Continuous Improvement Goals

By May 2026 we will increase the percent of students in grades 6-8 scoring proficient and above by at least 5 percentage points from 52% in SY 2025 to 57% in SY 2026 on the EOG GMAS.

- By May 2026 we will increase the percent of students in grades 6-8 scoring proficient and above by at least 5 percentage points from 46% in SY 2025 to 51% in SY 2026 on the EOG GMAS.
- By May 2026, decrease the percentage of students suspended by .5% from .37% to .32%.



2030 Strategic Plan Goals

By May 2030, we will increase the percent of students in grades 6–8 scoring proficient and above on the EOG GMAS by at least 15 percentage points—from 52% in SY 2025 to 67% in SY 2030.

By May 2030, we will increase the percent of students in grades 6–8 scoring proficient and above on the EOG GMAS by at least 15 percentage points—from 46% in SY 2025 to 61% in SY 2030.

By May 2030, we will decrease the percentage of students suspended by 2%—from 0.37% in SY 2025 to 0.17% in SY 2030.

- Parents loved seeing the grade-level newsletter.


Starting next month:
