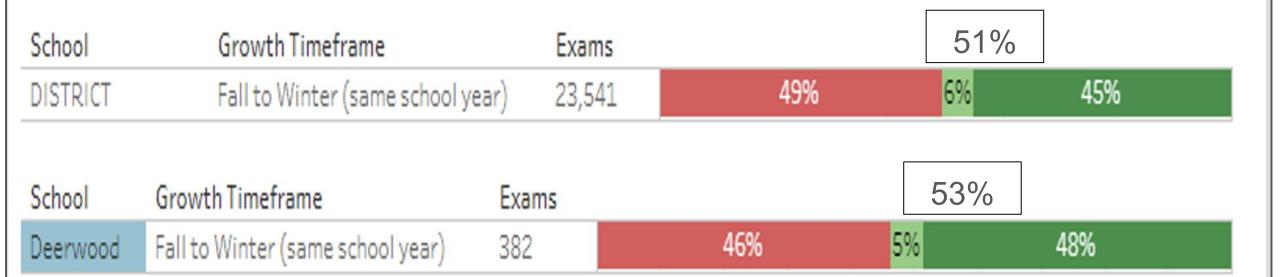

## School Improvement Plan SMART Goals

The percentage of students in grades K-5 that met their Fall to Spring growth goal on MAP Reading will increase from 38% to 41% in May 2024. The percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient or above on the GMAS Literacy Assessment will increase from 22.3% to 25.3%.

The percentage of students in grades K-5 that met their Fall to Spring growth goal on MAP Mathematics will increase from 41% to 44% in May 2024. The percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient or above on the **GMAS Math Assessment will** increase from 18.8% to 21.8%.

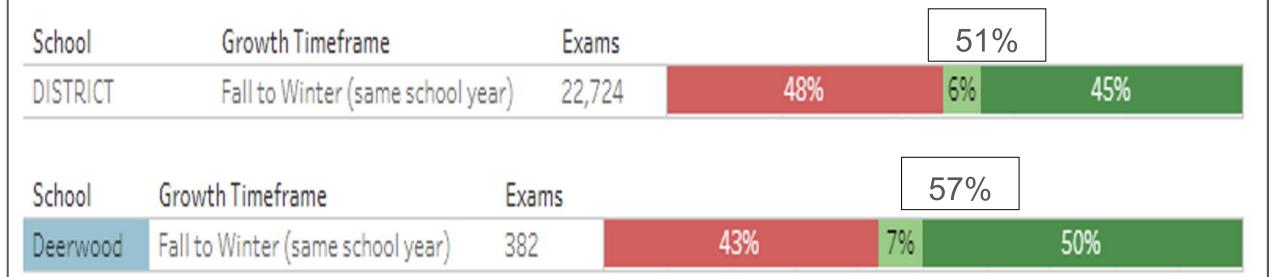
#### Reading Growth Target Met - preliminary data (99% take rate)

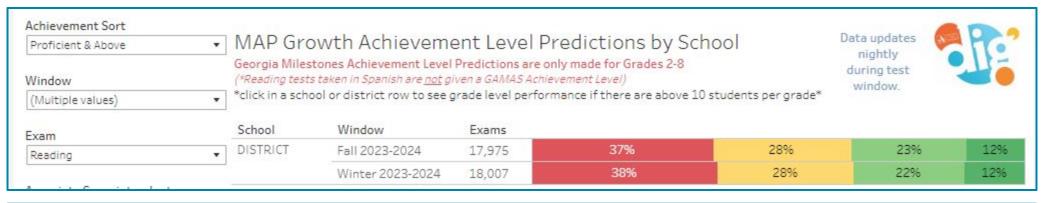

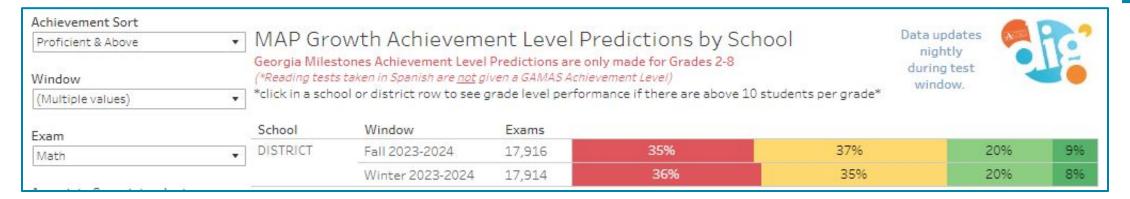

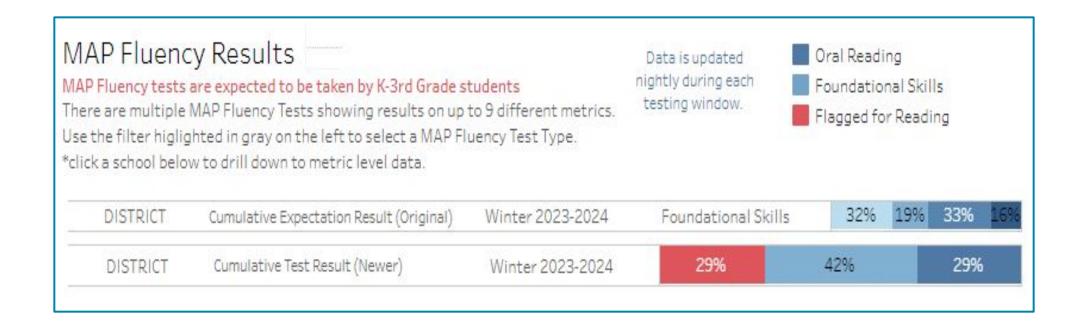
