B. **Discussion Item 2: CTAE Pathways**

- Mr. Alfaro stated:
- Last year, the school was nationally STEM certified. This school year we are working towards the state certification, which would make us the first high school do so in APS. In order to meet state certification, we are focusing on implementing engineering journal in all content area, AP STEM courses, and community project. The engineering journals will showcase the STEM PBL that students complete throughout the year.
- This school year we started offering AP Computer Science and Calculus to meet the requirement of state certification with a rigorous curriculum. Our community project is tackling the challenges of affordable housing by designing

and building tiny homes. Also, we are growing our partnership with STEM elementary schools to provide parents with an option for their child to continue their STEM education.

Engineering Program Progress:

- Last year, the program won its first engineering state competition. Also, the program was selected as the APS Flagship in engineering. Upcoming goal is to become Industry certified. In order to meet certification, we are focusing on increasing summer programs for all engineering students, participate in more national competitions, and expand recruitment efforts.
- Dr. Williams gave a briefing on what the AVTF Pathway (AVTF1, AVTF2, AVTF3 and Broadcast Communication for Middle School Students) students are doing. They are working diligently on: editing, camera movements/angles, interviewing, identifying fake news and talking about current news events.
- Three students (Trezdan Couch, Amani Bedwa and D'Meko McGee) were selected to attend the SkillsUSA Fall Leadership Conference via zoom on Friday, November 13th.
