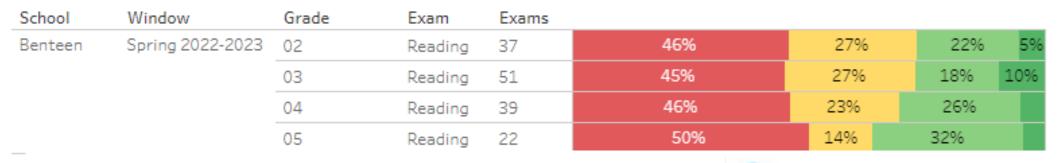

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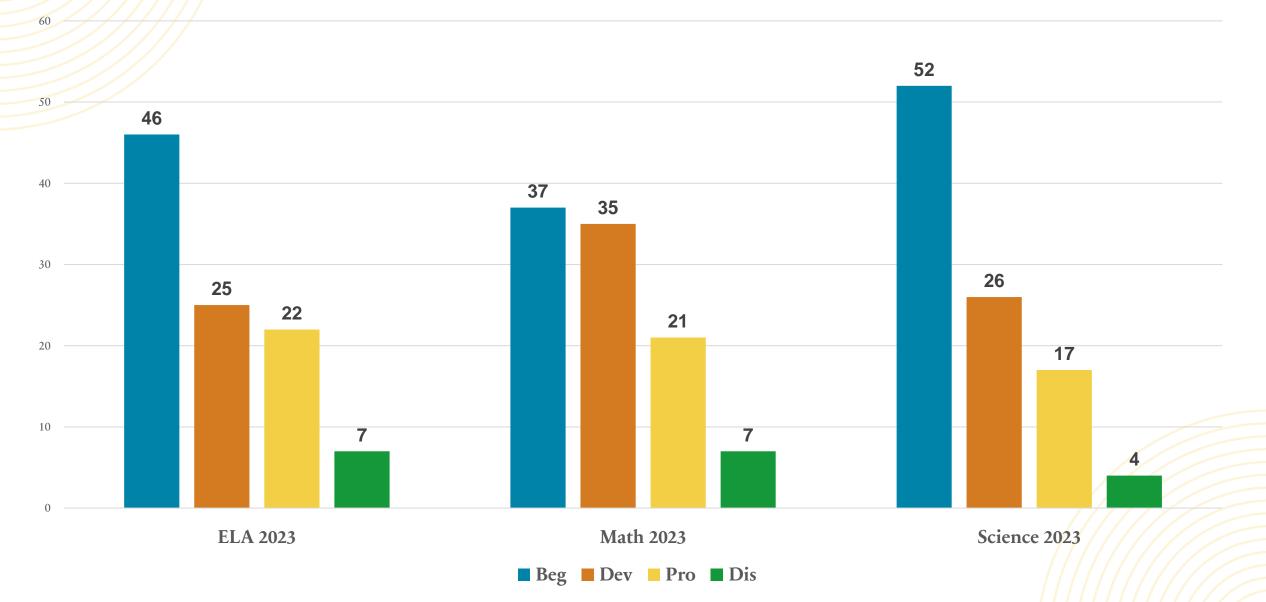

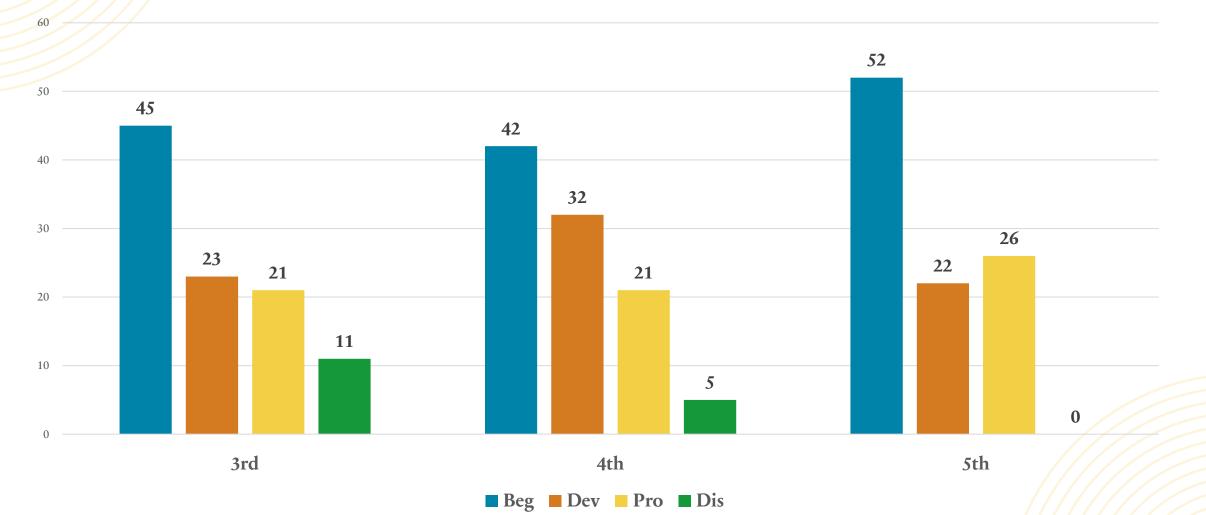

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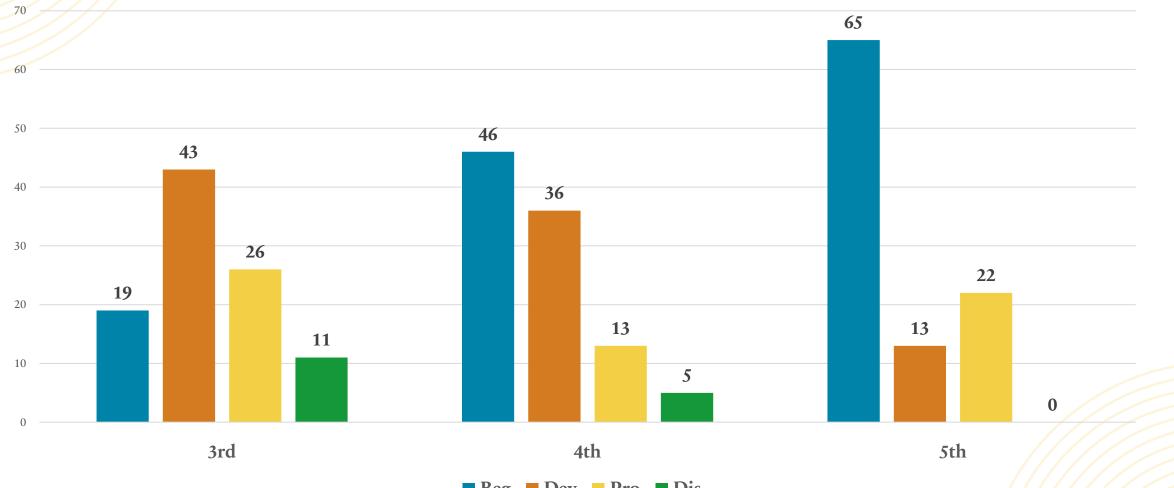
Benteen 2023 Milestones Overall

- Increase in Proficient & Above (Math) from 2022 to 2023 – 17.0% to 27.8% (+10.8%)
- Increase in Proficient & Above (ELA) from 2022 to 2023 – 21.3% to 28.9% (+7.6%)
- Increase in Proficient & Above (Science) from 2022 to 2023 – 20% to 21.7% (+1.7%)
