Behavioral and Emotional Screening System (BESS)

**Universal Screener** 

## Basc -3 Bess

The BESS is designed to assess behavioral and emotional strengths and growth opportunities in Pk-12 students.

- Helps to put kids on our radar who otherwise may not be:
  - Students who may not know how to or choose not to advocate for themselves
  - Students whose academic and behavioral success masks social/emotional struggles
- It is a screening assessment, not a diagnostic assessment.
- No specialized training required to administer.

## Basc -3 Bess

Students are given an overall score (BERI T Score) that indicates how far their score is from the average of the norm group.

The average BERI T score for the BESS is 50. The classification ranges for the BERI T score are:

- Normal Risk: 60 or lower
- Elevated Risk: 61-70
- Extremely Elevated Risk: 71 or higher


#### Screener Index Explanations


- BERI Behavioral and Emotional Risk Index (Overall Risk)
- ERI External Risk Index (Hyperactivity, Aggression, Conduct)
- IRI Internal Risk Index (Anxiety, Depression)
- ARI Adaptive Skills Risk Index (Social Skills, Leadership)
- SRI Self Régulation Risk Index (Self-Control)
- PRI Pérsonal Adjustment Risk Index (Interpersonal, Relationships, Self-Esteem)








