APS Forward 2040 – Comprehensive Long-Range Facilities Plan Update Big Picture

- APS buildings were constructed for 75,000 students; projections suggest 50,000 students over the next decade → under-enrollment pressure.
- . Small Schools Grant funding is ending; district is "rightsizing" to:
 - Reduce underutilization of buildings
 - Strengthen program viability (e.g., sustain/expand IB investments in the cluster)
- Round 2 draft scenarios now include more specifics on potential closings/mergers and programmatic shifts (e.g., a School of the Arts at Carver, changes related to purpose-built partnerships).

Southwest/Cluster Focus (Draft)

- Boundary realignment under consideration.
- Continental Colony ES: likely repurposing (building is older; high cost to upgrade).
- Kimberly ES: likely receiving school for Continental Colony students (newer building; recent ESPLOST investments).
- Deerwood: references to improvements in the draft.
- Bunche MS: likely capital investments.
- High school: no current action in the draft impacting the cluster HS.
- All items above are drafts and subject to change pending feedback.

What "Repurposing" Means

- Not "abandonment", community helps decide future use (e.g., senior center, teacher training site, wraparound services hub).
- Example: Old Capitol View ES → proposed 30-year lease with the Tiger Woods Foundation, \$25M renovations, community programming hub.
- Need to hold APS accountable to timelines and commitments so buildings don't sit vacant.

- Our cluster has been underrepresented in survey responses (80% from North Atlanta in earlier rounds).
- Priority ask: complete and promote the district survey broadly (families, community partners, NPUs).

Q&A Highlights

- Deerwood + Continental merger? Not reflected as a merger in the draft.
 - **More likely**: boundary adjustments; students from areas like Kings Forest could be bused to Kimberly. Deerwood is closer to enrollment targets than Kimberly.
- Repurpose clarification: Keep assets in APS portfolio when possible; seek
 partners/investors to upgrade and use buildings now; some properties may still be
 sold (affordable/teacher workforce housing).
- NPU engagement: covering Deerwood's area to build partnerships and boost participation. NPUP is active; Mr. Leon will share NPU dates/resources; staff interest in attending NPUs

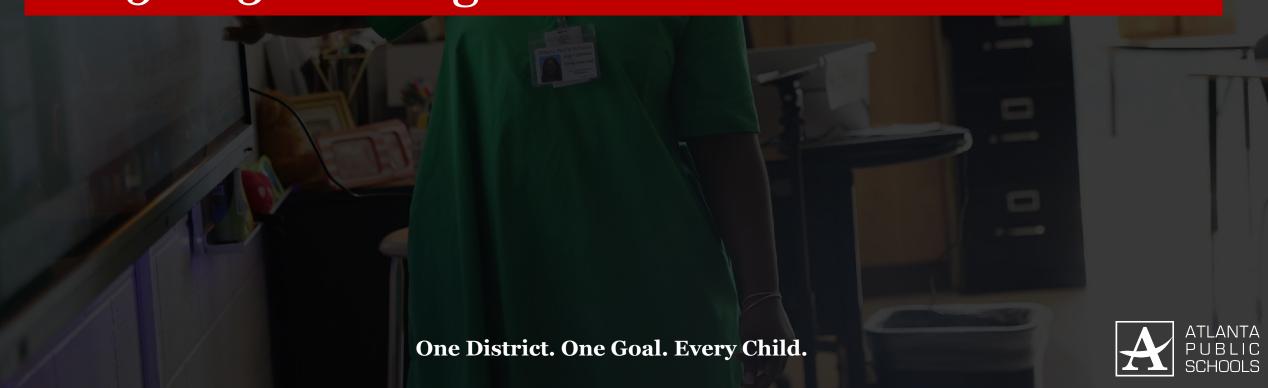

2025-2026 Continuous Improvement Plan Goals

- 1. By May 2026, the percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient or above on the Georgia Milestones Literacy Assessment will increase from 24% to 29%. By December 2025, the percentage of students in grades K-5 that meet their Fall to Spring growth goal on MAP Reading will increase from 55% to 58%.
- 2. The percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient or above on the Georgia Milestones Math Assessment will increase from 31% to 36%. The percentage of students in grades K-5 that meet their fall-to-winter growth goal on Math MAP will increase from 51% to 54% in December 2025.
- 3. By May 2026 the CCRPI Attendance Rate will increase from 69% to 72% as measured by the CCRPI Attendance in APS Graphs.

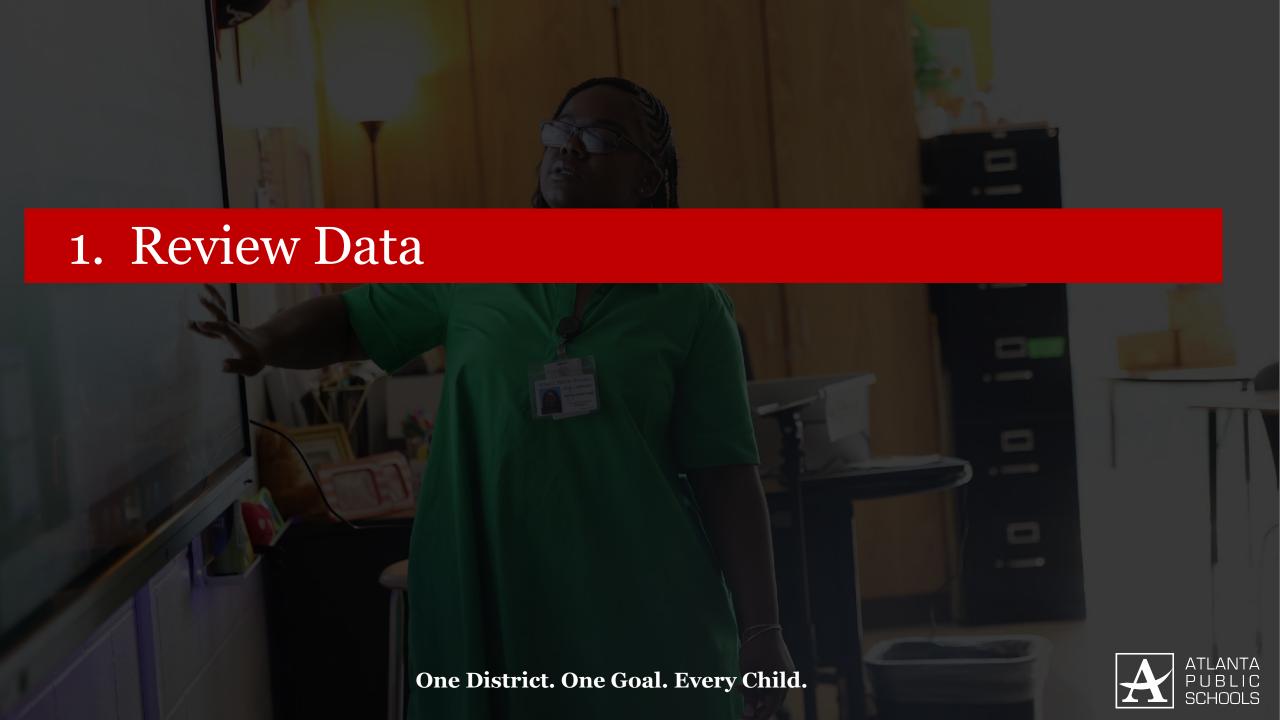




