School Strategies

- **1A.** Conduct Weekly Data meetings (grade levels)
- **1B.** Conduct Weekly Professional Learning Communities (grade levels) to design and plan instruction.
- 1C. Facilitate Math Instructional Strategies PL (CPA approach, number talks, questioning, and discourse) monthly for individual/grade level, and faculty
- 2A. Implement an intervention block, a 4-day prescriptive instructional program in reading and math. The program will include fluid groups, targeted lessons, and teacher-directed/virtual lessons.
- 2B. Utilize a team of wrap-around service personnel (counselor, social worker, SEL coach, parent liaison, Communities In Schools, MTSS, instructional staff, and administration) to eliminate barriers for students and families. (CARE Team)
- **3A.** Teachers will facilitate targeted small groups based on demonstrated student need, three times Weekly.
- **3B.** Students will complete a series of targeted lessons on their individualized learning path
- **5A.** Integrate STEM planning into core instructional planning meetings
- **5B.** Leverage community partnerships with companies and individuals to advance our STEM initiative


Due to the pandemic we did not have the opportunity to fully accomplish all of the previous goals.
