2. Strategic Plan Review and Approval:

- 1. A. Wu shared the latest version of the Strategic Plan
- 2. Pause on bullet 3, group discussed "rigorous", group discussion on replacement.
 - G. Stender suggested "engaging"
 - M. Wheeler said "engaging" and "rigorous" said came up in meetings
 - o Group liked "engaging"
- 3. M. Wheeler said school district pushed to add "aligned to standards"
- 4. G. Stender asked about SMART goals tying to strategy. Concern about specific goals and then broad solutions to achieve.
 - o A. Wu said wording matches district guidance
- 5. M. Wheeler said document should drive budget decisions, focus on priorities and how to achieve SMART goals
- 6. M. Wheeler said goals should be tangible/achievable/actionable. Bullet 2, using data to assess needs is a good way to achieve specific targets.

3. Rank Strategic Priorities:

- i. M. Jones presented Google Documents survey that was completed by the group
 - 1. Only 4 members completed, entire team had the ability to complete
- ii. Staff engagement ranked high
 - 1. A. Wu said it was insightful, because everything is important, but leadership and staff came out as a priority
- iii. Group agreed that right staff will lead to many other items coming along.
- iv. A. Wu said prior to budget season, the Go Team needs to prioritize strategy, however we are flexible about how to do it
- v. Group liked the idea of grouping priorities into smaller number of buckets
- vi. A. Wu laid out plan for budget season
- vii. A. Wu suggested another meeting in between to meet needs of budget schedule. May need to work via email to progress budget.



- viii. Plan forward, leaning toward orange being high priority, but need a little more time to rank the follow on priorities. Group to revote.
- ix. M. Wheeler wants to combine overview and in depth and combine discussion with voting before staffing conference February 25 th
- x. A. Wu proposed go over budget today, email out for review, M. Jones to repeat survey, A. Wu to communicate via email to schedule another meeting to meet timing before budget staffing meeting on Feb 25 th
- xi. A. Wu to find out if a zoom meeting or email agreement is required

VI. Discussion Items

- 1. **Discussion Item 1**: Budget Allocation and Development Presentation
 - 1. M. Wheeler presented proposed budget
 - 2. Basic allocation and projected enrollment minus pre-K (42 students)
 - 3. Projected 375, increase in 61 students
 - 4. 271 meet poverty level, which is lower than previous years
 - 5. Gifted number was "6", which M. Wheeler felt was wrong, and asking district to verify
 - 6. Met requirements of "Small school" by 75 kids
 - 7. Total allocation \$5,076,156
 - 8. CARES funding not included ~ \$180k
 - 9. M. Wheeler said in good shape for budgeting, balanced
 - 10. Recommending changing gifted teacher from part to full time gifted
 - 11. High achievement students are working at high level, but not growing
 - 12. This year requiring to have a media specialist. No longer allowed to have a media para, need a media specialist, but have budget for it
 - 13. Higher 3 rd grade and drops off in 4 th then 5 th grade. Due to transitive population. Expect current 3 rd grade class to stay to 4 th due to increased stability.
 - 14. Required this year to have signature program specialist, in building, full time.
 - 15. Cluster wide, have not determined signature program.



- 16. If we don't meet enrollment, money goes back to the district
- 17. 75% spent on instruction people and staff
- 18. CARES act will provide funding to support teaching training and pupil services
- 19. Biggest challenge is space, new first grade teacher
- 20. 3 rd grade ratio is at 28, may need to shift para to help
- 21. M. Wheeler to distribute to team
- 22. Info is not public yet
- 23. Talking positions and not people
- 24. Eventually go to hourly para, 2 in kindergarten that have been full time

 - i. Really good learning walk with district, liked level of instruction, loved climate and culture of school. Impressed with teachers.

 - iii. P. Moss highlighted unique situation of location, and concerns about safety. Want APD there during key times. During morning recess and afternoon evening time. Was told that having an APD officer would require Hope Hill to pay for. Hope Hill does not feel they should pay for officer.
 - 1. Elementary pay out of budget, but middle/high school get allocated officers. Howard may have 2 officers, want to borrow.
 - 2. M. Wheeler said Hope Hill would have to cut the budget to pay for APD.
