II. Discussion Items

A. School Strategic Plan Discussion

i. Strategic Plan & Priorities Review

1. The three priorities of the GO Team are: a) Create an educational and professional environment promoting high quality teaching which provides well-defined and deliberately designed instruction that is inquiry based, creative, interdisciplinary, technology-rich and student-centered. b) Cultivate a counseling and support system which focuses on college and career and empowers students to maximize their opportunities for learning future college studies, and/or post-secondary options. c) build a healthy school culture and climate for students, staff, and parents in the school and community that amplifies and empowers student voice, while incorporating programs such as SEL, PBIS, CAS/SL, student organizations, and No Place for Hate.

- ii. SMART Goals Continuous Improvement Plan Goals are: a) by the end of the 2023-24 school year, we will increase our CCCRPI Content Mastery performance from 40.13 points to 42.54
b) By the end of the 2023-24 school year, we will increase our CCRPI Graduation Rate (4th and 5th year) from 90% to 92.7%.
c) By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, we will decrease the overall Out of School Suspension rate from 1.34 to 1.22 as found in the APS Graphs Behavior dashboard.
d) By the end of the 2023-24 school year, the percentage of high school students that score at the college and career readiness level, on career pathway assessments, IB, AP, Dual Credit, ACT, SAT, or work-based learning will increase from 75.4 to 77.7.

B. Data Discussion

i. Fall 2023 MAP Results

1. There is a correlation between how students performed on the Math MAP and how they performed on the Algebra I EOC
2. Junior and Seniors are less likely to take the MAP Assessment seriously.
3. Compared to other schools, Jackson is 4th in the district on the Math MAP Assessment.

4. Compared to other schools, Jackson is 5th in the district on the Reading MAP Assessment.
- ii. 2023 GA Milestones/IB/AP Results
 1. Jackson's performance on the Milestone is similar to years past. Ms. Blash asked why the number of student testing is declining. Dr. Danser stated that more students are taking Algebra I in the 8th grade and taking AP U.S History instead of U.S History.
 2. Jackson is about 50% on the challenge index. Overperformance on the Milestones indicates that Jackson is below the line of the challenge index.
 3. On the AP Exams, Jackson increased the percentage of total AP Students with scores of 3 or higher from 27.89 percent in 2022 to 28.22 in 2023.
 4. 41% of IB DP students received an IB diploma.
 5. Dr. Danser reviewed the enrollment of IBDP, IBCP, and AP classes. There are more White students in these classes than Black students.
 6. SAT Math scores declined from 516 to 440 and SAT Reading scores declined from 532 to 467. Jackson is offered more SAT Prep classes to address the decline in performance on the SAT.
 7. Dr. Danser as the GO Team if there are any questions. Any member of the GO Team asked no questions.

i. Enrollment and Leveling Updates

1. The current enrollment is 1, 552 students. 70.1% students are Black, 17.8% students are White.
2. Projected enrollment was 1532. Our current enrollment is 20 more students than projected.
3. In the process of hiring 2 additional instructional paraprofessionals and moving the hourly hall monitor to full-time.
4. Requested class set of Chromebooks and instructional technology that will support and enhance instruction.
