# SY22 Actions

Action Step 1:

Support- Grouped students (not enrolled in Math/Reading Support Classes) based on performance potential for pull-out support groups - twice weekly.

Action Step 2:

Graduation Support- Offer a R.I.S.E program (Re-teaching, Intervention, Supporting and Enriching) Program for students in need of credit recovery hours or tutorial support - RISE is offered before school, M-Th (4- 6p.m.) and two Saturdays a month. Students in grades 9-12 selected to attend by counselor based on credit deficits. Recommended to attend by teacher based on current performance levels.

• Action Step 3:

Introduced Monthly ABC Incentives (Attendance, Behavior and Course Progress) to celebrate students performing within range of expectation monthly.

Offering monthly gender specific cohort SEL sessions during advisory block to address topics such as: Conflict Resolution, Unity, Preparedness and issues relative to grade/gender.
