Abolished 2 Turnaround Specialist Positions (1 Reading/ 1 Math) Created 2 EIP Positions	 Recently exited the CSI list, which has resulted in a decline in turnaround funding. Will continue to support turnaround efforts with 2 remaining specialists (Reading and Math) Increase in EIP students → 75 (FY 22) 143 (FY 23) MAP data denotes over 50% of students are performing at the beginning levels in Reading and Math.
Increased STEM Teacher from .5 to 1.0 FTE	 Increase stronger implementation of the newly adopted Signature Program of STE(A)M for the Carver Cluster. STEM Specialist will work to create and support rich learning opportunities in STE(A)M for students and teachers.
.5 Gifted Teacher	 .5 Stem Lab Teacher worked in this role for FY 23. Will share this teacher with Cleveland Avenue Elementary School.
Paraprofessional (K-2)	 Performance in MAP Reading Fluency (K-3) has declined. (Fall to Winter FY 23) There has been a decline in

performance for 1st Grade students'

Paraprofessional (K-2)	 Performance in MAP Reading Fluency (K-3) has declined. (Fall to Winter FY 23) There has been a decline in performance for 1st Grade students' performance in Reading Fluency from Spring '22 to Winter '23. This position will directly support reding groups for 1st and 2nd grade students.
Non-Instructional Aide	 Recently exited the CSI list, which has resulted in a decline in turnaround funding, specifically with funding the Behavior Specialist position. This position will support with continuing to engage students through PBIS and will also support staff engagement initiatives.
Hourly Teacher Tutor	• This position will support targeted students in reading and writing for Grades 3-5. The tutor will also be able to push into classrooms for small group instruction.
