Greetings Parents,

We have reached the countdown to starting spring break! School will be closed from April 3rd through April 7th for spring break. Students should return to school on April 10th. The Georgia Milestones state assessment will be given to students in grades 3, 4 and 5 beginning April 5, 2017. I hope the Milestones Parent Meeting provided our parents with an understanding of the test expectations. Our students will be required to take the assessment on the computer. Students will have to read, think and respond in a timed manner. Our request is that parents ensure students go to bed early and arrive at school by 7:30 to have breakfast. The test will begin each day at 8:30 AM. Please assist by making sure students arrive on time and scheduling all appointments after 1:00. **Student performance on the Georgia Milestones assessment will be used to determine promotion to the next grade. All students must be present for testing.**

First Grade News

April is a busy month as we continue to implement rigorous standards in all subject areas. Parents we NEED your SUP-PORT to ensure that students are using the strategies taught in class at home as well. Please assist with homework, sight and math fact fluency recall.

Reading: The first graders have been doing super things as readers! They are reading carefully, thinking about the story while they are reading, and so much more! Students have been working on fluency while reading. They are working on reading their sentences smoothly and with expression, while also reading at a natural rate. Students are also making sure to pay attention to and use punctuation when reading too. These are great skills to practice at home!

Math: In math we are beginning a unit centered on two-digit addition and solving based on place value. Students will review how to represent two digit numbers using tens (ten stick) and ones (a circle). This will help students create a proof drawing by representing the numbers and then determining if there are enough ones to make a new group of ten. Using their proof drawing students can count the groups of tens and ones to determine the total.

Science : In science we will continue to identify basic types of sound, the characteristic of sound and that variation cause sound.

Social Studies: In social studies will continue to read and describe the contributions of Theodore Roosevelt and other American Historical figures.

Grade Two News

As we begin to near the end of the semester, we are focusing on reviewing and reteaching concepts and skills not mastered throughout the year. Please schedule a conference with your child's teacher to discuss their progress, assessments, and behavior. Report cards were sent home at the end of March; if you have not received one please contact the school. We are continuously working on addition and subtraction of one, two, and three digit numbers, dividing shapes into fractions, and reading comprehension. Homework is still passed out each week, so please check for it and sign it daily!

"April Showers Bring Learning Powers!" That phrase perfectly describes the superheroes in the MOID K-2 Unit at Humphries Elementary. We are busy as ever and learning isoh so fun!

This month there is a great deal going on. We are study still studying sound and the varying vibrations that create sound. We also linked sound to different genres of music. We listened to Rap/Hip-Hop, Country, Classical, Jazz, Rock, Gospel, and more. We then took a field study trip around the Humphries community to poll our administrators, teachers, staff, and peers to find out their favorite types of music. We had a lot of Hip Hop fans; however, people liked jazz, gospel, rock and country as well. We also are beginning to delve into poetry. We are loving how the stanzas in poetry is like the lyrics in rap with rhyme and alliteration. Finally, we are just learning the concept of "adding together" and "taking away". Grade Four News

The Team would like to remind you of how critical fourth grade is in your child's elementary career. It's a year filled with new academic hurdles. It's an academic hurdle that, if missed, students will struggle as their more fluent peers gain new knowledge at what seems like lightning speed. Once this type of learning lag exists, it is difficult for the kids to catch up. With this being said, it is important for YOU to emphasis that learning is the primary goal of attending school! We are noticing that many fourth graders are losing focus and are not actively engaged in the learning process. Learning is active and requires effort. Georgia Milestone Testing (GMAS) will begin on April 17th for fourth graders and we are working diligently to prepare the students for the rigors of the exam with quality instruction. Grade Five News

We are in the homestretch! Shortly after Spring Break, our students will begin Milestones testing (April 12th). Students should review notes and study guides, and complete computer-based tutorials over the break. They should also continue to complete all classroom and homework assignments. Students have log-on passwords for the following websites: I-Ready.com, studyisland.com, brainpop.com and studiesweekly.com. They can also reread textbooks and study the vocabulary located in the back of their textbooks.

During testing, please make sure your child gets plenty of rest and encouragement in order to do his or her personal best. You may examine examples of previous test questions, download study guides, and review cut off scores required to be promoted to the sixth grade on the Georgia Department of Education website.

Report cards were issued on March 24th. Please contact us with any questions or concerns. Information regarding year-end and promotional activities will be sent home in the near future.

Enrichment News

The Enrichment Team has been continuously enhancing the learning environment through the subject areas of Art, Music, Spanish, and Physical Education. In Art, students are applying medium techniques of 2 dimensional art processes with the use of construction paper to create a color collage. In Music, students are learning about history and culture through various music presentations. In Spanish, students are exchanging simple spoken word, Spanish, by utilizing cultural references where appropriate such as name of seasons, and 12 months in the year. In Physical Education, students are demonstrating knowledge and skills in order to achieve a level of physical fitness by participating in the fitness gram (grades 4th & 5th), and performing animal movements and utilizing pull-up bar. Also, Enrichment Team is monitoring students, grades 3rd through 5th, typing lessons in order to improve typing skills for the Milestone. Go Humphries Roadrunners!
