



STEM-TASTIC NEWS!

A CHOICE BOARD FOR EIGHT STEM PROJECTS YOU CAN DO WITH ANY NEWSPAPER

Lesson Overview

Featured Choice Board: <u>Fight STEM Projects You Can Do With Any Newspaper</u>, (By Natalie Proulx Feb. 3, 2022)

What scientific or mathematical wonders can you make with just a print newspaper and a few simple materials? In this lesson, we invite you to find out, with our choice board of eight STEM-related activities, including a D.I.Y. roller coaster, seeds in biodegradable pots, a mathematical puzzle with origami cubes and more.

All of these projects are drawn from <u>At Home</u>, a special section of The New York Times that ran in the early days of the pandemic to help readers cope during lockdown. Each edition of At Home featured an activity that challenged readers to make something out of their print newspaper. We've rounded up eight such projects that help students explore STEM concepts like air resistance, geometry, design thinking and Newton's first law of motion. For most of these activities, all you will need is a print newspaper, a pair of scissors and some tape. What will you create? Choose an activity from the choice board, follow the directions to put it together, test it out and then reflect on what you learned using the Going Further prompts below.

SEL COMPETENCY OF THE MONTH: RELATIONSHIP SKILLS

Self-management skills allow individuals to handle daily stresses and control their emotions under difficult situations. Students' capacities to regulate their emotions impact student memory and the cognitive resources they use on academic tasks. Selfmanagement skills include the ability to monitor and reflect on personal and academic goalsetting. Academic self-regulation has important implications for student motivation in the classroom, as well as the learning strategies students use to master material.

in schools as well as assist with contact tracing for any positive cases identified. Please


