

According to GA Milestone data, we grew in proficient and above by 2.1 points. With developing and above, there was a 4.3 point increase. We are closing the gaps with SWD, Black and Hispanic subgroups in ELA/Reading.	The data (MAP, GMAS, WriteScore, etc.) reveals that there are concerns in ELA/Writing, in particular, foundational skills (phonics) and writing. Of gifted and high achieving students, many did not score proficient and/or distinguished in ELA.
According to GA Milestones data, we grew in proficient and above by 6 points and developing and above by 9.2 points. We are closing the gaps with SWD, Black and Hispanic subgroups in Math.	There were deficits in the domain of numbers and operations with fractions across grades 3-5. Of gifted and high achieving students, many did not score proficient and/or distinguished in math. Deerwood's attendance data shows that our ADA increased by 1.4 pts. from 2021-22 to 2022-23.	Our challenge is that students in PreK (89.8) and 1st grade (90.3) have ADAs that are lower than students in grades Kindergarten (91.1), 2 nd (91.4), 3 rd (92.3), 4 th (91.5), & 5 th (91.7).
We improved our MTSS rubric score from 18 points (developing) to 35 points (proficient) this school year.	Our challenge is that the number of Office Discipline Referrals (ODRs) increased by 134 from the previous school year. Another challenge is that the overall suspension rate increased by .33.


MAP Reading Fluency - Foundational Skills 1st Grade

MAP Reading Fluency - Foundational Skills 3rd Grade







