Continuous Improvement Goals

By May 2026, FAY students in grades 3-5 will increase the number of students performing proficient or above in reading from 19% (SY25) to 24% (SY26), as measured by the Georgia Milestone Reading Assessment and 80% of students in grades K-5 will meet their MAP Growth Reading target as measured by Spring MAP Growth Reading.

By May 2026, FAY students in grades 3-5 will increase the number of students performing proficient or above in math from 22% (SY25) to 27% (SY26), as measured by the Georgia Milestone Math Assessment and 80% of students in grades K-5 will meet their MAP Growth Math target as measured by Spring MAP Growth Math.

By May 2026, reduce the percentage of student incidents and OSS for students in tier 2 and tier 3 for behavior challenges will decrease by 50%.
