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Atlanta Public Schools Post-Secondary Enrollment Trends

Cohort 2012 – Cohort 2024




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Introduction



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This report examines post-secondary enrollment and persistence of Atlanta Public Schools (APS) graduates since 2012. It focuses on seamless enrollment of each graduating cohort as defined by the Center for Education Policy Research at Harvard University. **Seamless enrollment means a student enrolled in a post-secondary institution by October 1**st **following their high school graduation**. Enrolled students who disenroll before October 1st are not counted as seamless enrollees. Seamless enrollment includes full-time and part-time enrollment at both 4-year and 2-year institutions. Information about National Student Clearinghouse (NSC), the source of the postsecondary enrollment data, can be found at the end of this report. Fifty-eight percent of cohort 2024 on-time graduates were enrolled in 2- or 4-year institutions as of October 1, 2024.




Atlanta Public Schools Seamless Enrollment among On-Time High School Graduates by Cohort


Note. On-time graduates refers to students who graduate in four years with a regular high school diploma as reported by the Georgia Department of Education. Seamless enrollment rates for cohorts prior to 2024 were not updated in this graph and use the rate from the initial calculation; for example, the seamless enrollment rate for cohort 2022 was 55% when initially calculated. All subsequent analyses were conducted using the cohort 2024 data file. Percentages were rounded to the nearest whole number.

Seamless post-secondary enrollment rates vary by high school

In 2024, there were substantial differences across high schools in seamless postsecondary enrollment rates. Classical had the highest seamless enrollment rate (87%), followed by Midtown (76%), KIPP Collegiate (75%), and Drew Secondary (75%). The schools with the highest year over year percentage point (pp) increase were BEST (+29 pp), Therrell (+9 pp), and Douglass of (+8 pp), while the greatest decreases were found at North Atlanta (-7 pp), Carver Early (-7 pp), and Drew Secondary (-3 pp).

The majority of seamlessly enrolling graduates went to four-year colleges

Districtwide, about 14% of cohort 2024 graduates enrolled at institutions that predominantly grant 2-year degrees, compared to 44% enrolling at institutions that predominantly grant 4-year degrees. The proportion of graduates enrolling in 2-year institutions varies widely by high school. Classical had the highest proportion of its cohort 2024 on-time graduates that seamlessly enrolled in 4-year institutions. KIPP Collegiate had the highest proportion of on-time graduates that seamlessly enrolled in 2-year institutions.


Seamless Enrollment by High School and Institution Type, Cohort 2024



The majority of seamless enrollees attend public institutions within Georgia

More than half of all seamless college enrollees from APS consistently enrolled within in-state public institutions and increased 4 percentage points with cohort 2024. The percentage of students enrolling at private out-of-state institutions dropped to a low of 9%, while private-instate and public out-of-state changed very little. More cohort 2024 students attended Georgia State University than any other institution.

Postsecondary enrollment rates vary across student racial/ethnic groups

Cohort 2024 enrolled at similar rates as cohort 2023 within racial groups, but enrollment disparities between racial group continue. Although the rate has been recovering gradually since 2021, Black students have seen the greatest drop in seamless enrollment rates since a 2018 high of 60%.




Postsecondary enrollment rates vary by gender and within racial/ethnic groups

A higher percentage of female cohort 2024 students seamlessly enrolled in postsecondary institutions than male students, with 61% of on-time female graduates seamlessly enrolling compared to 54% of on-time male graduates. The gender gap is smaller than in previous years (not shown), however; although the difference is greatest among Black on-time graduates, the Black male enrollment rate increased by 5 percentage points and the Black female enrollment rate decreased by 2 percentage points.

Postsecondary enrollment rates among certain subgroups have increased

Economically Disadvantaged students, Students with Disabilities, and English Learners have seamlessly enrolled at lower rates than the district overall, with low points in 2020 or 2021. Enrollment among economically disadvantaged students has increased gradually since 2021 to 50% in 2024 but remains below pre-2021 highs. The seamless enrollment rate among Students with Disabilities saw a 6-year high of 42% in 2024 after three years of steady increases. English Learners are a smaller subgroup and saw an increase in 2024 over 2023.

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


Seamless enrollment remained constant from 2023 to 2024

Among on-time high school graduates, seamless enrollment is the percentage of on-time graduates who were enrolled in a postsecondary institution on October 1 following their graduation date. Persistence to Year 2 is the percentage of on-time graduates who were enrolled on October 1 in two consecutive years at any institution, Persistence to Year Three is the percentage who were enrolled on October 1 in three consecutive years, and so on. Graduates, which represent students earning a credential, are also counted in persistence percentages.

For example, for cohort 2018, 63% of on-time graduates were enrolled in a post-secondary institution on October 1, 2018; 45% were also enrolled on October 1, 2019; and 30% of high school graduates who persisted earned a credential by October 1, 2024.

Seamless Enrollment and Persistence among On-Time Graduates, Cohorts 2018 - 2024







National measures of persistence and college graduation rates typically consider the percentage of enrollees, rather then graduates who persist and graduate. Of APS on-time graduates who seamlessly enroll in college, about 75% persist to year 2.

Cohort 2018 graduates have had six complete school years to earn a post-secondary credential. In this graph, again, the percentage of students who persisted and graduated only includes students who seamlessly enrolled. Students may count in both persistence and graduate figures. Nationally, the 6-year postsecondary graduation rate, meaning students who earned a degree or credential, for students who entered college in the fall of 2017 was 61.1% per <u>National Student Clearinghouse</u>.

Graduation Rate Legend



This table shows institutional and APS graduation rates for schools that enrolled at least 15 APS on-time graduates from cohort 2018 (i.e., students have had 6 years to graduate). APS students who attend postsecondary institutions with low graduation rates may require additional supports to be successful. Nationally, the graduation rate for public 2-year colleges is lower than private and public 4-year colleges according to the <u>National Student Clearinghouse</u>.

- **APS Grade Rate, Any** includes cohort 2018 students who earned a degree/certificate from any institution, which may be different from their first enrolled institution, within six years.
- **APS Grade Rate, Same Institution** includes cohort 2018 students who earned a degree/certificate from the same institution at which they were first enrolled within six years.
- Institution Grad Rate comes from the Department of Education's <u>College Scorecard</u> and is the percentage of students who enrolled in the fall as first-time, full-time students and completed within 150 percent of the expected time: 3 years for 2-year colleges, 6 years for 4-year colleges. This is not directly comparable to the APS Grad Rates, which allow six years for all institution types.

Data Sources

National Student Clearinghouse

Postsecondary enrollment rates are calculated using data provided by the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC). NSC is a subscription service used by APS to match graduates with college enrollment records at more than 3,600 post-secondary institutions within the United States. NSC obtains student data directly from participating college and university registrars, typically on a monthly basis. Postsecondary institutions that do not participate with NSC include four of the U.S. service academies (the United States Naval Academy has been a participant since August 2020); participating institutions can be found <u>here</u>.

There are several limitations to matching and reporting of enrollment data which may result in underreporting of college enrollment. Limitations such as name variations, name changes, and FERPA blocks may result in lower levels of matching. According to NSC, Georgia has a <u>FERPA</u> <u>block rate</u> of approximately 1%.

National college graduation rates come from the NSC's <u>Yearly Progress and Completion Report</u>. In prior years, this data came from <u>Completing</u> <u>College National and State Reports</u>.

College Scorecard

Institution graduation rates and types come from the Department of Education's <u>College Scorecard</u> and are based on the year of the enrolling cohort.









Therrell Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2024












Jackson High Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Cohort 2024






Midtown Enrollment by Gender, Cohort 2024






North Atlanta Enrollment by Gender, Cohort 2024


