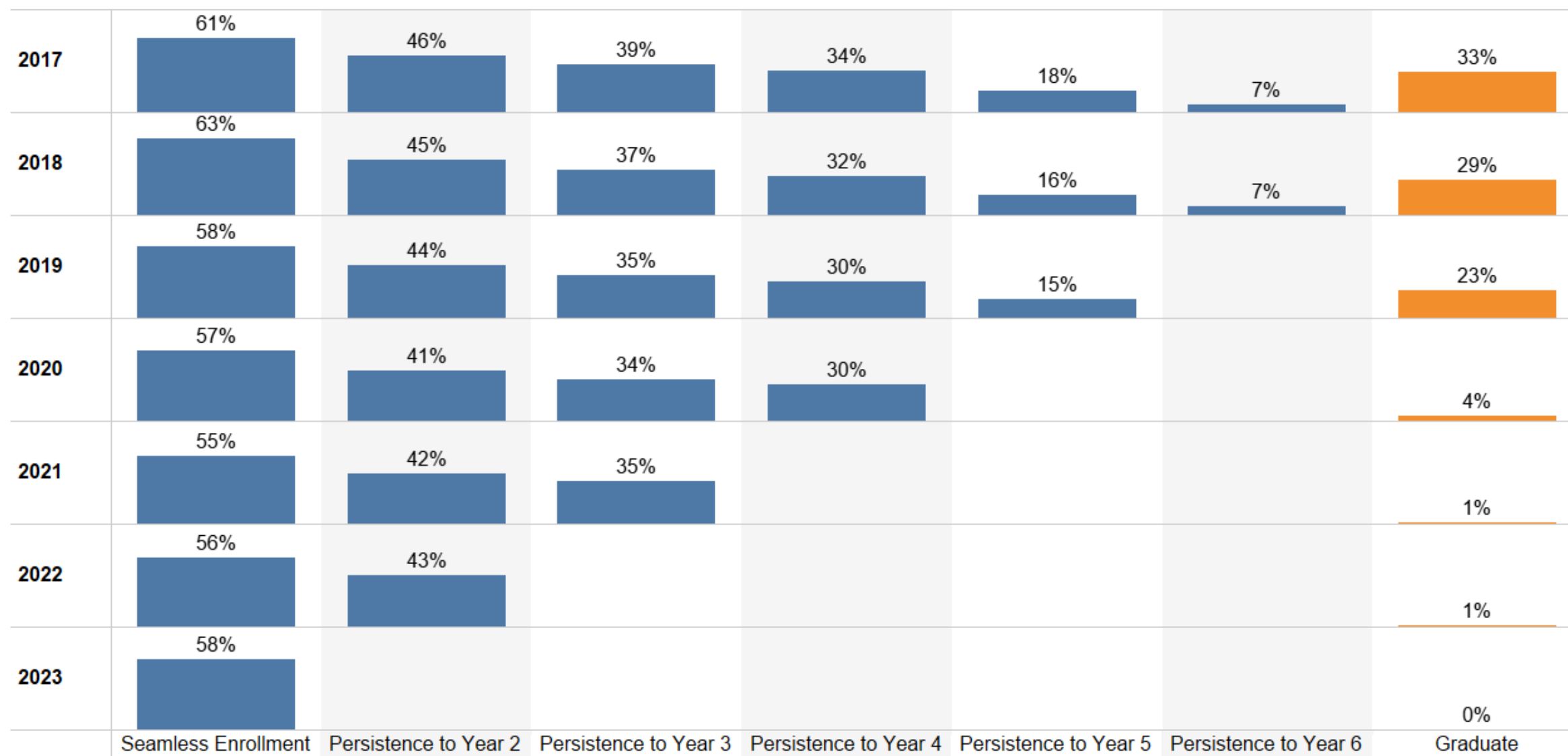

The percentage of high school graduates who seamlessly enrolled in college increased by 2 percentage points from cohort 2022 to cohort 2023

In this graph, the percentage of students who persisted in each year and graduated only includes students who seamlessly enrolled. Students may count in both persistence and graduate figures. For this analysis, college persistence is defined as remaining enrolled in a postsecondary institution as of October 1 in years following initial enrollment. A student need not remain enrolled in the same institution to count as persisting; however, s/he must remain enrolled continuously (as of October 1 in consecutive years).

Seamless Enrollment and Persistence among On-Time High School Graduates, Cohorts 2017 - 2023

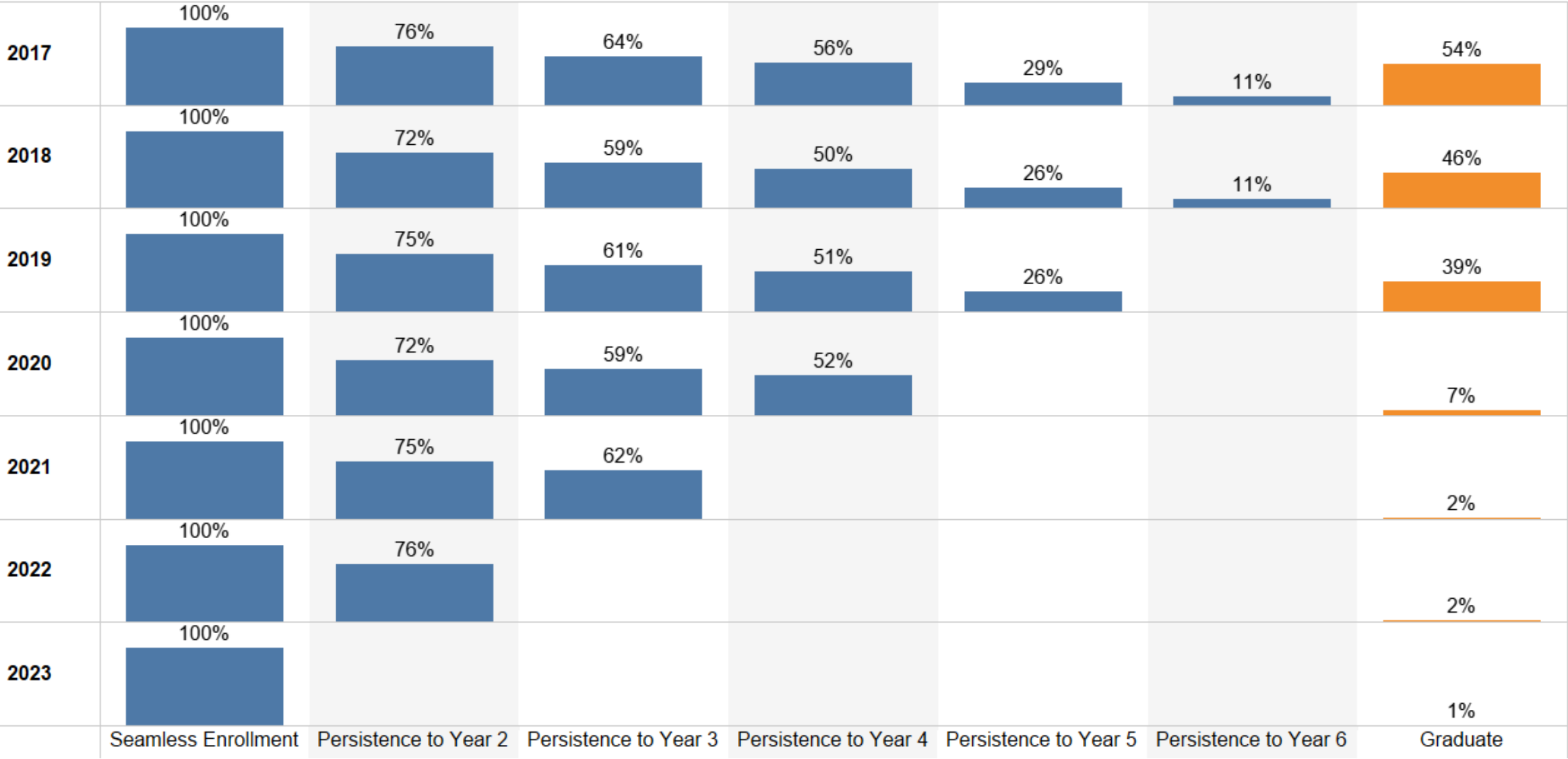

54% of cohort 2017 on-time graduates who seamlessly enrolled earned some kind of degree within 6 years

National measures of persistence and college graduation rates typically consider the percentage of *enrollees* who persist and graduate. Of APS on-time graduates who seamlessly enroll in college, about three out of four persist to year 2. Cohort 2017 is the only cohort in the graph whose members have had six complete school years to earn a post-secondary credential. In this graph, the percentage of students who persisted in each year and graduate only includes students who seamlessly enrolled. Students may count in both persistence and graduate figures. Nationally, the 6-year graduation rate for students who entered college in the fall of 2017 was 62.2%.

Many students enroll at institutions with lower-than-average institution graduation rates.

This table shows institutional and APS graduation rates for schools that enrolled at least 15 APS on-time graduates from cohort 2017 (i.e., students have had 6 years to graduate). APS students who attend postsecondary institutions with low graduation rates may require additional supports to be successful.

- Students who transfer out do count against an institution's graduation rate.

- Completion rates from [Completing College](#) include both full-time and part-time, first-time students who completed in six years.
- Atlanta Metropolitan State College and Albany State University also offer 4-year degrees.

APS Grade Rate (Any) includes students who earned a degree/certificate from any institution within 6 years.

APS Grade Rate (Same) includes students who earned a degree/certificate from the same institution at which they were first enrolled, which is consistent with the definition used for the institutional graduation rate.

Institution Grad Rate comes from the Department of Education's [College Scorecard](#) and is the percent of students who enrolled in the fall as first-time, full-time students and completed within 150 percent of the expected time.

For both APS graduation rates, the denominator is the number of cohort 2017 seamless enrollees who were full-time students during their first semester.

In this calculation, APS students at primarily 2-year colleges were given six years to graduate. For this reason, a direct comparison between APS Grad Rate (Same) and Institution Grad Rate (three years to graduate for 2-year institutions) cannot be made for 2-year institutions.

2023 Background Information

In March of 2020, the global COVID-19 pandemic altered life for everyone. The 2023 graduating cohort attended high school during the pandemic; it is important to note that the pandemic may have influenced their postsecondary admissions credentials and postsecondary decisions. It is also important to note that the pandemic may have affected members of earlier cohorts in terms of their ability to complete a postsecondary credential or stay enrolled in a postsecondary institution. This report cannot account for the potential impact of the pandemic on postsecondary enrollment trends.

Data Sources

National Student Clearinghouse

Postsecondary enrollment rates are calculated using data provided by the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC). NSC is a subscription service used by APS to match graduates with college enrollment records. NSC obtains student data directly from participating college and university registrars typically on a monthly basis. NSC provides information for more than 3,600 U.S. postsecondary institutions. Postsecondary institutions that do not participate with NSC include four of the U.S. service academies (the United States Naval Academy has been a participant since August 2020).

There are several limitations to matching and reporting of enrollment data which may result in underreporting of college enrollment. Limitations such as name variations, name changes, and FERPA blocks may result in lower levels of matching. According to NSC, Georgia has a [FERPA block rate](#) of approximately 1%.

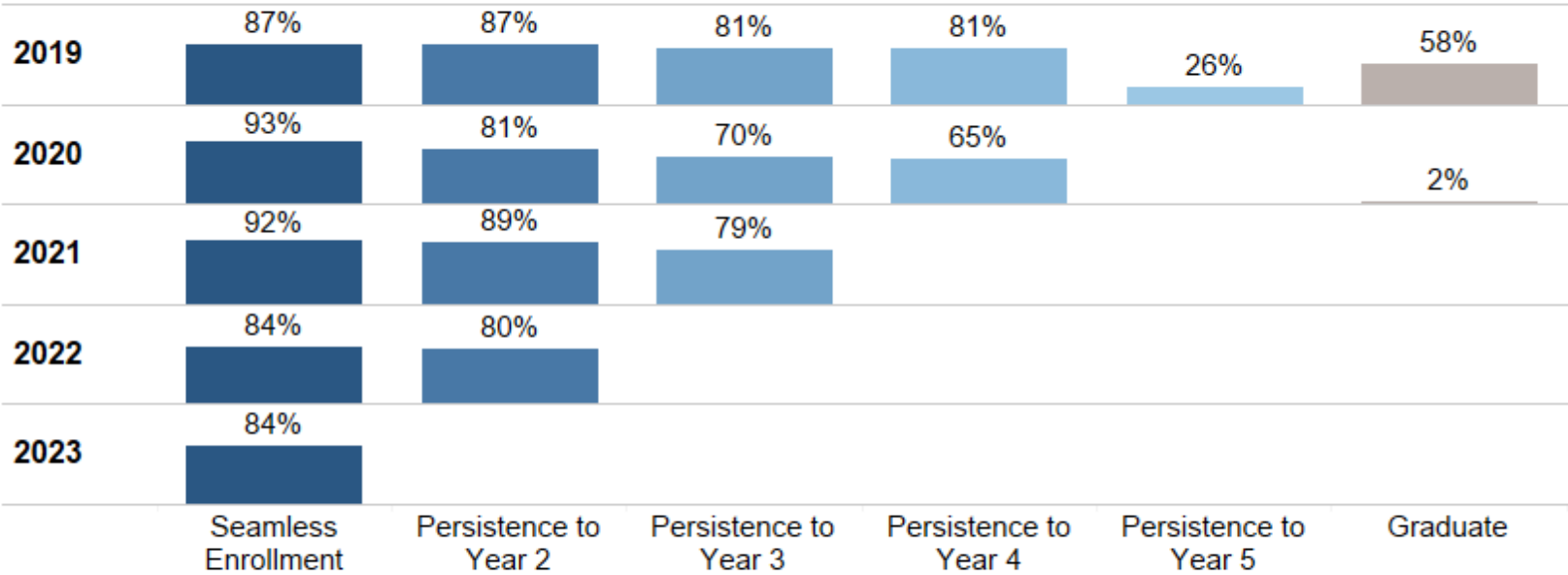

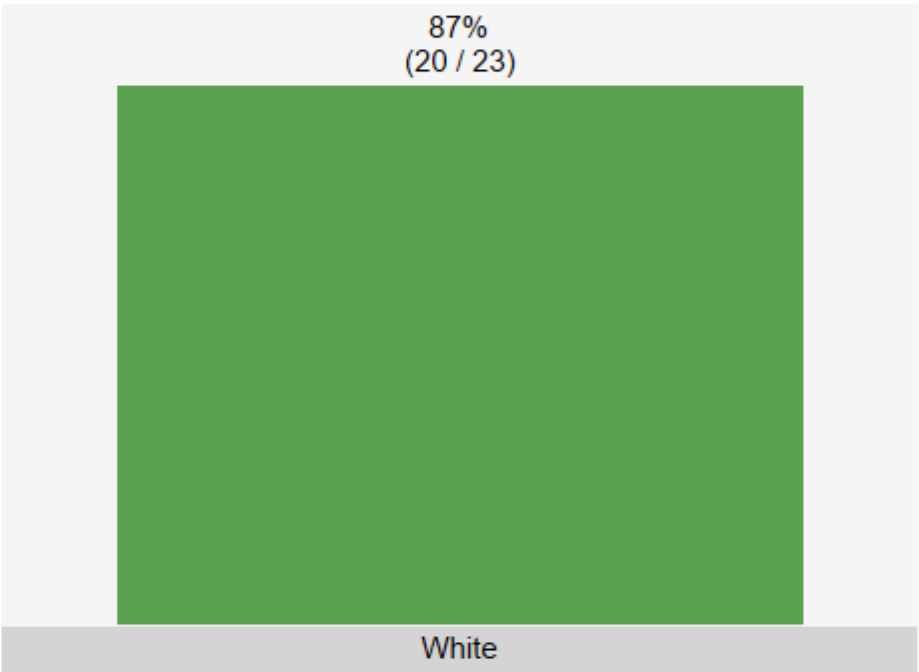

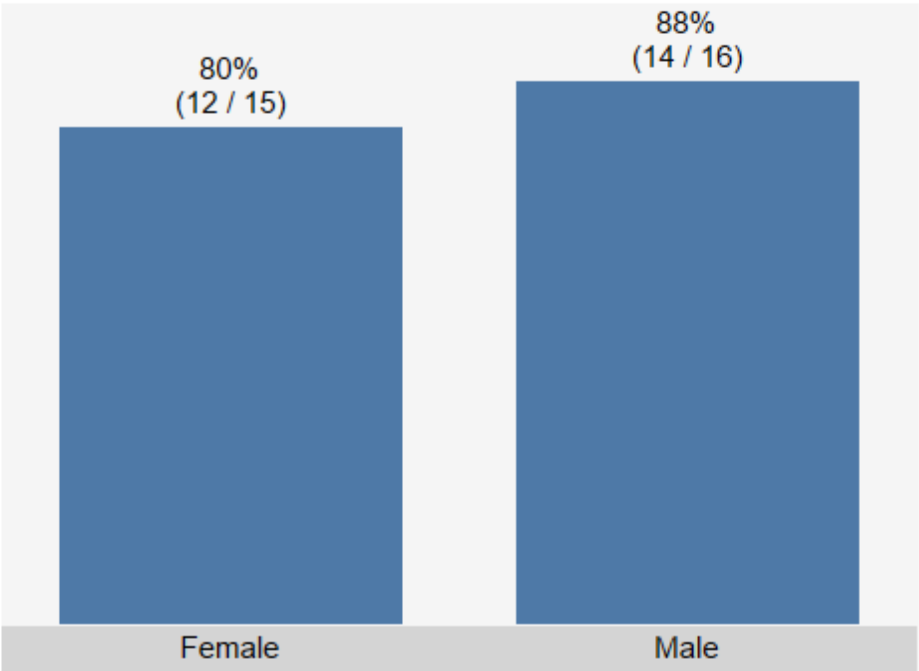
Classical Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

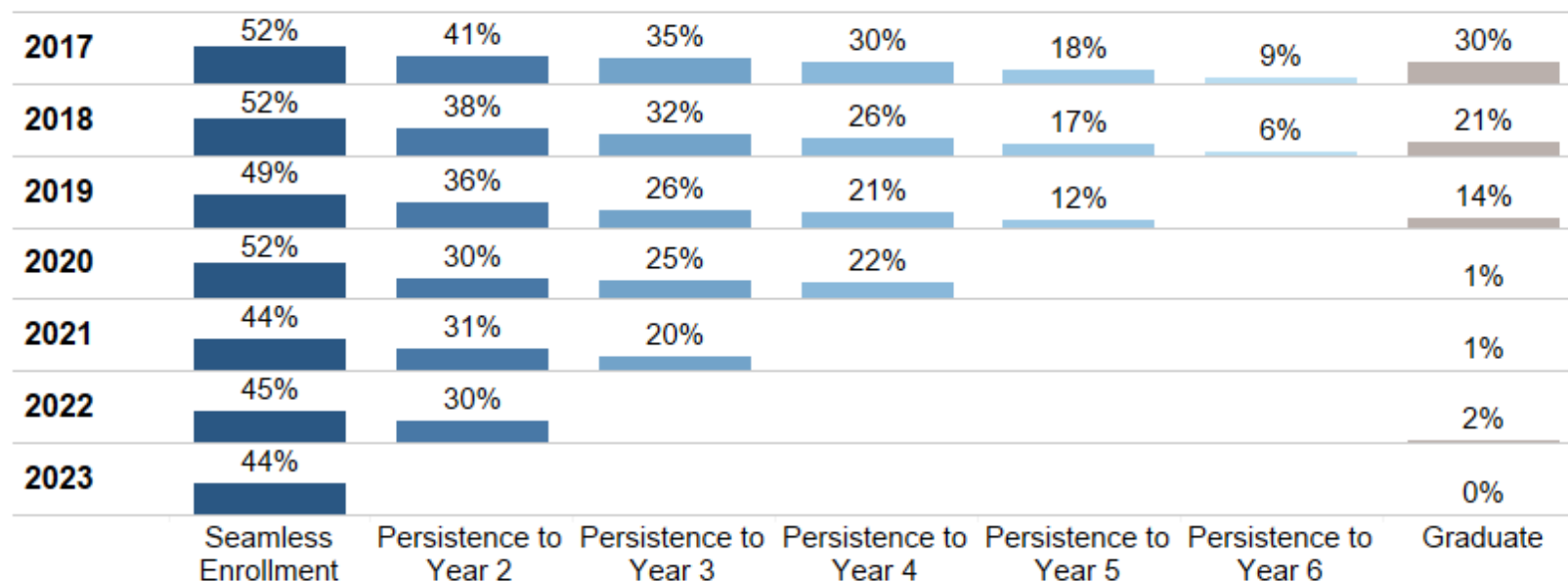

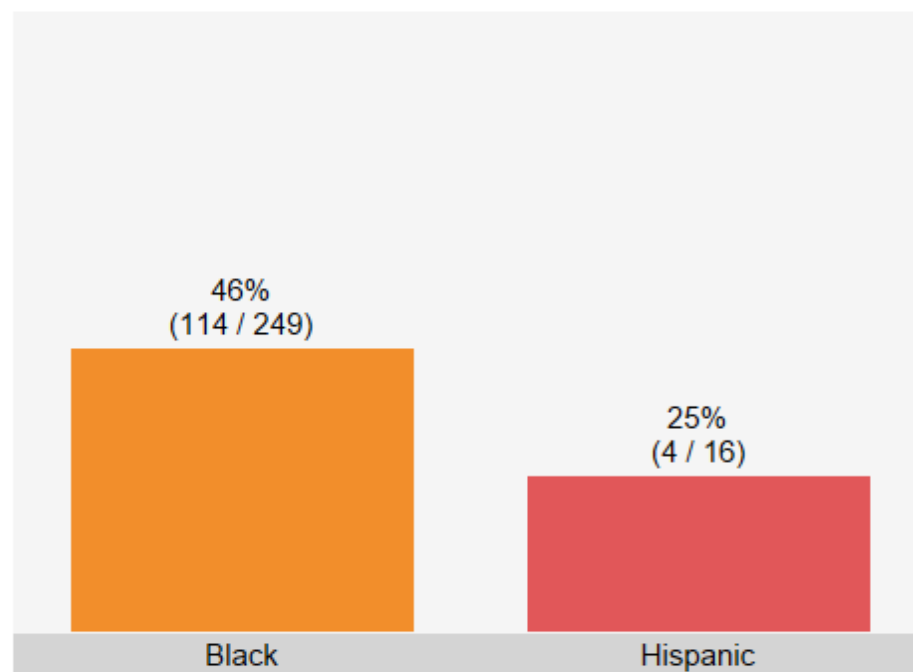

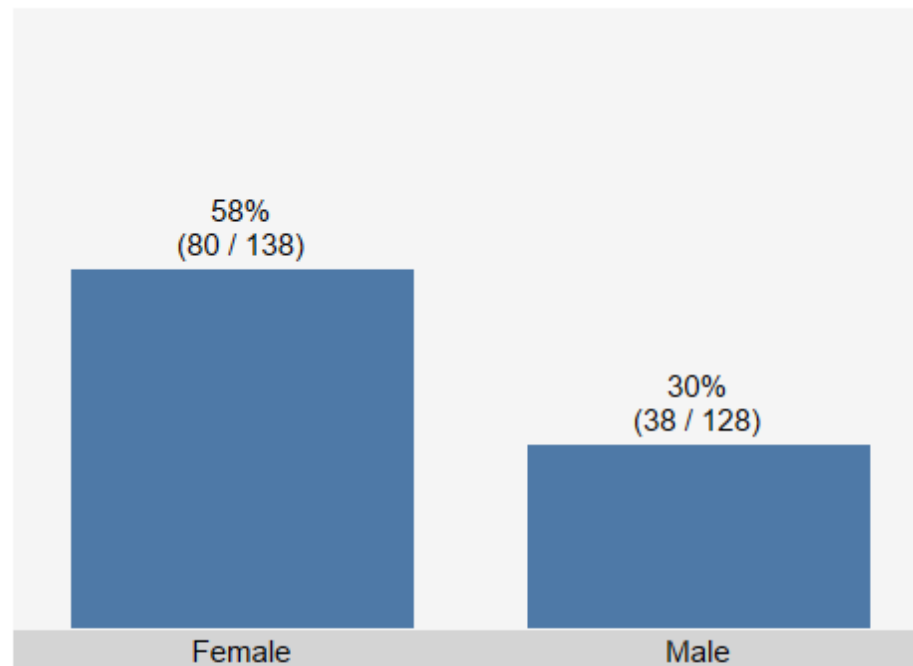
Mays Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

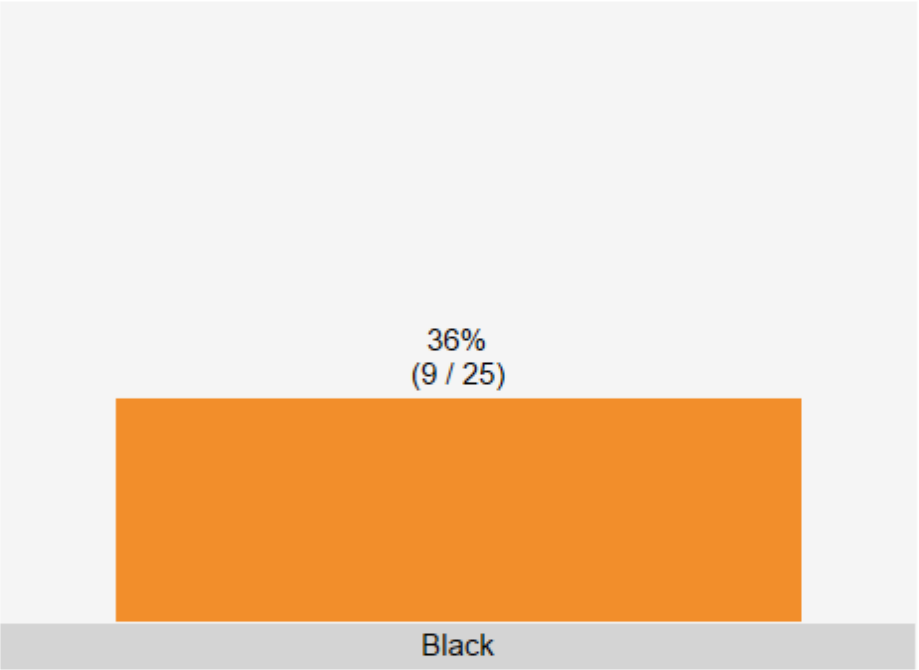

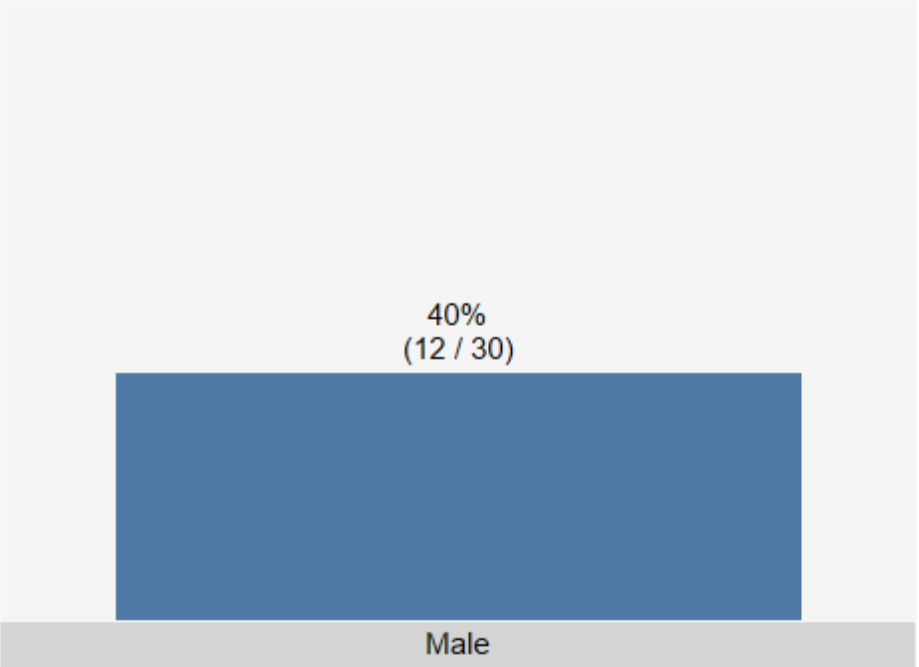
BEST MS/HS Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

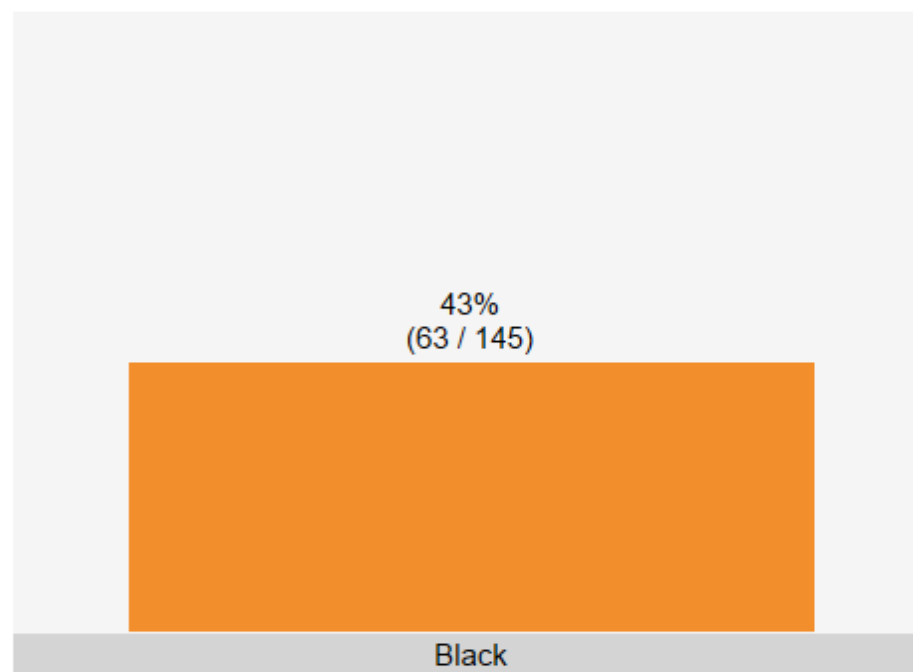

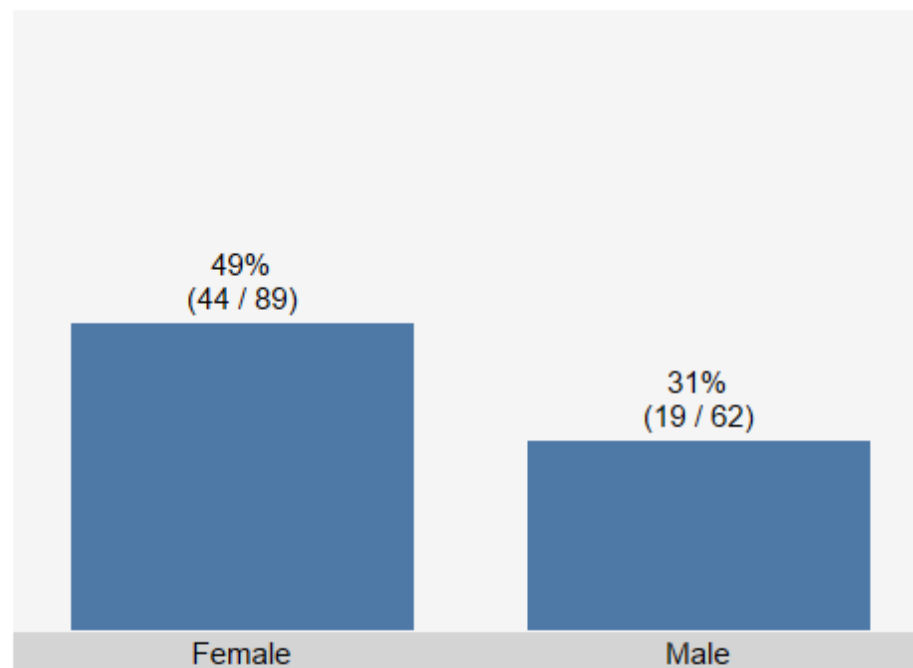
Washington Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

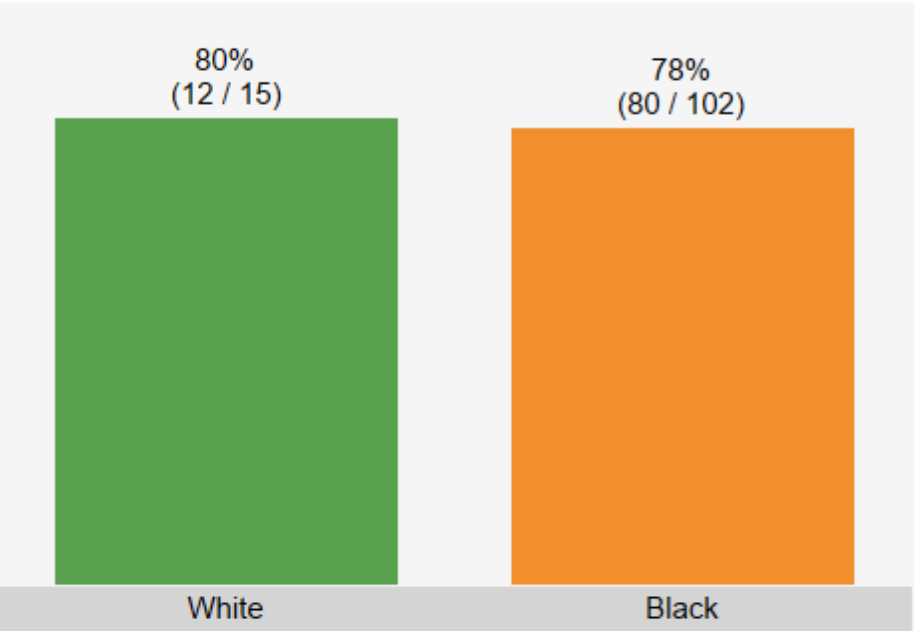

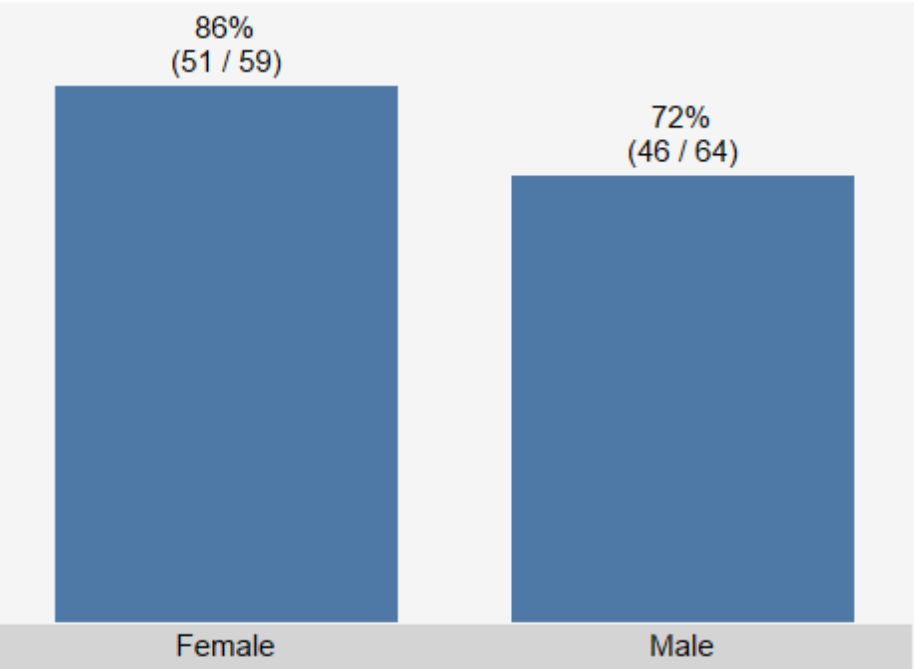
Drew Secondary Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

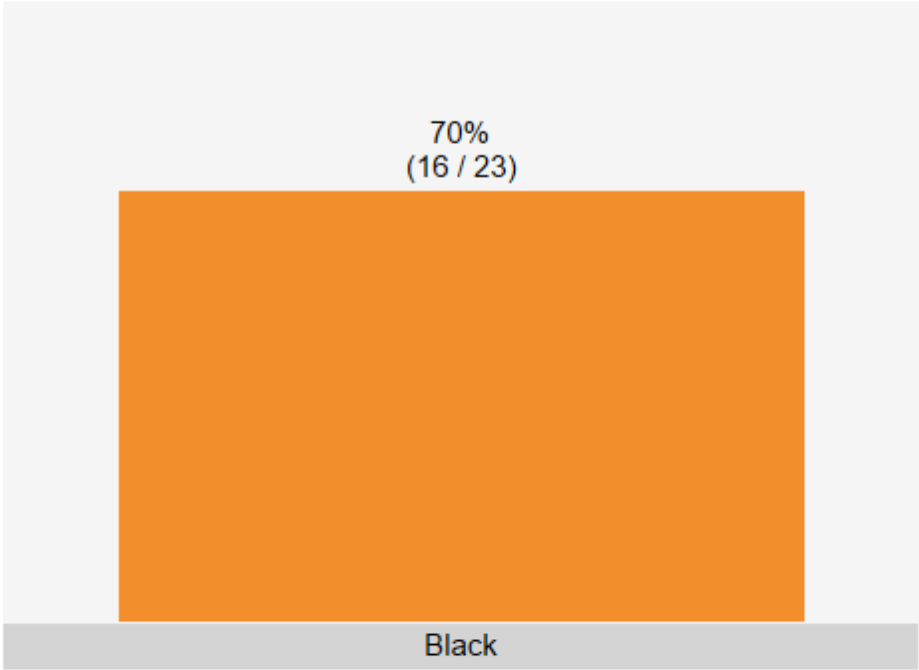

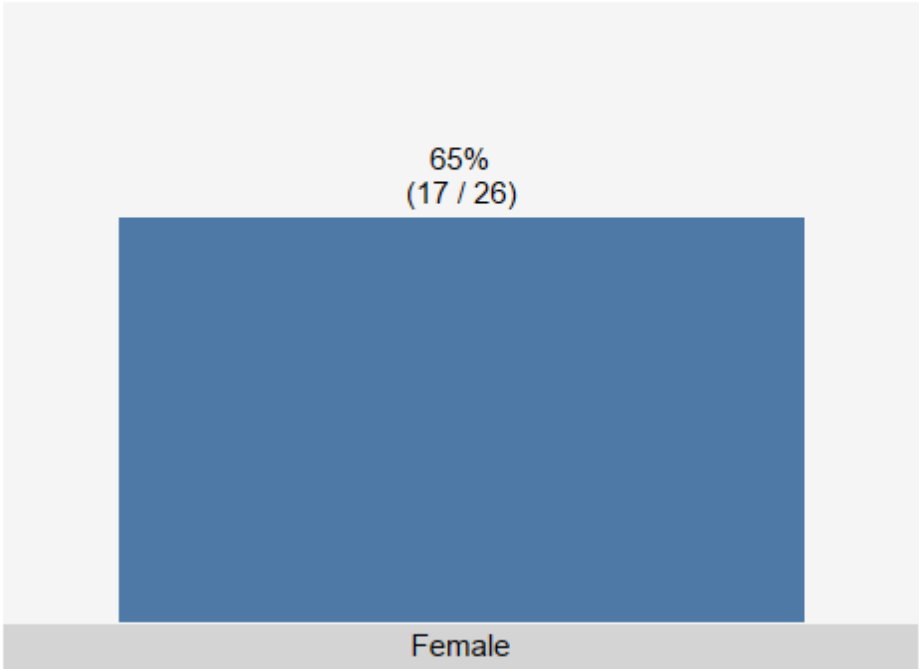
CSK Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

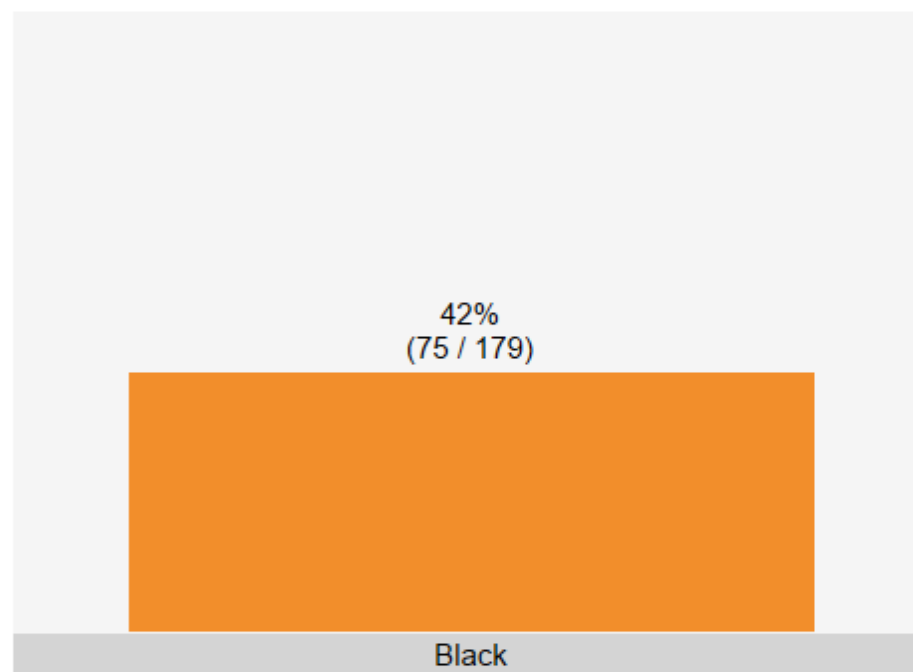

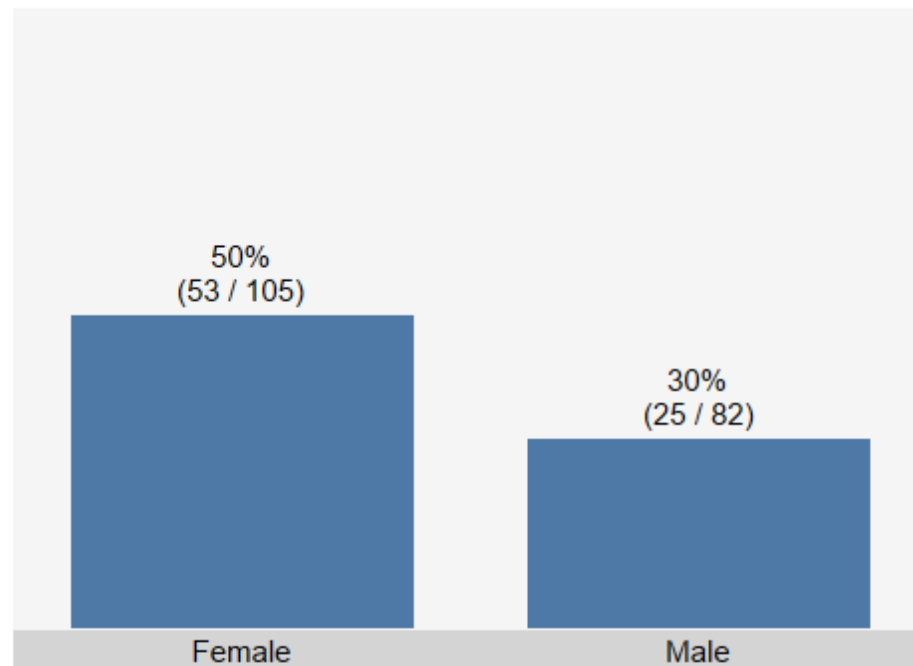
Therrell Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

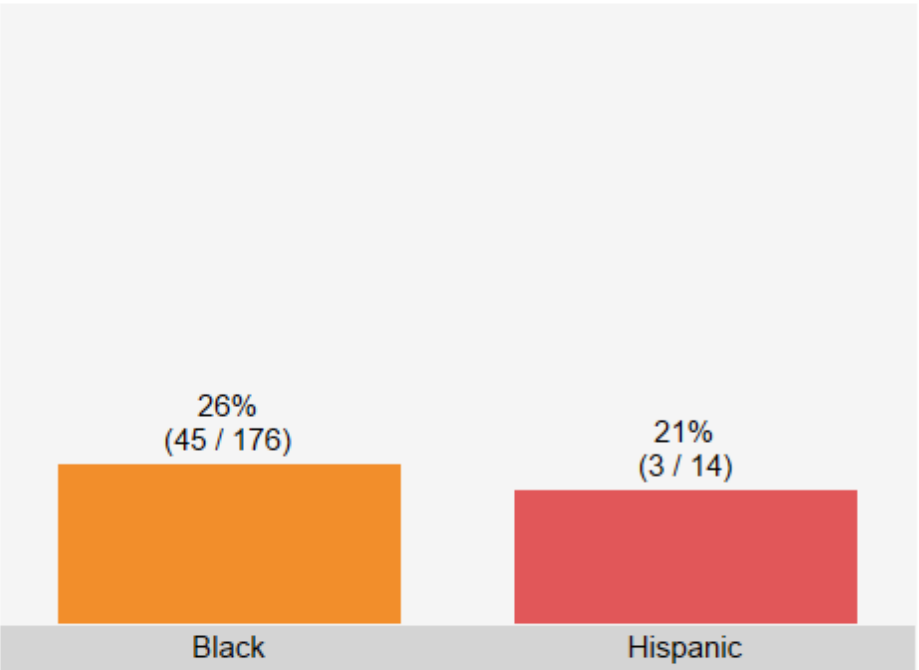

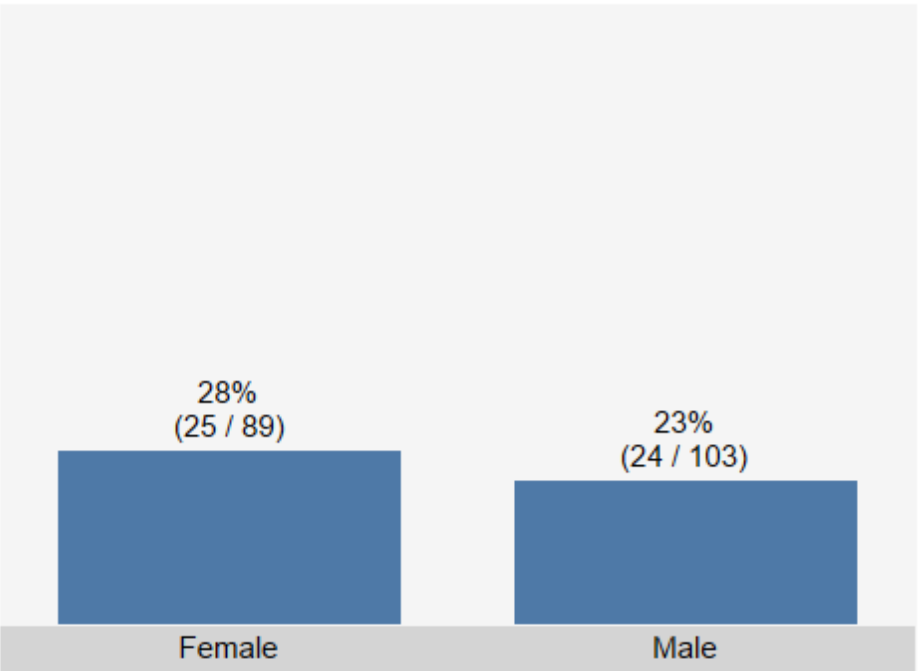
Douglass Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

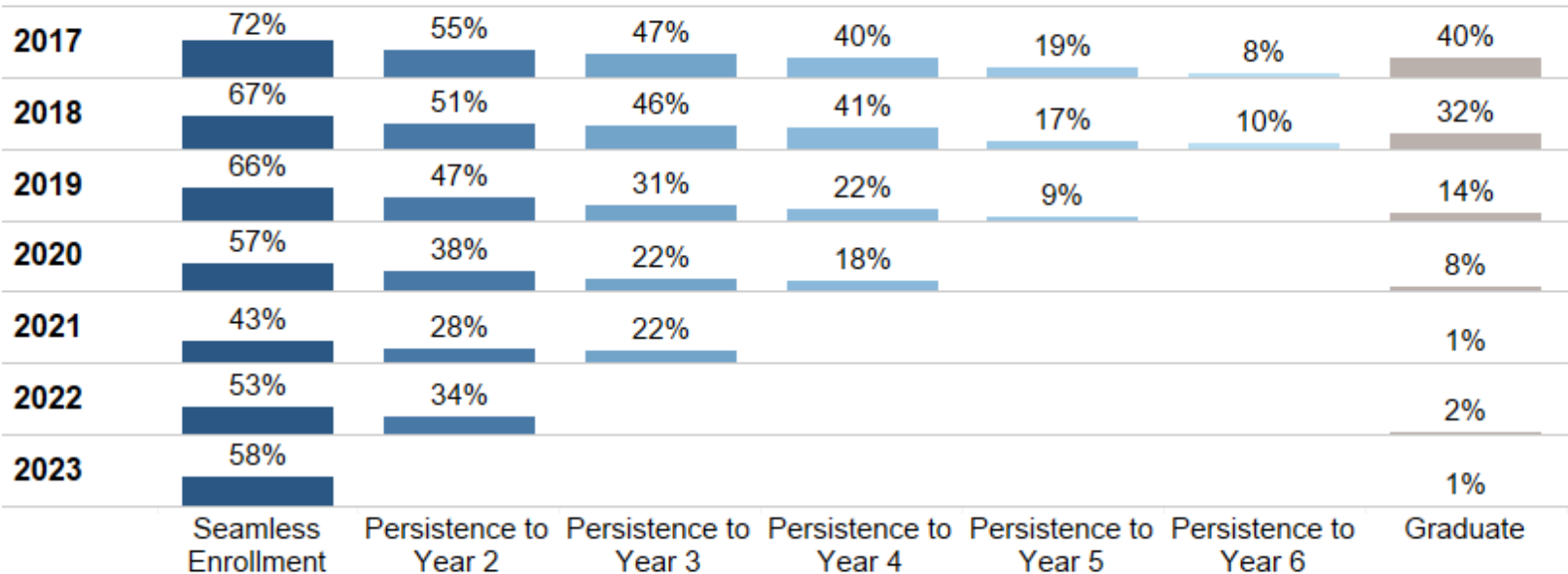

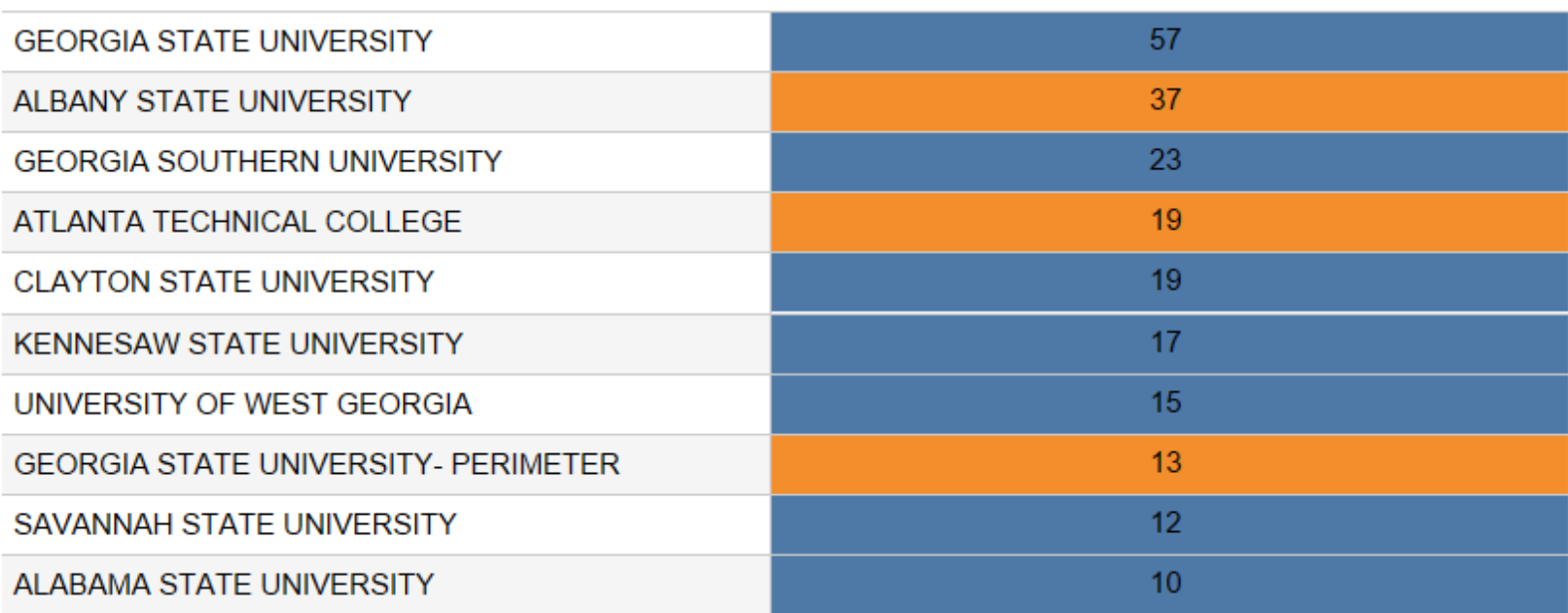

Carver Early Top 10 Enrolling Institutions

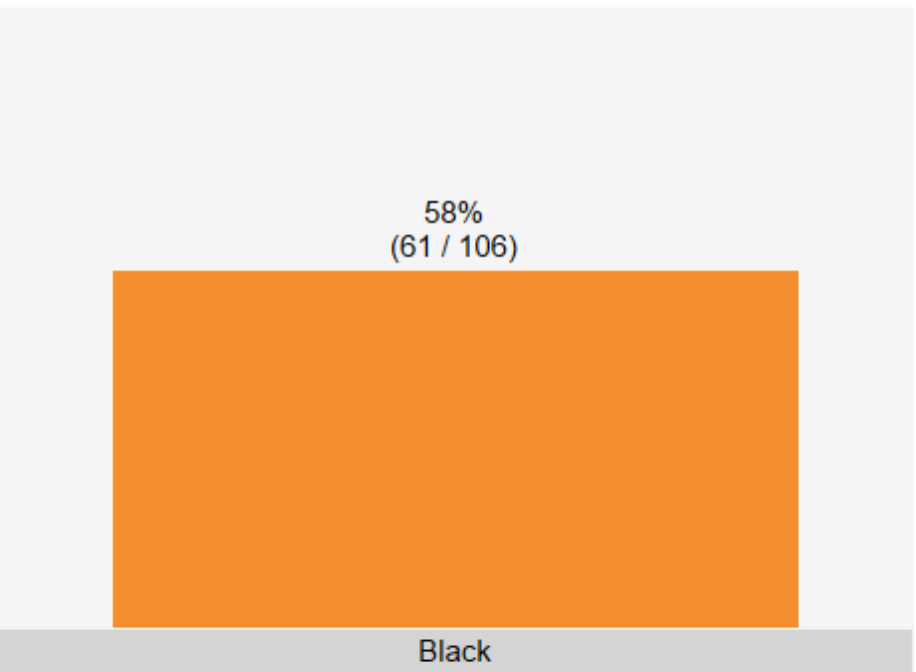

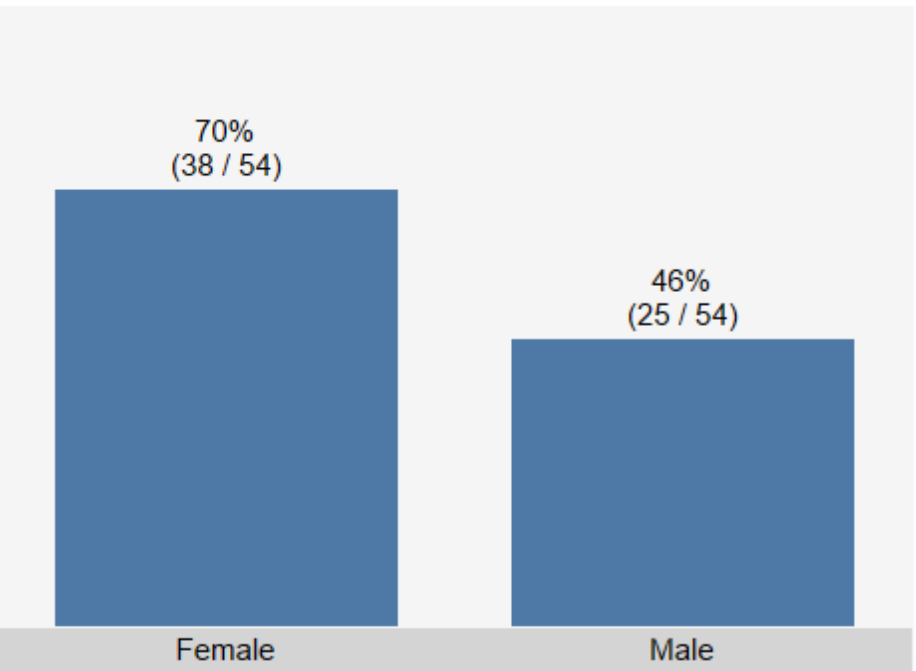
Carver Early Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

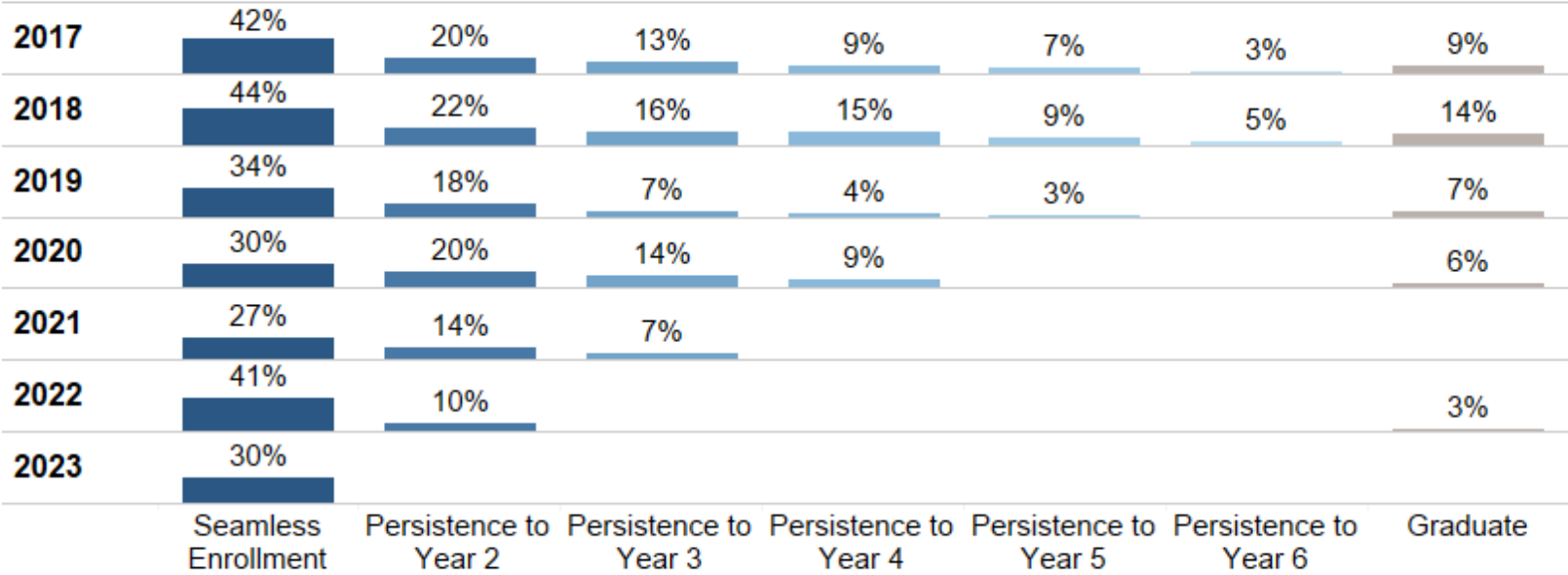

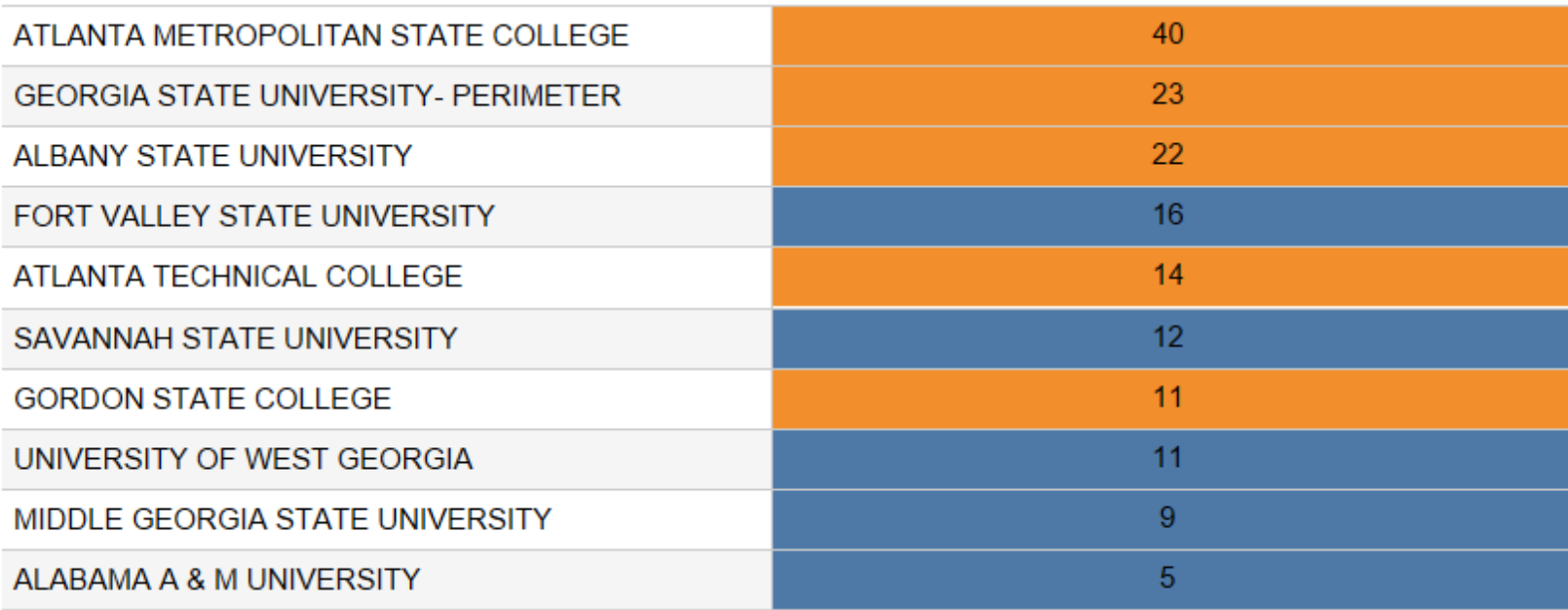

Carver STEAM Top 10 Enrolling Institutions

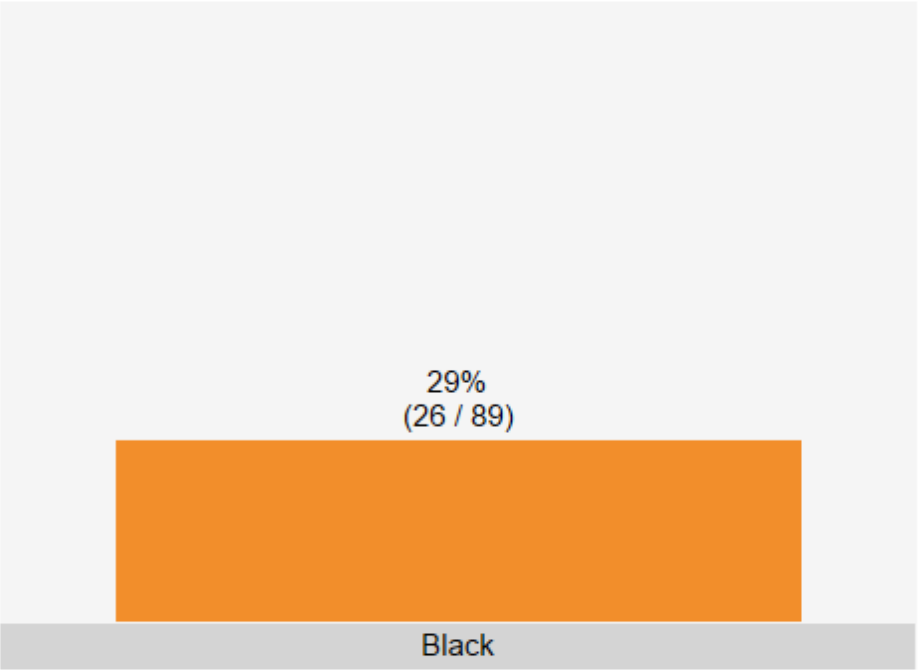

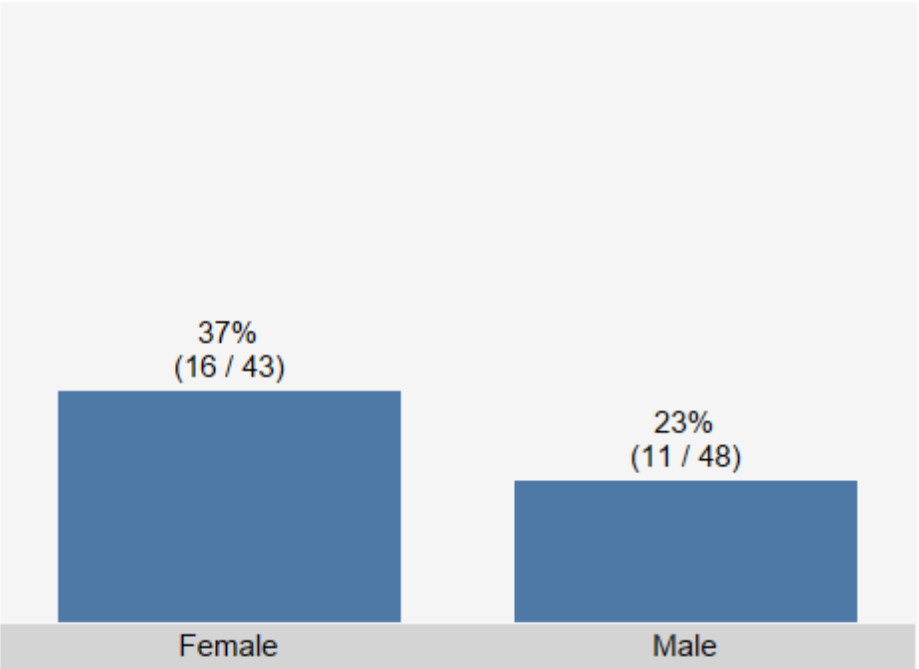
Carver STEAM Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

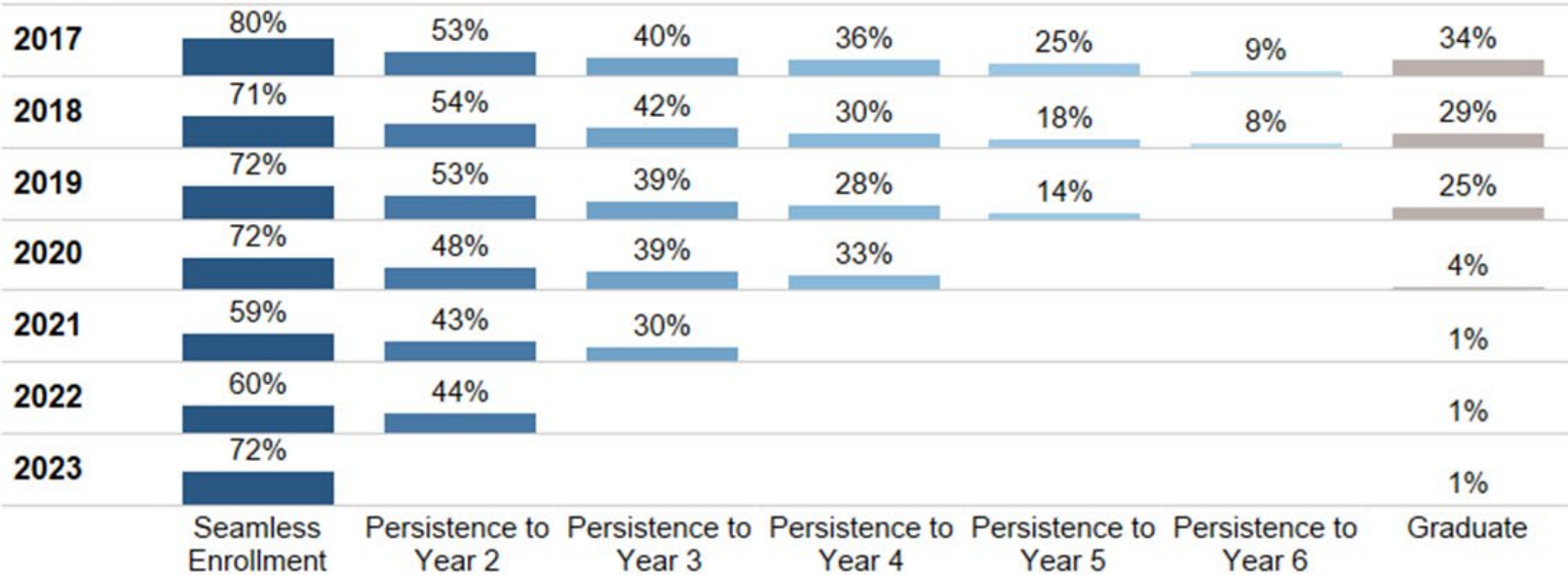

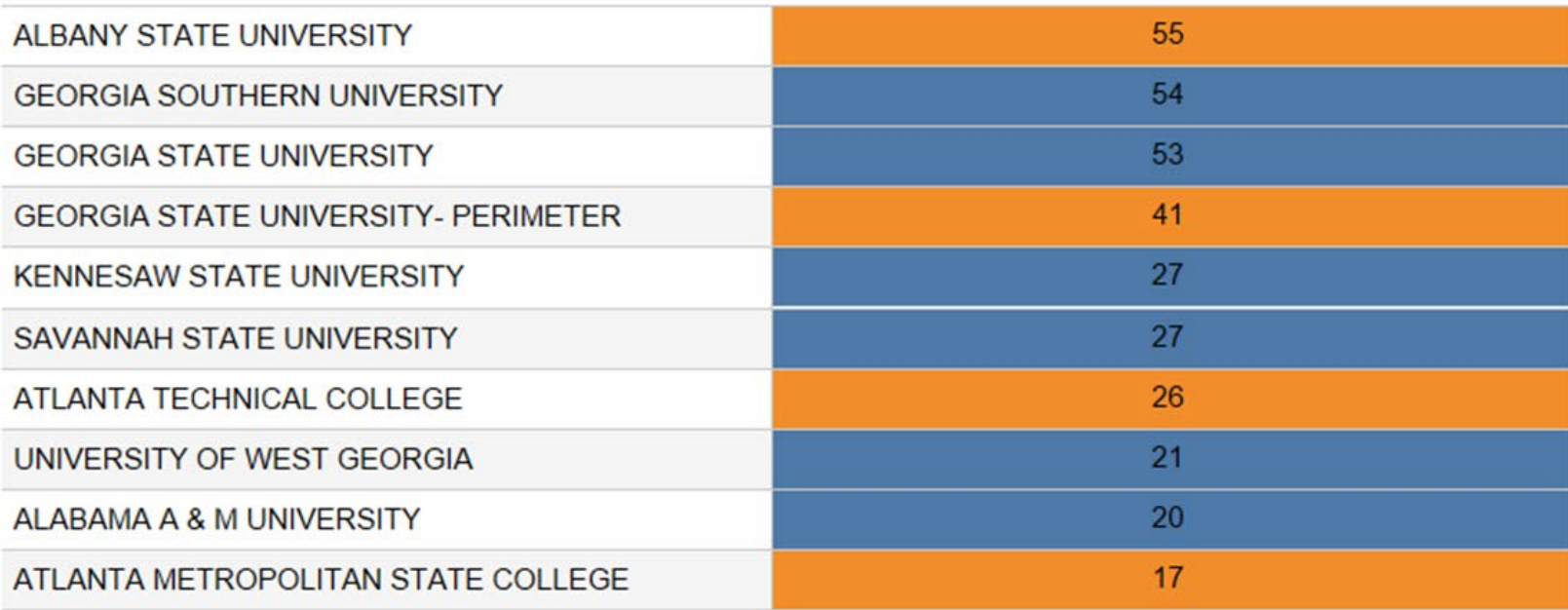

KIPP Collegiate Top 10 Enrolling Institutions

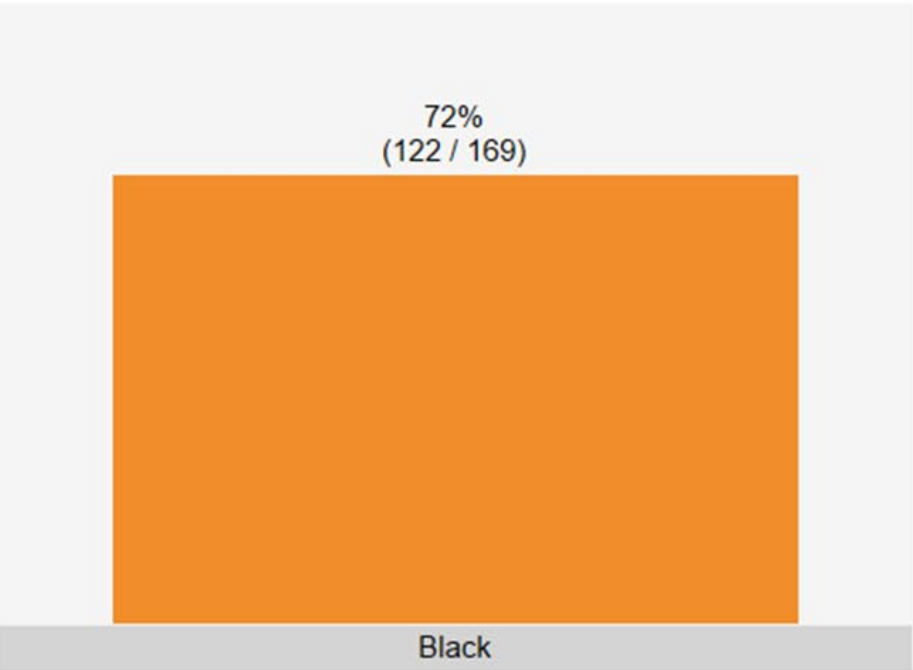

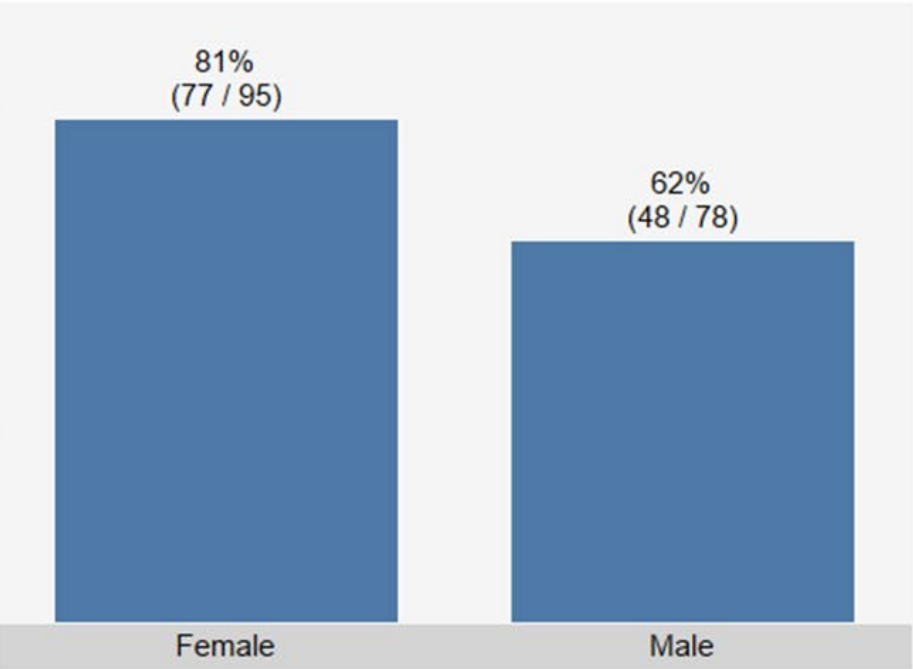
KIPP Collegiate Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

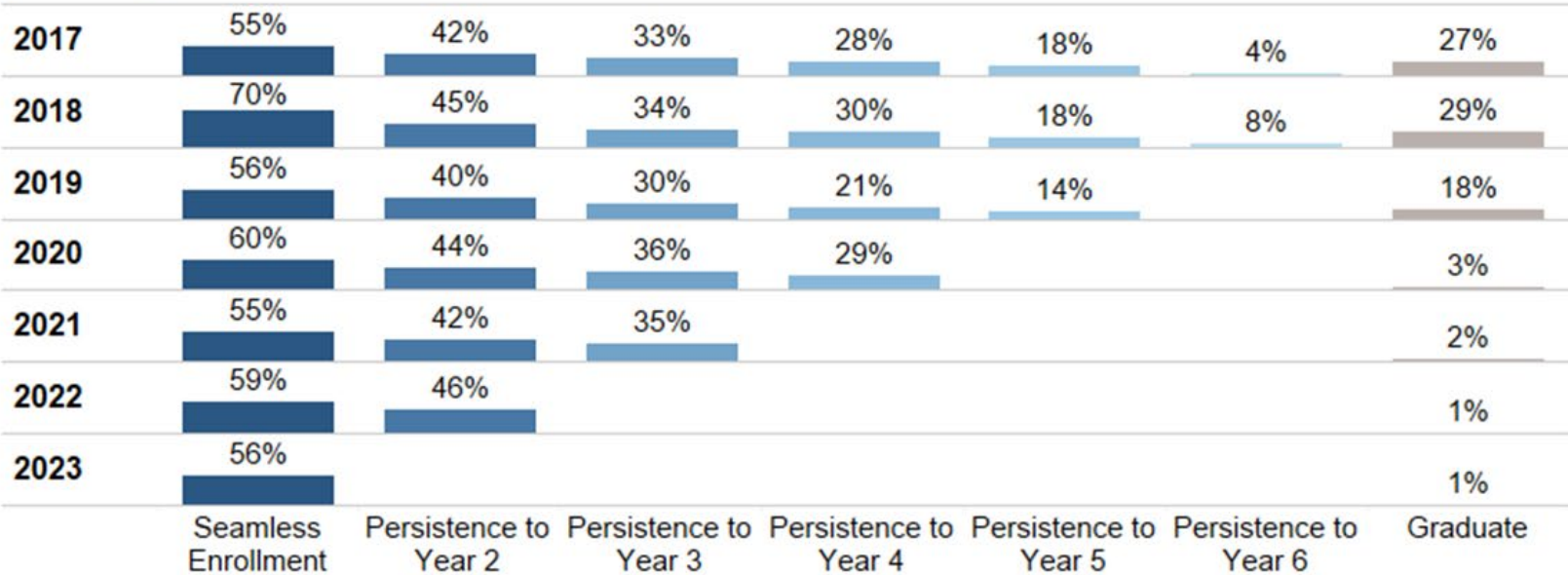

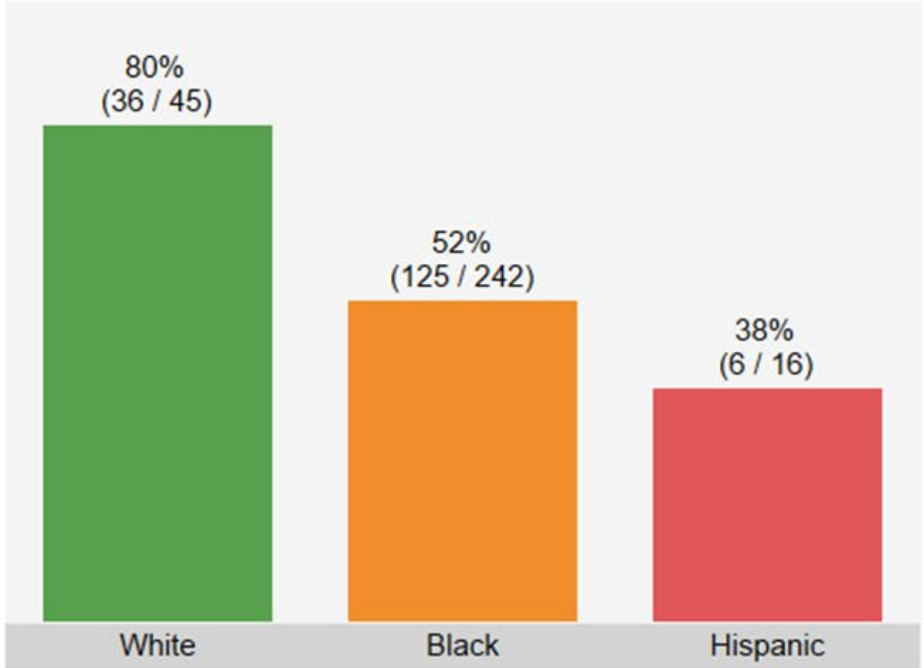

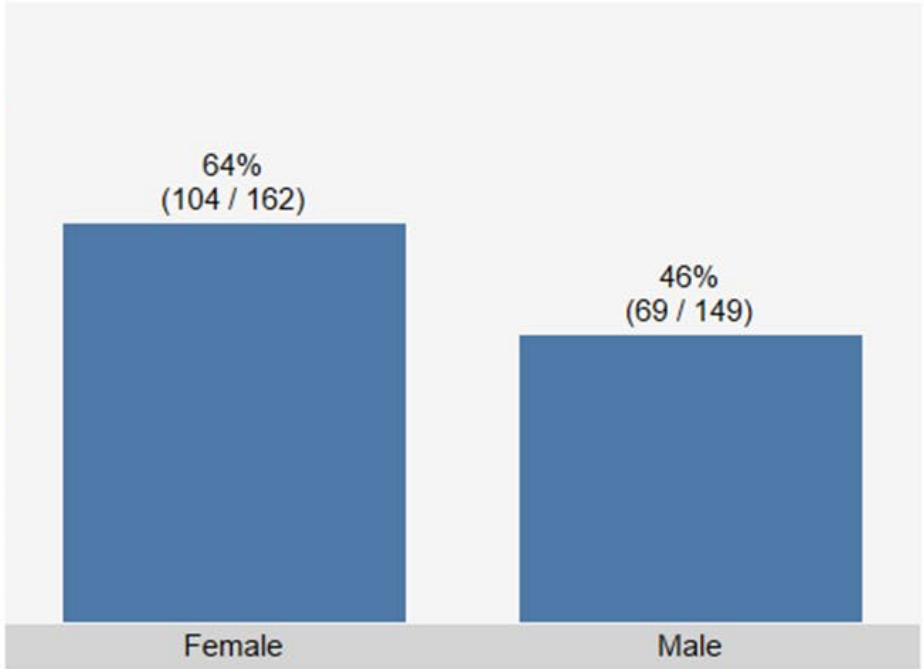
Jackson High Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

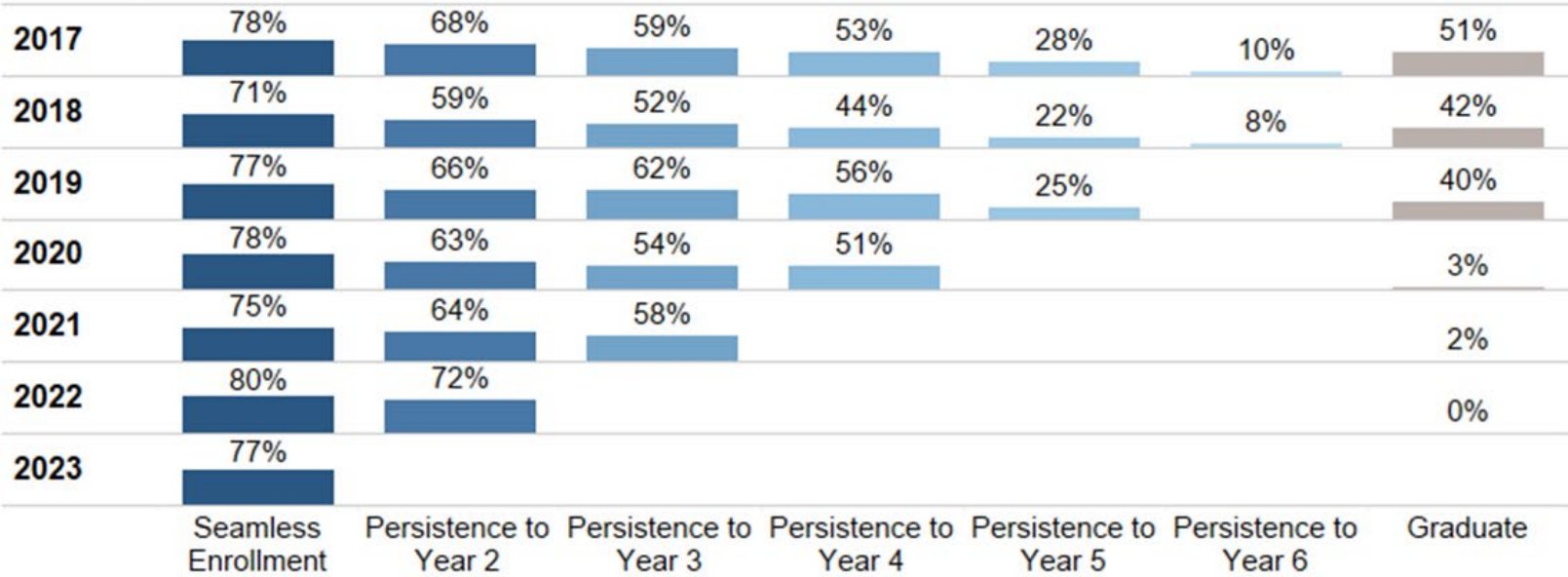

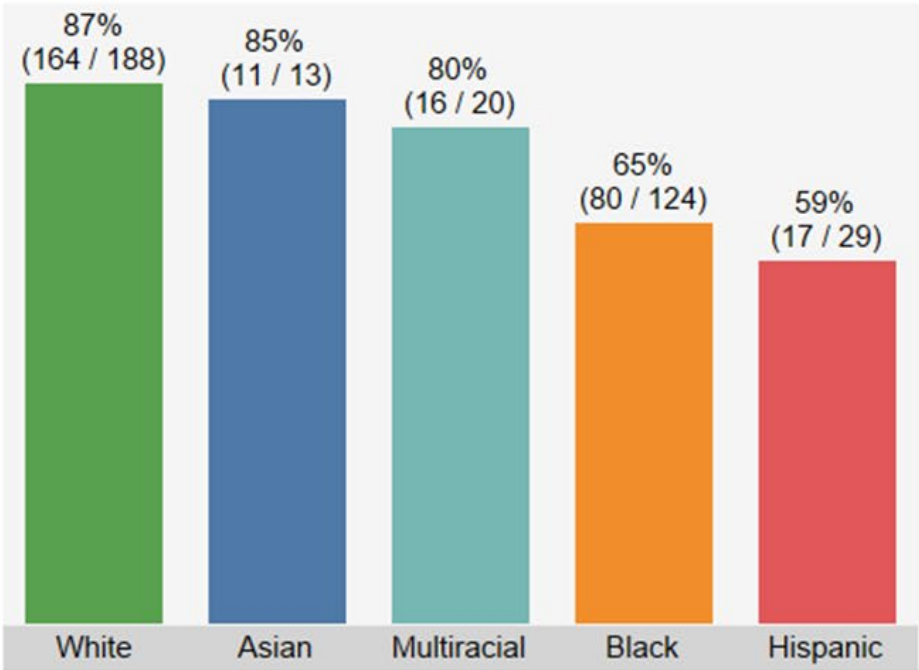

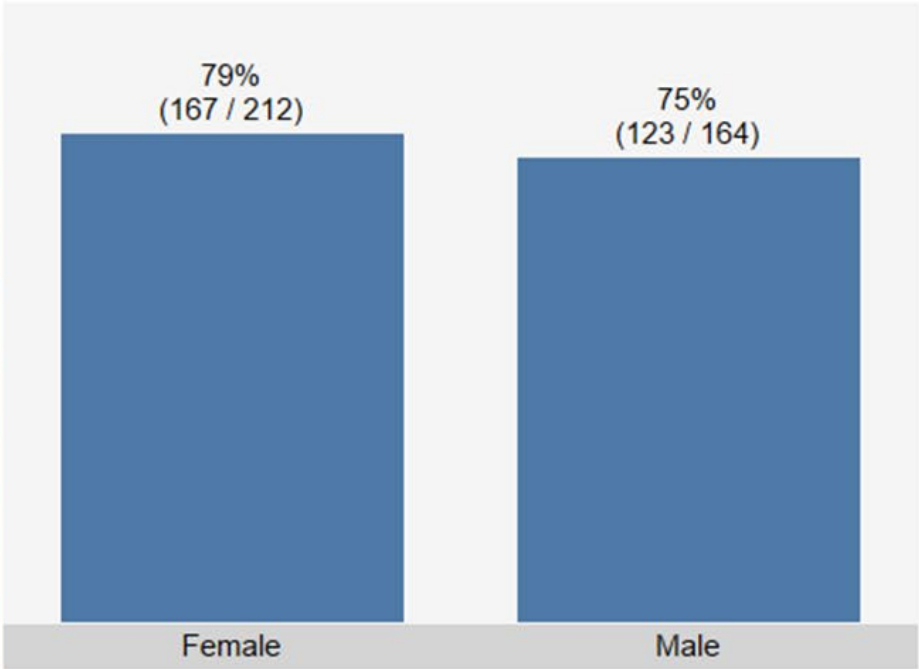
Midtown Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

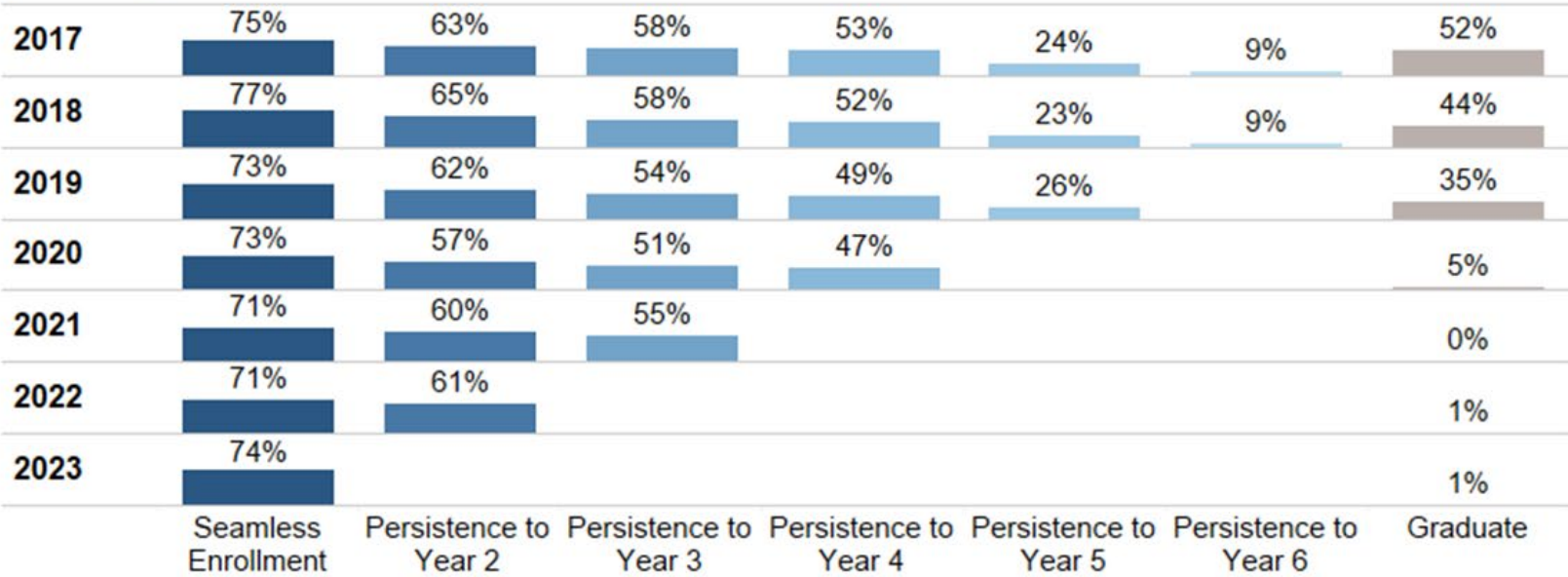

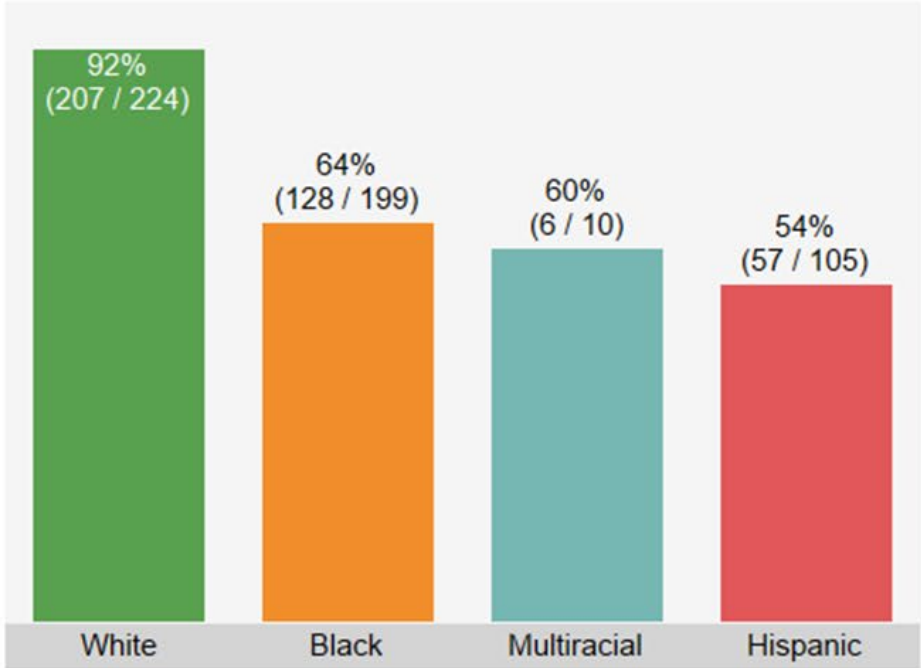

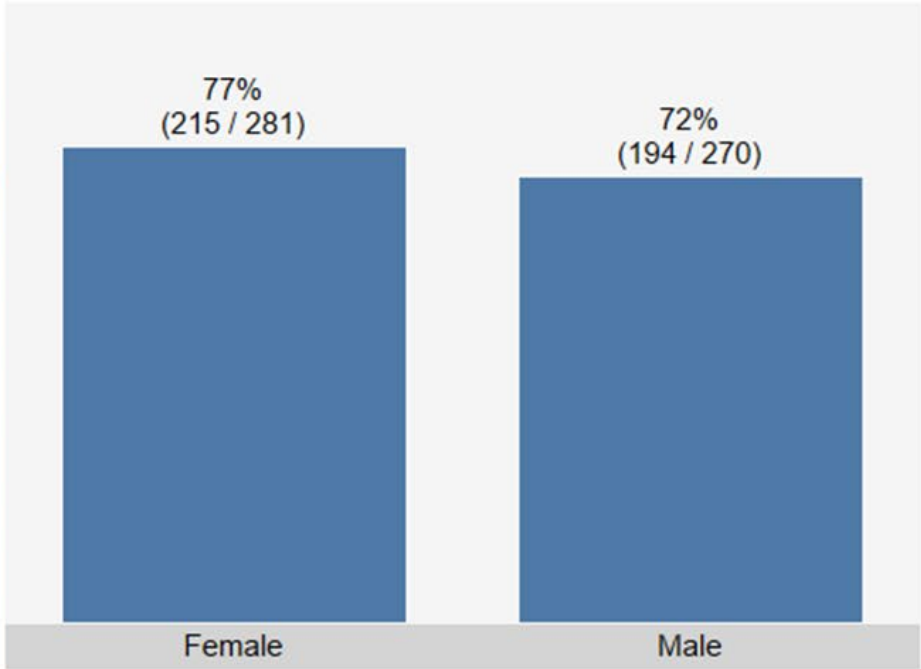
North Atlanta Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023

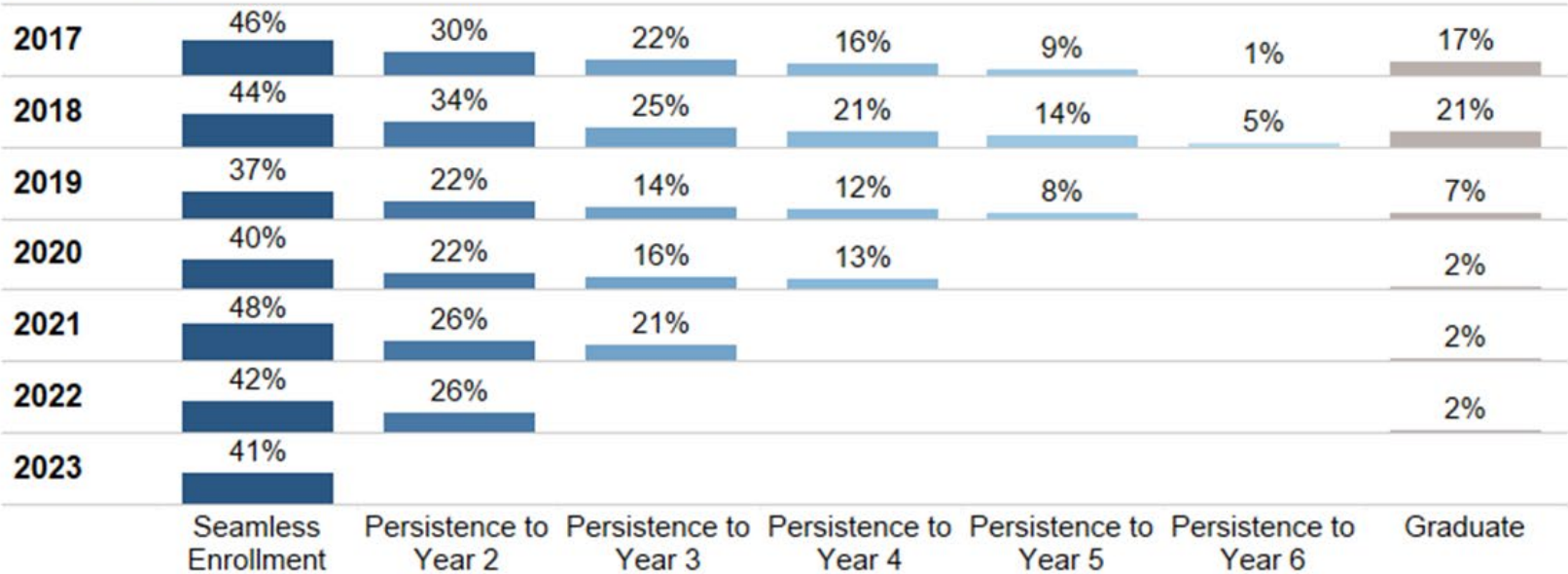

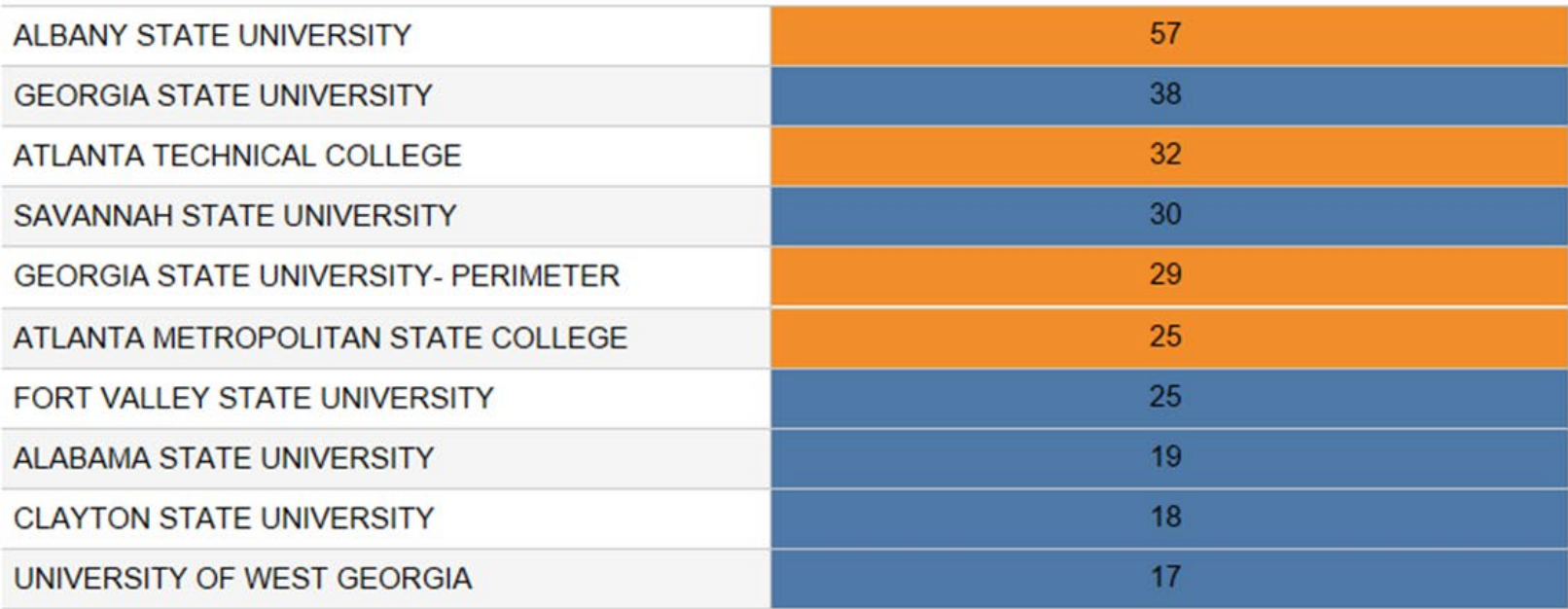

South Atlanta Top 10 Enrolling Institutions

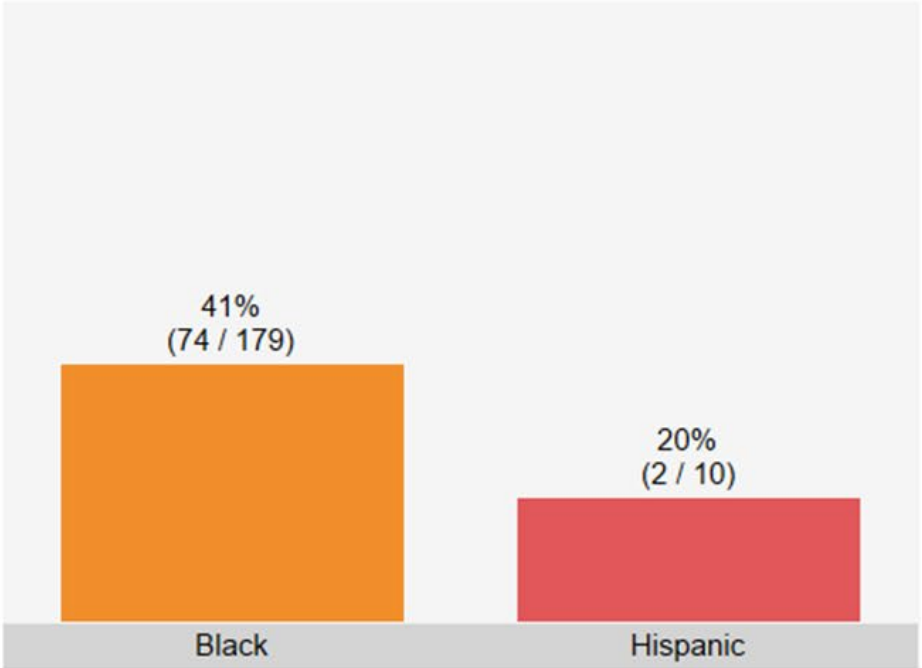

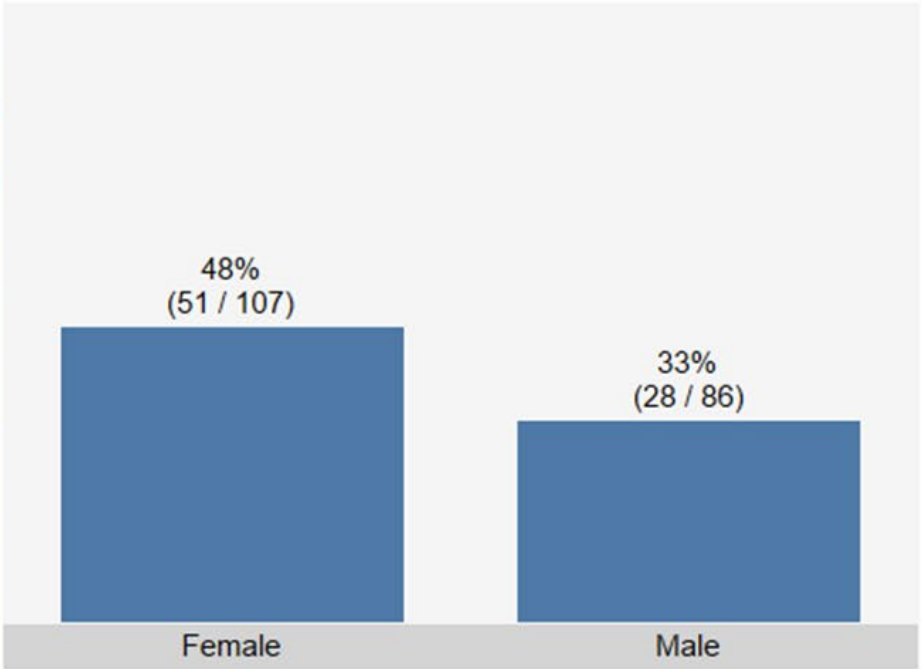
South Atlanta Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2023
