



GLOWS

- The percent of students proficient and above increased from 43% in 2022 to 50% in 2023 in ELA.
- The percent of students proficient and above increased from 34% in 2022 to 48% in 2023 in Math.
- 78% of white students scored proficient and above on ELA and math
- 84% of multi-racial students scored proficient and above on ELA and math
- 59% of black students scored in Developing and above in ELA and math
- 50% of students with special needs scored in Developing and above in ELA and math

GROWS

- To increase reading proficiency scores for all students in reading/ELA.
- To increase math proficiency scores for all students in math.
